Views on Insurgency in Baluchistan (Part 1)

*This is a 6 part series on popular views about insurgency in Baluchistan. The poll laps all Pakistani views and explains how the majority of Pakistanis from all over the country view the current situation in one of their four provinces. The province of Baluchistan has a small share in the nation's population, only about 5%; but it has a large land mass of around 45% of the land area of the whole country. In **part 1**, we discuss nation-wide fears and apprehensions about Baluchistan insurgency; **part 2** seeks views on who is to blame for the popular unrest in Baluchistan; **part 3** seeks nation-wide views on economic conditions in Baluchistan as compared with the rest of the country, **part 4** seeks views on claims that Baluchistan does not get fair share in its natural resources; **part 5** seeks views on political rights of Baluchistan; **part 6** shows views on a 6 Point Charter of demands presented by a Baloch leader at the Supreme Court of Pakistan.*

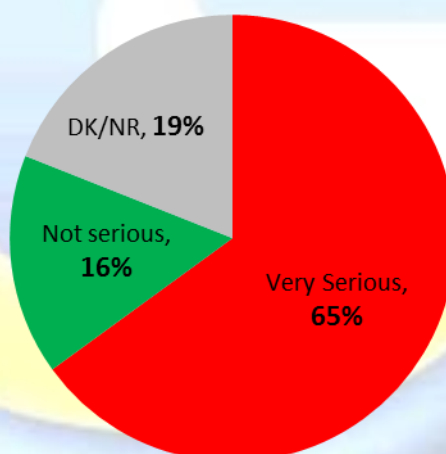
Majority (65%) is fearful and apprehensive about insurgency in Baluchistan. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority (65%) is fearful and apprehensive about insurgency in Baluchistan.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "These days in Baluchistan there are discussions going on about separatist movements and insurgency. In your opinion, is the threat of separation and insurgency from Baluchistan very serious or not serious?" Responding to this, 65% of Pakistanis are of the opinion that the threat is 'very serious' and 16% think it is 'not serious'. However, 19% chose no response.

Question: "These days in Baluchistan there are discussions going on about separatist movements and insurgency. In your opinion, is the threat of separation and insurgency from Baluchistan very serious or not serious?"

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2674 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 07, 2012 – October 13, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

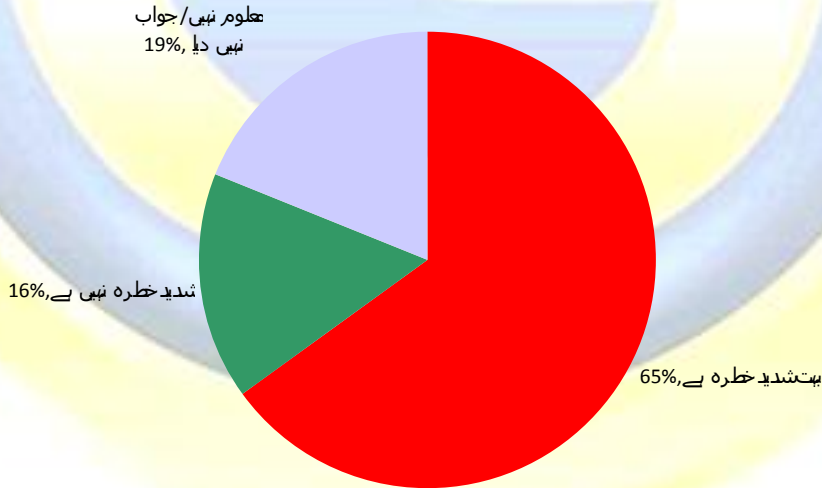

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، اکثریت (65%) بلوچستان میں بغاوت سے خوفزدہ اور پریشان ہے۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شماریاتی طور پر منتخب مرد و خواتین سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "بلوچستان میں ان دنوں علیحدگی کی تحریکوں کی بات ہو رہی ہے۔ آپ کے خیال میں بلوچستان کی علیحدگی کا خطرہ بہت شدید ہے، تھوڑا بہت شدید ہے یا کوئی خاص خطرے کی بات نہیں؟"، اس سوال کے جواب میں 65% پاکستانیوں کے مطابق بلوچستان کی علیحدگی کا خطرہ بہت شدید ہے اور 16% کی رائے میں کوئی خاص خطرے کی بات نہیں۔ جبکہ 19% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔

'بلوچستان میں ان دنوں علیحدگی کی تحریکوں کی بات ہو رہی ہے۔ آپ کے خیال میں بلوچستان کی علیحدگی کا خطرہ بہت شدید ہے، تھوڑا بہت شدید ہے یا کوئی خاص خطرے کی بات نہیں؟'
