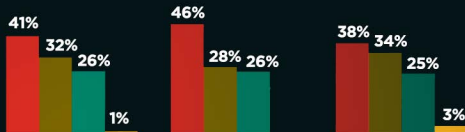

# 1 IN 3 PAKISTANIS SAY THE SUPPLY/ PRESSURE OF GAS DECREASED IN THEIR AREA COMPARED TO THE PREVIOUS YEAR; 8% MORE URBAN THAN RURAL RESIDENTS SAY THAT THE SUPPLY/ PRESSURE OF GAS INCREASED IN THEIR AREA COMPARED TO THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 1 in 3 Pakistanis say the supply/ pressure of gas decreased in their area compared to the previous year; 8% more urban than rural residents say that the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area compared to the previous year.

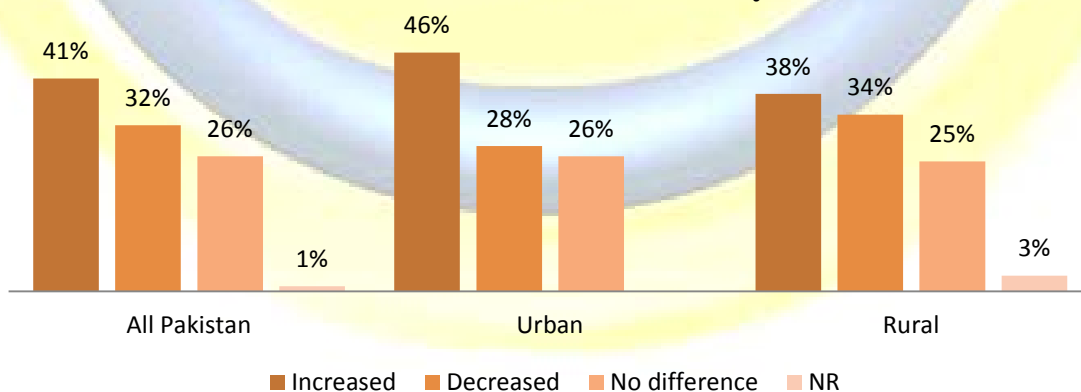
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please think about gas load shedding/ supply during winters the previous year and please tell compared to the previous year, has the supply/ pressure of gas in your area increased, decreased or there is no difference this year?” In response to this question, 41% said the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area this year compared to the previous year, 32% said decreased, 26% said there was no difference and 1% did not respond.

**Rural Urban Breakdown:**

In urban areas, 46% said the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area this year compared to the previous year, 28% said decreased and 26% said there was no difference. On the contrary in rural areas, 38% said the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area this year compared to the previous year, 34% said decreased, 25% said there was no difference and 3% did not respond.

Comparing the two regions, 8% more urban than rural residents said that the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area compared to the previous year.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1728 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 9 – January 16, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2-3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
