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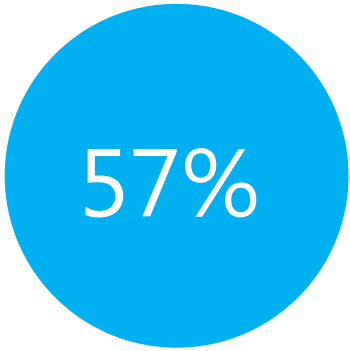

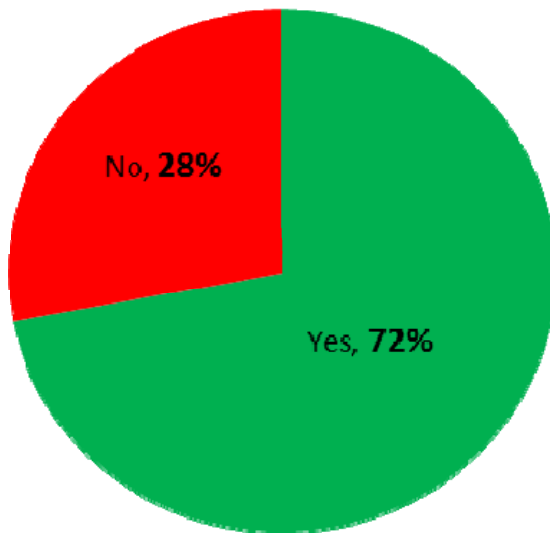

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2616 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Mar 03, 2014 – Mar 10, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.



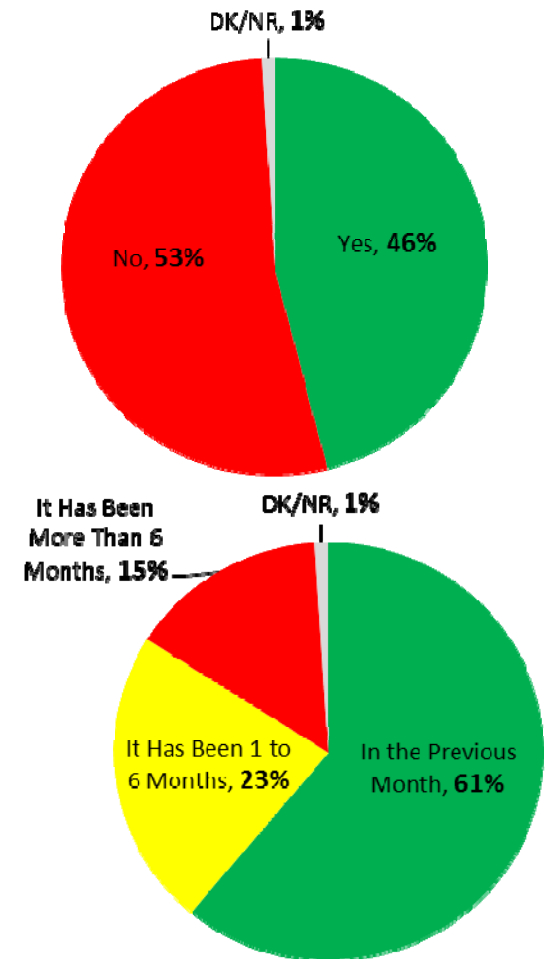

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, only 46% Pakistani males claim they ever talked to the Imam at their local mosque.

A nationally representative sample of adult men, from across the four provinces was asked **“Have you ever talked to your local mosque’s Imam?”** Responding to this, 46% said yes and 53% replied no. 1% did not respond. Following up, respondents who replied yes were asked, **“When was the last time you talked to your local mosque’s Imam?”** In response, 61% said in the previous month, 23% said it has been 1 to 6 months and 15% said it has been more than six months. 1% did not respond.

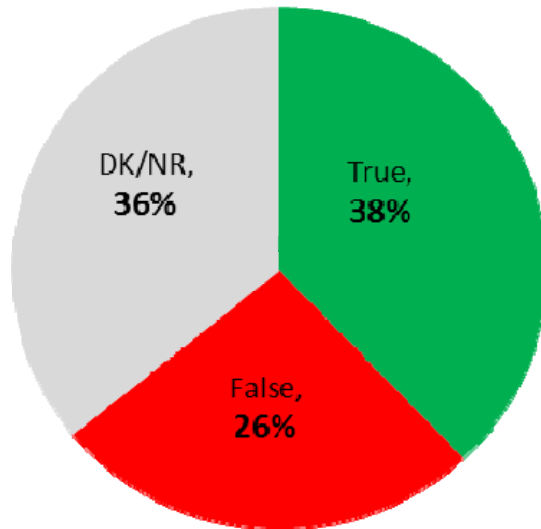

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1492 men in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Mar 03, 2014 – Mar 10, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan 38% Pakistanis are of the opinion that the allegations by Jamshed Dasti against law makers residing in Parliament lodges are true.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked **“Recently, MNA Jamshed Dasti accused that alcohol, drugs and other immoral acts have been taking place at the Parliament Lodges. In your opinion, are these accusations by Jamshed Dasti are true or false?”** Responding to this, 38% said true whereas 26% replied false. 36% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2616 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Mar 03, 2014 – Mar 10, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

