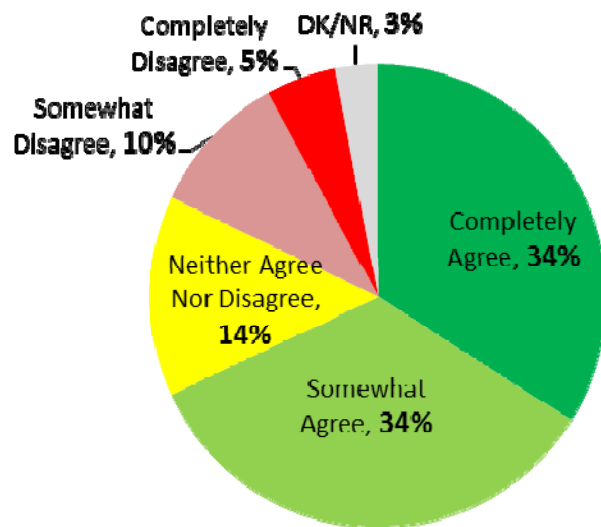

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 68% Pakistanis think people who break the law should be punished more harshly than they are at present.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked “Please tell us, how much do you agree or disagree with the following statement: **People who break the law should be punished more harshly than they are at present?**” Responding to this, 34% said they completely agreed, 34% said they somewhat agreed and 14% said they neither agreed nor disagreed. 10% of the respondents replied they somewhat disagreed whereas 5% who said they completely disagreed. 3% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2619 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Feb 10, 2014 – Feb 17, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

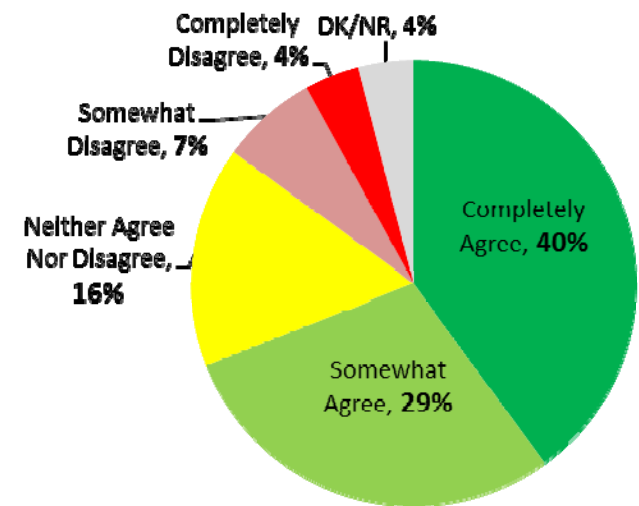

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked **“Please tell us, how much do you agree or disagree with the following statement: When there is limited opportunity for employment, men should be given preference over women for jobs?”** Responding to this, 40% said they completely agreed, 29% said they somewhat agreed and 16% replied they neither agreed nor disagreed. 7% of the respondents mentioned they somewhat disagreed compared to 4% who said they completely disagreed. 4% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2619 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Feb 10, 2014 – Feb 17, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.

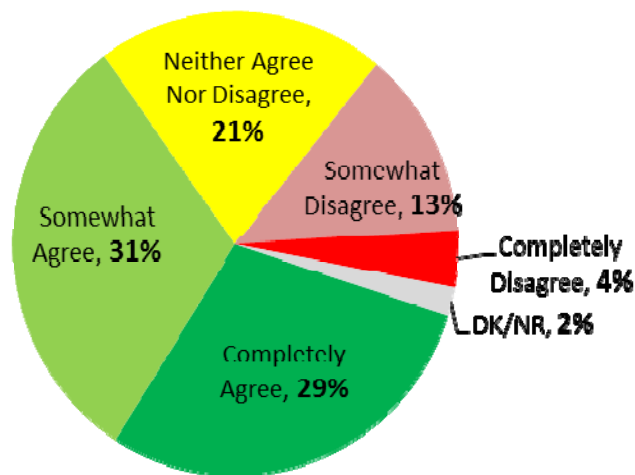

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked **“Please tell us, how much do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Women should be ready to leave their employment for the sake of their families?”** Responding to this, 29% said they completely agreed, 31% said they somewhat agreed and 21% replied they neither agreed nor disagreed. 13% of the respondents mentioned they somewhat disagreed compared to 4% who said they completely disagreed. 2% did not respond.

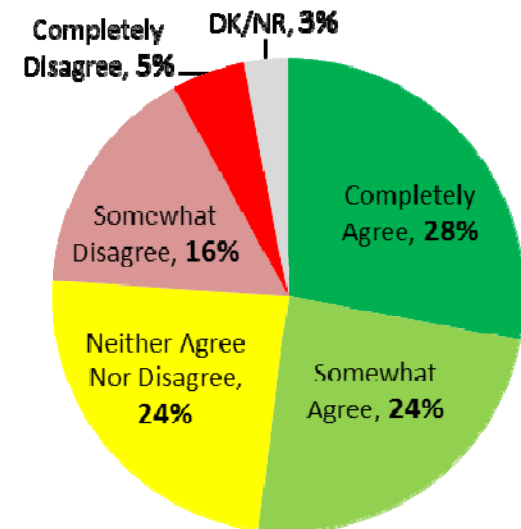

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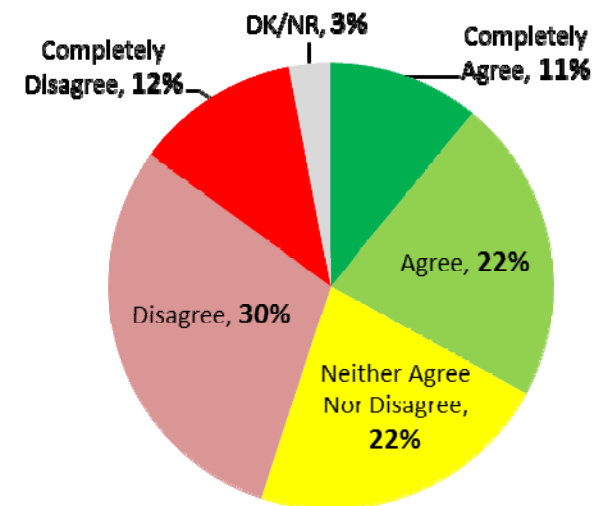

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked **“Majority of the unemployed individuals don't try to find employment?”** Responding to this, 11% said they completely agree, 22% said they somewhat agree and 22% said they neither agree nor disagree. 30% of the respondents disagreed with the statement whereas 12% said they completely disagree. 3% did not respond. A gender breakdown did not reveal a very high disparity between males and females. 11% of the male respondents completely agreed with the statement compared to 10% of women. 24% men said they agree, 21% said they neither agreed nor disagreed and 29% said they disagreed. 12% said they completely disagreed. For women, 20% said they agree whereas 23% said they neither agree nor disagree and 32% said they disagree. Only 11% on the women said they completely disagree and 4% did not respond.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2587 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Feb 17, 2014 – Feb 24, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
