Pakistani Views About Elections in America (Part 4)

*This is a 4 part series on Pakistani views about the forthcoming Presidential election in America. **Part 1** deals with Pakistani views in the possible impact of American elections on life in Pakistan; **part 2** seeks views on whether Pakistanis should also be voting in the American elections; **part 3** probes into reasons or grounds in which Pakistanis might choose one Presidential candidate over another; the concluding **part 4** seeks preferences from Pakistanis between the incumbent President Obama and his Republican challenger, Mitt Romney. (These questions were asked in 30 countries other than Pakistan, their comparative views will also be published)*

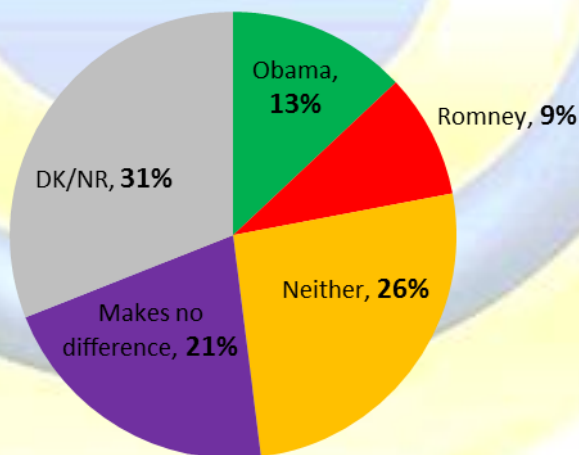

Islamabad, September 28, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 13% of Pakistanis would vote for Obama if they were to vote in American Elections; 9% for his opponent Romney. Most (47%) would vote for neither or say it makes no difference.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “If you were to vote in American Presidential Elections, who would you vote for?” Responding to this, 13% of Pakistanis said they would vote for President Obama, 9% said they would vote for his challenger Mitt Romney, 26% said they would vote for neither and 21% said it did not make a difference. However, 31% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2670 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 26, 2012 - September 01, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

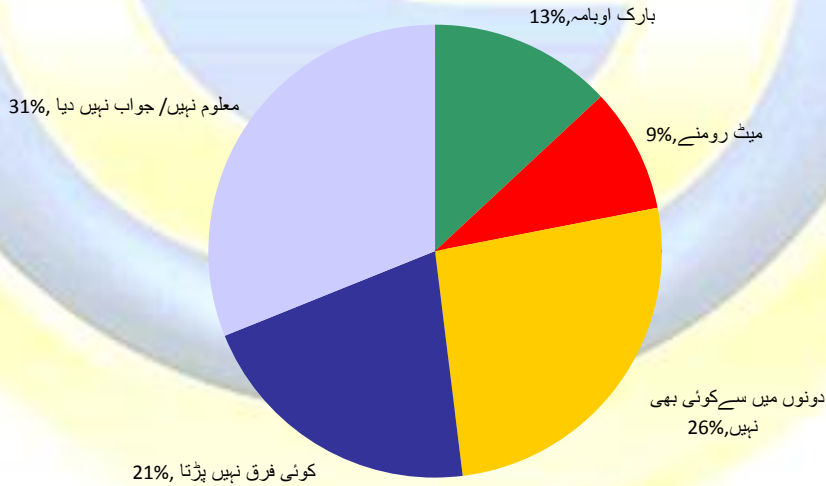

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، 13% پاکستانیوں کے مطابق اگر امریکی صدارتی انتخابات میں انہیں ووٹ دینا پڑے تو وہ اوبامہ کو ووٹ دیں گے، اور 9% میٹ رومنے کو۔ زیادہ تر (47%) افراد نے کہا کہ وہ ووٹ نہیں دیں گے یا ان کے ووٹ دینے سے کوئی فرق نہیں پڑے گا۔ سروے میں ملک بھر سے شماریاتی طور پر منتخب خواتین و حضرات سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "فرض کریں کہ آپ کو امریکی صدارتی انتخابات میں ووٹ دینا پڑے تو آپ کس امیدوار کو ووٹ دیں گے؟" اس سوال کے جواب میں 13% جوابدہندگان نے کہا کہ اگر انہیں بھی امریکی انتخابات میں ووٹ ڈالنے کا موقع ملے تو وہ اوبامہ کو ووٹ دیں گے، 9% میٹ رومنے کو، 26% افراد دونوں امیدواروں میں سے کسی کو بھی نہیں ووٹ دیں گے، جبکہ 21% افراد کے خیال میں ان کے ووٹ دینے سے کوئی فرق نہیں پڑتا۔ بقایا 31% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔