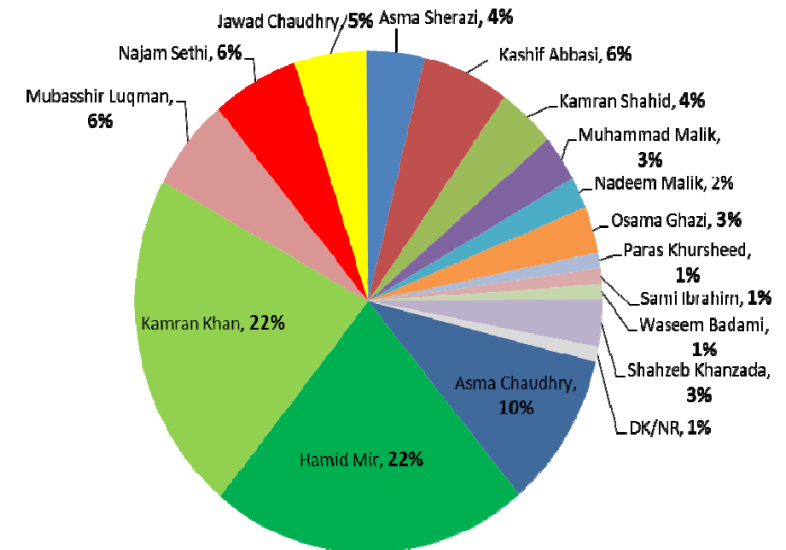

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked **“If you watch talk shows, in the reference to TV talk show host who do you trust the most?”** Responding to this, 22% said Kamran Khan, 22% replied Hamid Mir, 6% said Najam Sethi and 6% mentioned Mubasshir Luqman. 10% of the respondents said Asma Chaudhry. Others include, Jawad Chaudhry (5%), Asma Sherazi (4%), Kashif Abbasi (6%), Kamran Shahid (4%), Muhammad Malik (3%), Nadeem Malik (2%), Osama Ghazi (3%), Paras Khursheed (1%), Sami Ibrahim (1%), Waseem Badami (1%) and Shahzeb Khanzada (3%). 1% did not respond.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1424 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Mar 03, 2014 – Mar 10, 2014. 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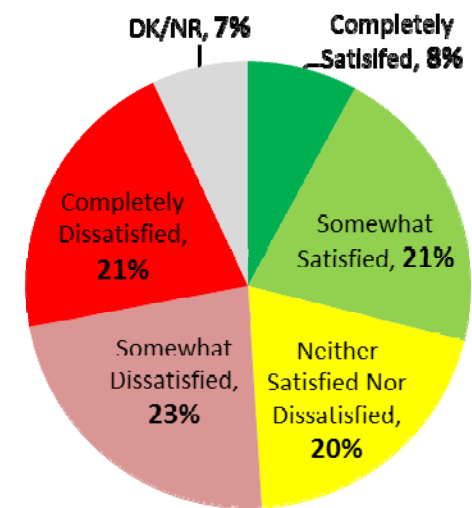

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 44% Pakistanis are dissatisfied with the current situation in Pakistan. Satisfaction is highest in KPK (57%) and lowest in Balochistan (8%).

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked **“Please tell me, are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the current situation in Pakistan?”** Responding to this, 8% said they are completely satisfied, 21% say they are somewhat satisfied and 20% said they are neither satisfied nor dissatisfied. 23% said they are somewhat dissatisfied and 21% replied they are completely dissatisfied. 7% did not respond. A provincial breakdown reveals that 6% of respondents from Punjab say they are completely satisfied, 21% say they are somewhat satisfied and 21% said they are neither satisfied nor dissatisfied. 16% said they are somewhat dissatisfied and 9% replied they are completely dissatisfied. For Sindh, 7% of the respondents say they are completely satisfied, 19% say they are somewhat satisfied and 17% said they are neither satisfied nor dissatisfied. 38% said they are somewhat dissatisfied and 1% replied they are completely dissatisfied. With regards to KPK, 22% of the respondents say they are completely satisfied, 35% say they are somewhat satisfied and 17% said they are neither satisfied nor dissatisfied. 12% said they are somewhat dissatisfied and 8% replied they are completely dissatisfied. In Balochistan, 1% of the respondents say they are completely satisfied, 7% say they are somewhat satisfied and 33% said they are neither satisfied nor dissatisfied. 18% said they are somewhat dissatisfied and none of the respondents mentioned complete dissatisfaction with the situation.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2542 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Mar 10, 2014 – Mar 17, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
