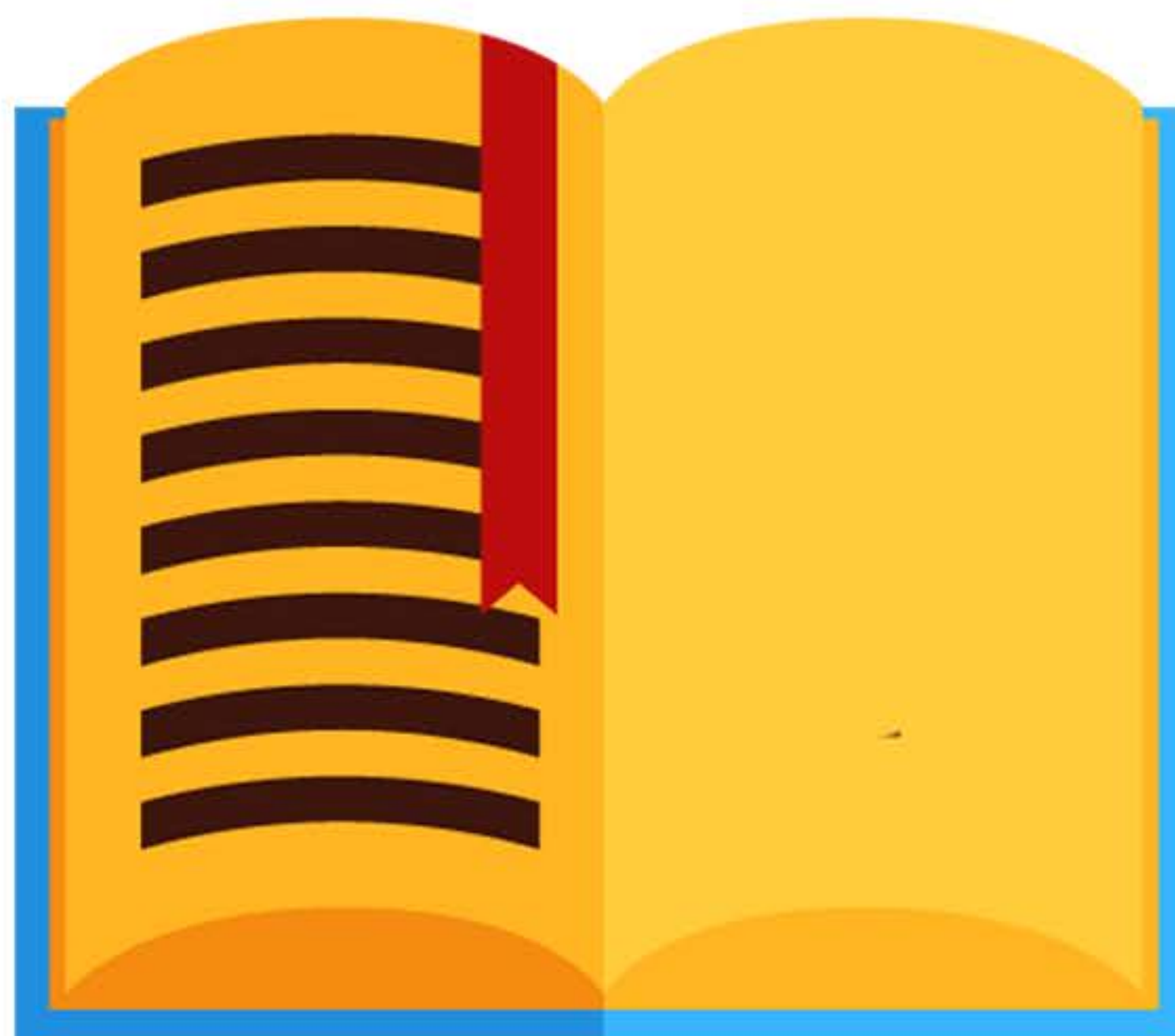
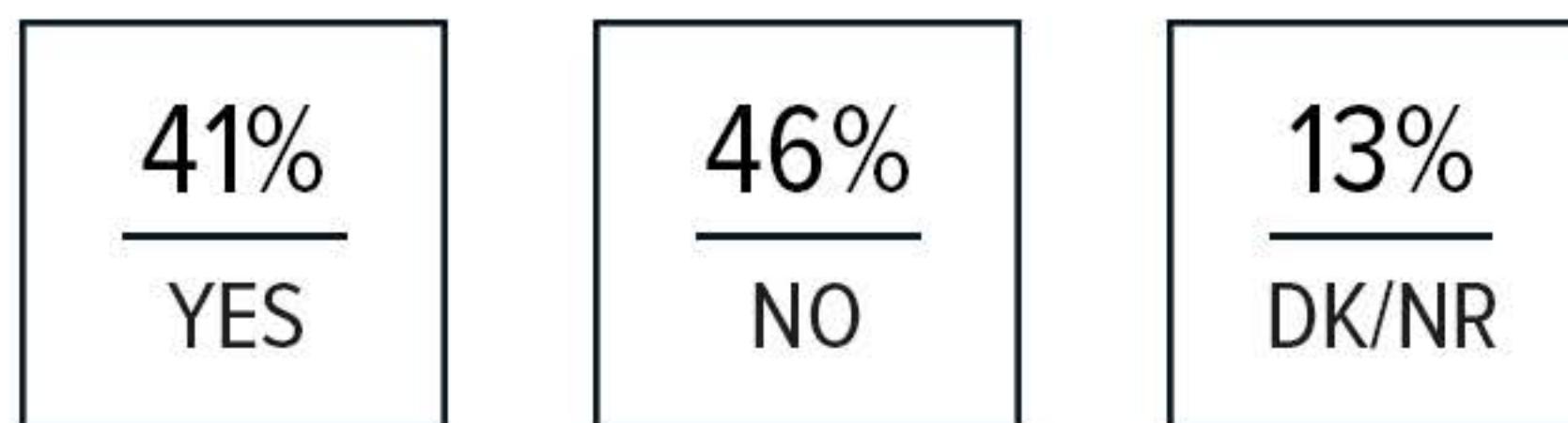

