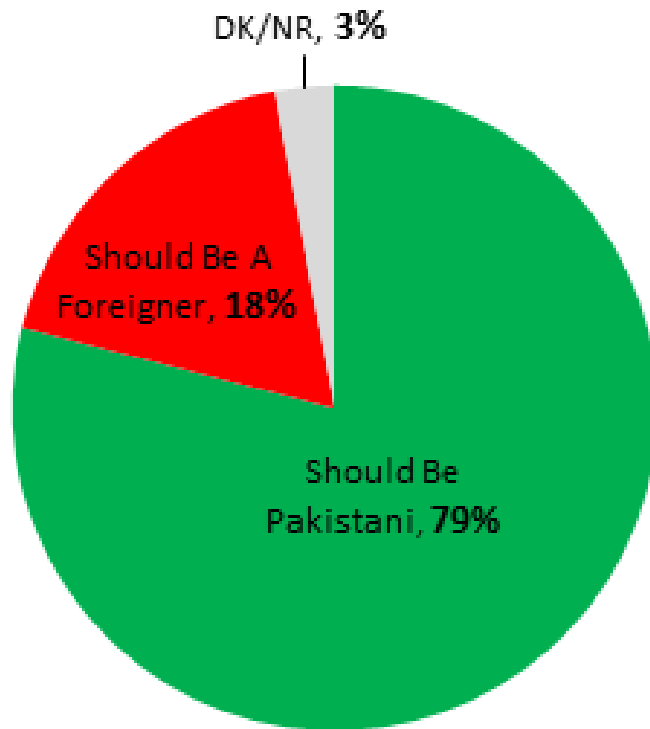

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 79% Pakistanis think the coach of the Pakistan Cricket Team should be a Pakistani.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked **“Some people think the coach for the Pakistan Cricket Team should be a Pakistani while others think it should be a foreigner. What is your opinion?”** Responding to this, 79% said the coach should be a Pakistani whereas 18% said the coach should be a foreigner. 3% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2538 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Apr 7, 2014 – Apr 14, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.



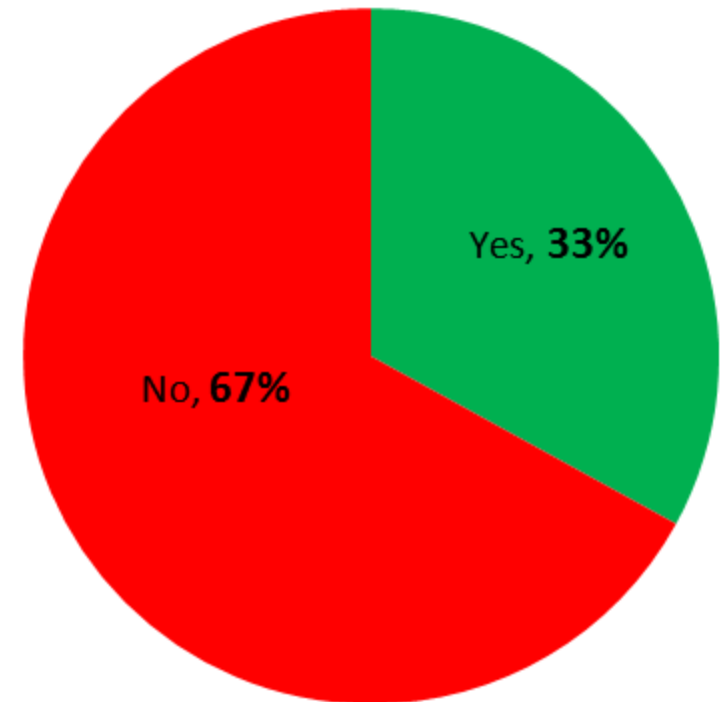

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked “**Recently, Siraj-ul-Haq was made the new leader of Jamat-i-Islami. Did you hear/read anything about this?**” Responding to this, 33% said yes whereas 67% said no.

