

3% PAKISTANIS CLAIM THAT THEY OR A FAMILY MEMBER HAVE AN **ONGOING CASE IN THE COURT**

3% Pakistanis claim that they or a family member have an ongoing case in the court (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll)


According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 3% Pakistanis claim that they or a family member have an ongoing case in the court.

The figure adds up to 900,000 pending court cases. According to the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, it is estimated that 1.9 million cases in Pakistan are still pending, owing to a notoriously slow legal process.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Do you or any of your household members have an ongoing case in the court?" In response, 97% said no, while only 3% said yes.

Urban-Rural Breakdown: Lower proportion of rural residents have an ongoing case in the court Out of the total urban respondents, 6% said they or a family member have an ongoing case in the court while a lower 2% rural residents claimed the same.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,208 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 08 - February 15, 2020. The error margin is estimated to be approximately \pm 2-3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