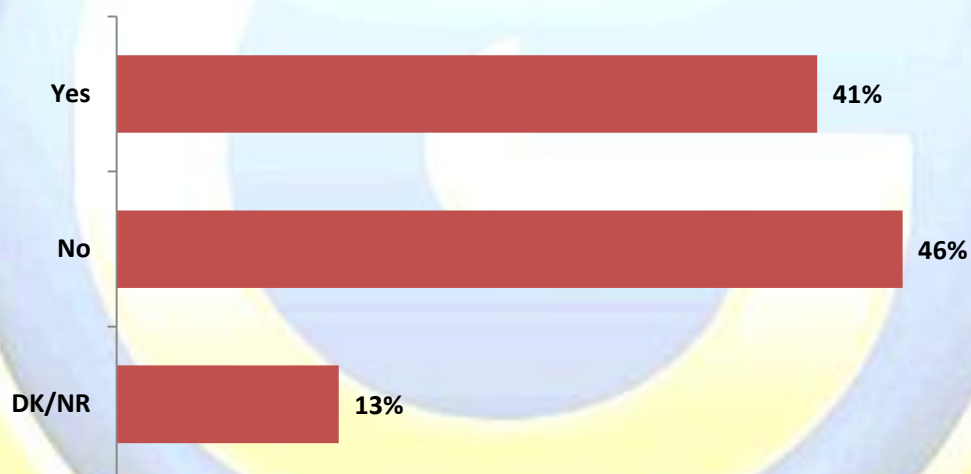
Online Quranic Education: 41% (4 in 10) Pakistanis report having heard or read about online Quranic education. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, January 9, 2019

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup and Gilani Pakistan, around 41% (4 in 10) of Pakistanis report having heard or read about online Quranic education.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell us whether you have heard or read anything about online Quranic education?” In response to this question, 41% replied in the affirmative, 46% replied in the negative, 13% did not know or did not wish to respond.

Online Quranic education refers to the facility of being able to access classes on reading, reciting and understanding the Quran by means of the internet. The proliferating online learning centers which offer this service often make the facility of live classes available to students across the world comprising of varied age groups. They also impart Islamic teachings.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,141 men and women in urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 22 December – 29 December, 2018. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
