Women's Rights (Part 3)

*This is a 5 part series on popular views about women's rights and their status in Pakistan. In **part 1**, we discuss perceptions of Pakistanis about in which society are women respected more; **part 2** seeks nation-wide views on whether a woman can become head of state, **part 3** seeks views on whether there is equal treatment of men and women in Pakistan, **part 4** seeks opinions on whether women should be involved in Land and Property related issues and if they are involved in them usually, and **part 5** asks whether women in Pakistan get their rightful claims on inheritance as prescribed in Islam.*

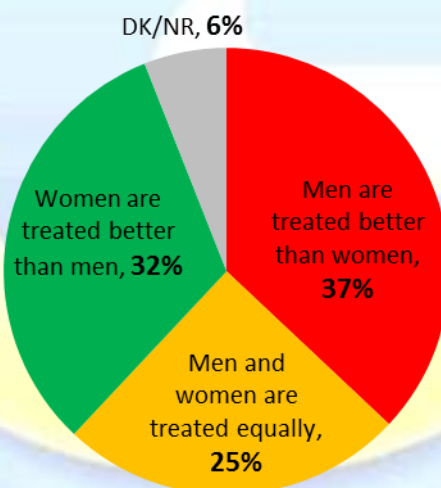
Only 25% of Pakistanis think men and women are treated equally in Pakistan. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

Islamabad, November 23, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, only 25% of Pakistanis think men and women are treated equally in Pakistan.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "In your opinion, are men and women treated equally in our country or not?" Responding to this, 37% said men are treated better than women, 32% said women are treated better than men and 25% said men and women are treated equally. However, 6% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2673 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 28, 2012 – November 02, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

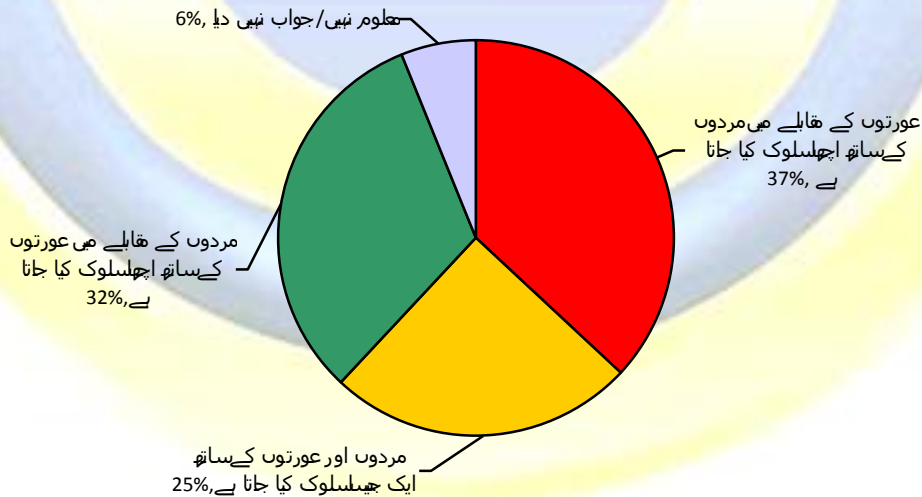

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، صرف 25% پاکستانیوں کے خیال میں مردوں اور عورتوں کے ساتھ ایک جیسا سلوک کیا جاتا ہے۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شماریاتی طور پر منتخب مرد و خواتین سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "آپ کے خیال میں کیا ہمارے ملک میں مردوں اور عورتوں کے ساتھ ایک جیسا سلوک کیا جاتا ہے یا نہیں؟"، اس سوال کے جواب میں 37% جوابدہندگان کے مطابق عورتوں کے مقابلے میں مردوں کے ساتھ اچھا سلوک کیا جاتا ہے، اور 32% کے مطابق مردوں کے مقابلے میں عورتوں کے ساتھ اچھا سلوک کیا جاتا ہے اور 25% کے مطابق مردوں اور عورتوں کے ساتھ ایک جیسا سلوک کیا جاتا ہے، تاہم 6% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔