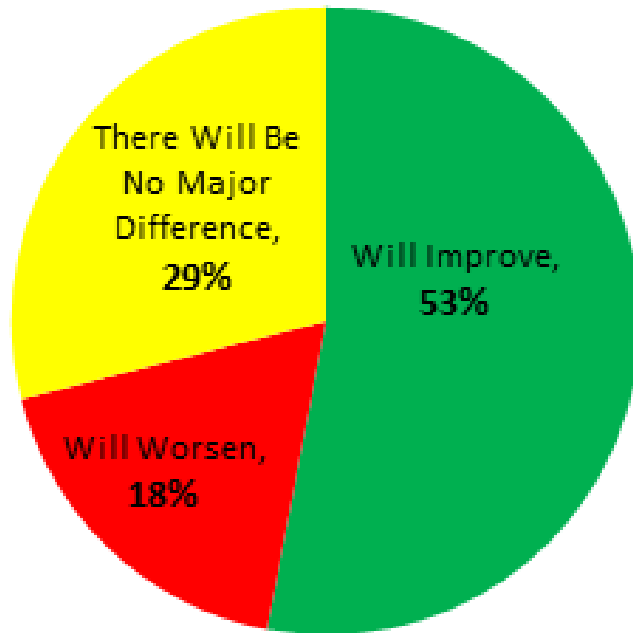

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 53% Pakistanis believe the relationship between Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaaf and Jamat-i-Islami will improve after the latter's change in leadership.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women (that was aware of Jamat-i-Islami's change in leadership), from across the four provinces was asked "Please tell me, with Jamat-i-Islami having a new leader, will the relations between Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaaf and Jamat-i-Islami improve or worsen, or will there be no major difference?" Responding to this, 53% said the relations will improve, 18% replied they will worsen and 29% said there will be no major difference.

The study was released by Gilani Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 830 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during Apr 7, 2014 – Apr 14, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

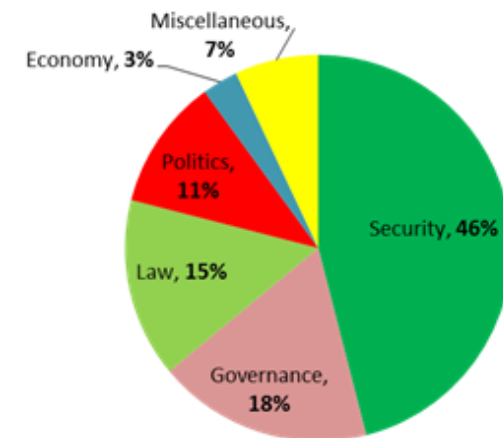
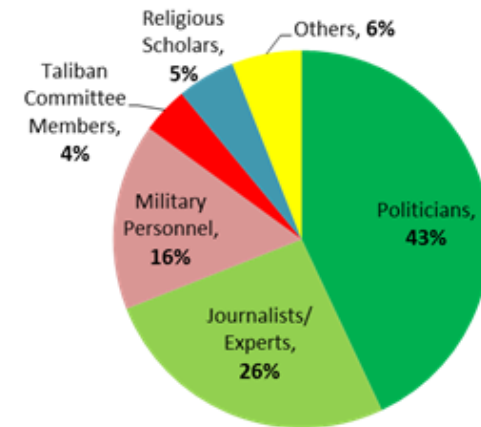
In the 9 Talk Shows analyzed, ‘Security’ was the main issue under discussion (46%) while majority of the guests were politicians (43%) and PPP was the political party with the most airtime representation.

This study was conducted by Gallup Pakistan Media Research Consultancy. The duration of the analysis is October/November 2013 and February 2014. The 09 talk shows reviewed under this study include Off the Record; Aaj Kamran Khan Ke Saath; MerayMuta-biq; To the Point; Sawal Yeh Hai; News Eye; Aapas Ki Baat; Capital Talk and Tonight with Jasmeen. On whole, 118 hours of video, spread over 201 episodes were reviewed for this analysis.

On average 3 guests appeared per episode for each show. While some guests were frequently invited on different talk shows, overall there were 226 unique guests in the 201 episodes analyzed. Furthermore, majority of the guests were Politicians (43%), followed by Journalists and Experts at 26% and Military Personnel at 16%. 4% of the guests invited were Taliban Committee Members and 5% were Religious Scholars. Maximum representation amongst Political Parties was from Pakistan People’s Party (PPP) at 24%, followed by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf (PTI) at 20% and Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) at 17%.

Keeping in line with the current situation of the country, issues related to ‘Security’ dominated the airtime at 46%. Second most popular topic of discussion was Governance at 18%, followed by Law, Politics and Economy at 15%, 11% and 3%, respectively. Miscellaneous topics comprised 6% of the airtime. Under the ‘Security’ banner, the ‘Dialogue with Taliban’ took precedence over all other related issues, taking up 50% of the total ‘Security’ airtime.

In ‘Politics’ the most frequently discussed issues include: ‘Political Positions’ at 32%; ‘Rigging in Elections’ at 20% and ‘Politics of MQM’ and ‘Jamshed Dasti Allegations’ at 12% each. The remaining airtime (24%) was devoted to miscellaneous political issues. Under the ‘Governance’ heading, ‘Pakistan’s Foreign Relations’ was the most popular topic, taking up 34% of the airtime.
