Currently 10% males & 9% females, aged between 18-24 years, say they are enrolled in some higher education or skills training institute. (PSLM)

Islamabad, November 22, 2017

According to Pakistan Social and Living Measurement Survey analyzed by Gallup Pakistan, youth enrollment in higher education and skills training remains low in Pakistan. 10% males & 9% females, aged between 18-24 years, say they are enrolled in some higher education or skills training institute.

However, it is encouraging to see that the gender gap is very narrow at only 1%.

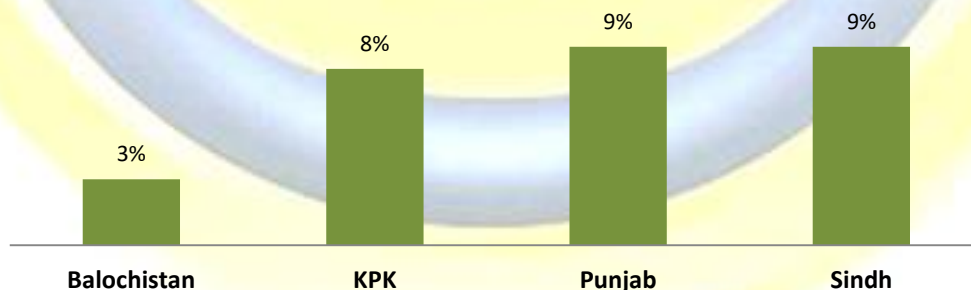
Provincial Breakdown: Balochistan lags behind in terms of Higher Education

Barely 3% of the respondents from Balochistan answered in the affirmative about being enrolled in either a higher education or some skills training. Meanwhile, 8% from KPK and 9% each from Sindh and Punjab said they were enrolled.

Bilal I Gilani, Executive Director at Gallup & Gilani Pakistan adds: “The results of PSLM survey show that there are around 2 million 18-24 age group students in public and private universities and colleges. With significant rise in universities in Pakistan over the past decade (a growth of nearly 300% since late 1990’s), the higher education market in Pakistan is booming. However, there is less analysis on the quality of education being imparted to these 2 million students.”
