Public perception divided over performance of NGO's: 52% Pakistanis opine that NGO's work for the betterment of society, 48% say otherwise.

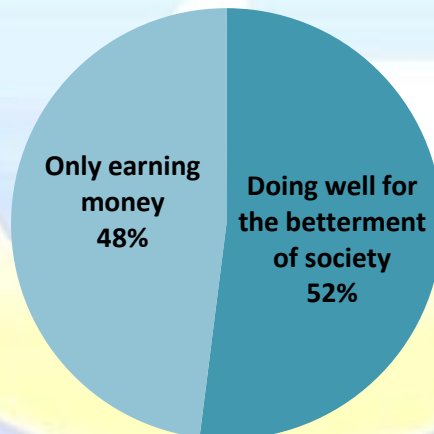

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 52% Pakistanis opine that NGO's work for the betterment of society, 48% say otherwise.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "Some people believe that NGO's are doing good work for the betterment of society, while others believe they are only earning money. What is your opinion?" In response to this question, 52% said NGO's are doing good work for betterment of society, while 48% said they just earn money.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1746 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 10 - July 17, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
