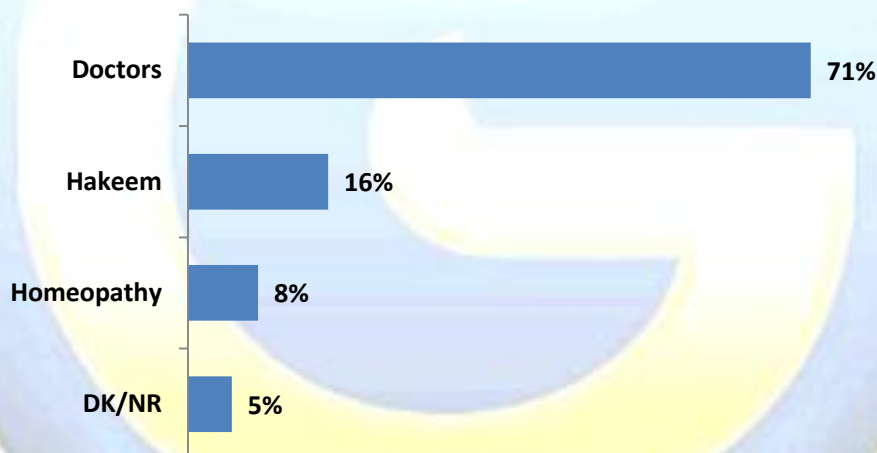

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more than 7 in 10 Pakistanis report visiting a conventional doctor if they happen to be sick, while a quarter report alternatives such as *hakeems* and homeopathy as their most used method.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Who do you usually go to for your treatment?” In response to this question, 71% said doctors, 16% said hakeem, 8% said homeopathy, while 5% did not know or did not wish to respond.

This poll suggests the significant popularity of alternative medicines/healthcare with nearly 25 million adults who report that they use these methods with regularity as a matter of course. The total number of users, however, may be much higher, as a segment of the population might be using alternative medicine in addition to conventional medicine. Gallup Pakistan is tracking trends related to healthcare access and more details can be found in the Gallup History Project.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1142 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 24 January – 28 January, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
