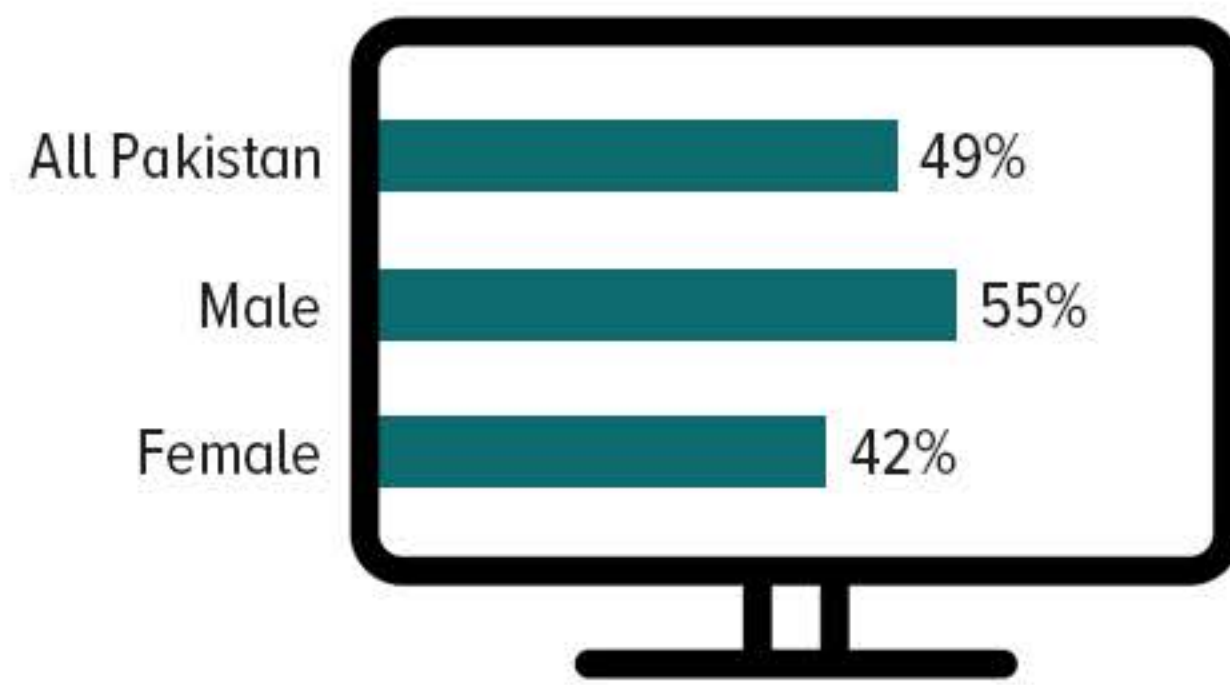


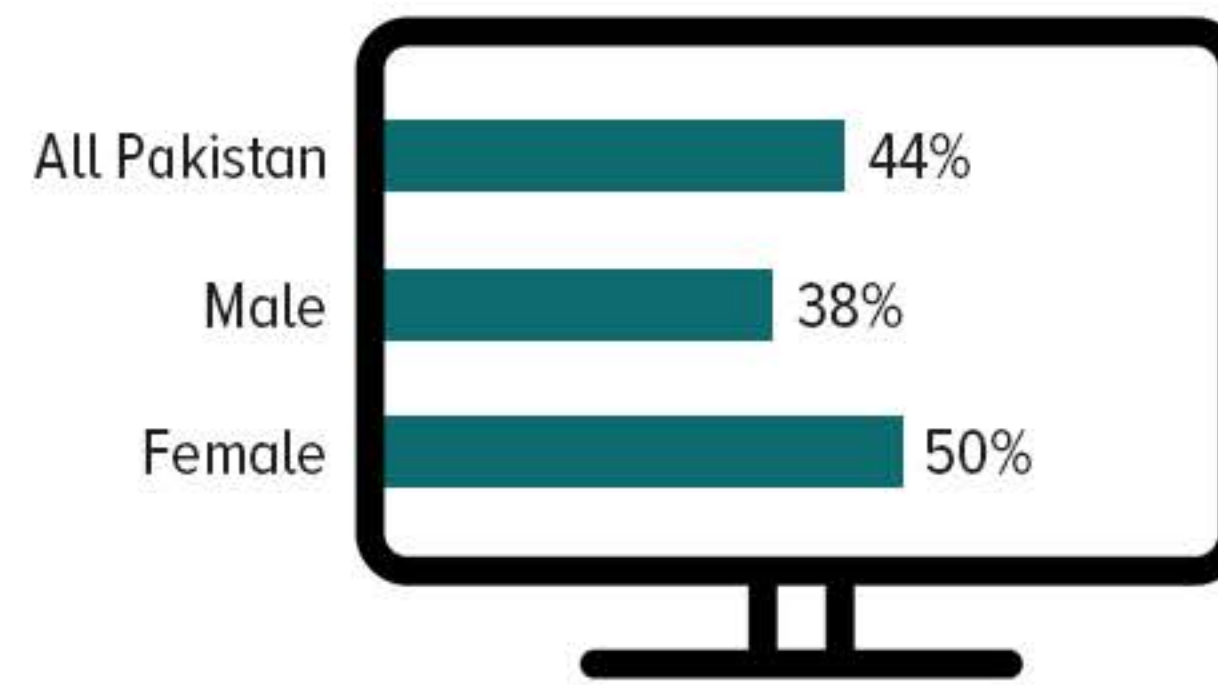

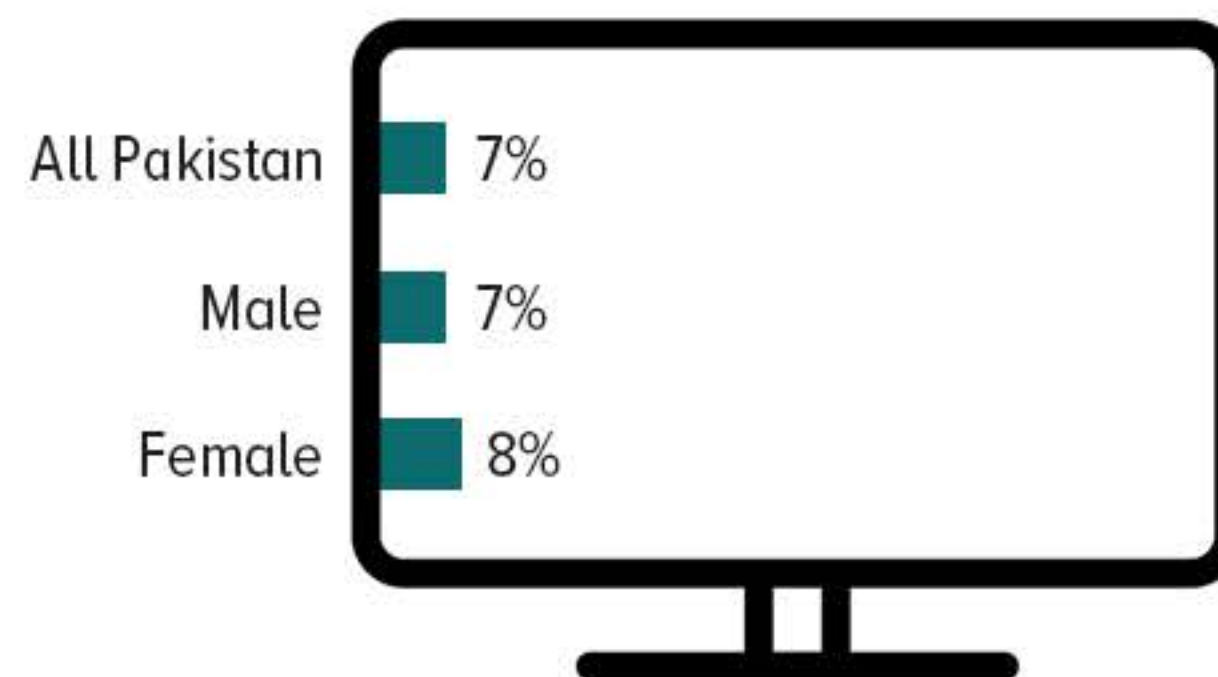

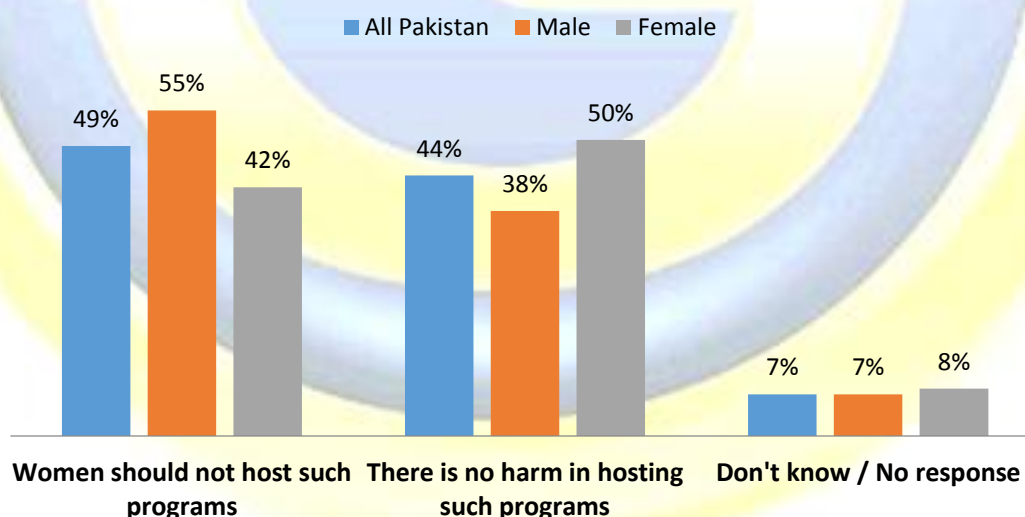
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Majority opinion in Pakistan split on whether women should host Islamic teaching programs on TV or not; 49% opine they should not host while 44% opine they should host, gender divide visible.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “During Ramadan some of the Islamic teaching programs telecasted on TV are hosted by female presenters. Some people oppose female hosts for such programs whereas some people think that there is no harm in it. What is your opinion on this?” In response to this question, 49% said women should not host such programs, while 44% said there is no harm in it. 7% did not know or did not wish to respond.

Gender Breakdown:

55% male say that female should not host these programs, while 42% female are of the same opinion. 38% male say that there is no harm in hosting such programs, while 50% opine the same.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1625 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, June 18 – June 25, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
