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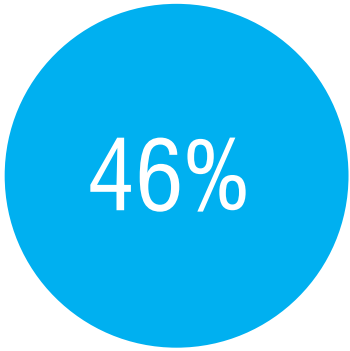

46% Pakistanis think the current government should conduct local government elections as soon as possible; 21% say there is no need for such elections.

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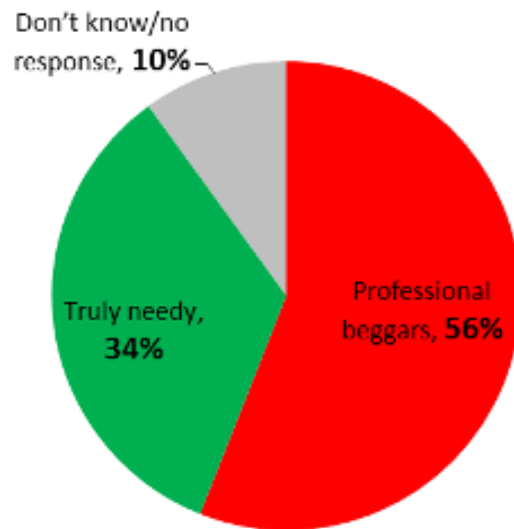

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, Majority of Pakistanis (56%) believe that many of those begging during Ramadan are professional beggars rather than truly needy.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “It is frequently seen that the number of beggars increases during Ramadan. In your opinion, are these people truly needy or beggars by profession?” Responding to this, 34% said truly needy and 56% said professional beggars. 10% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2635 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 01 – July 08, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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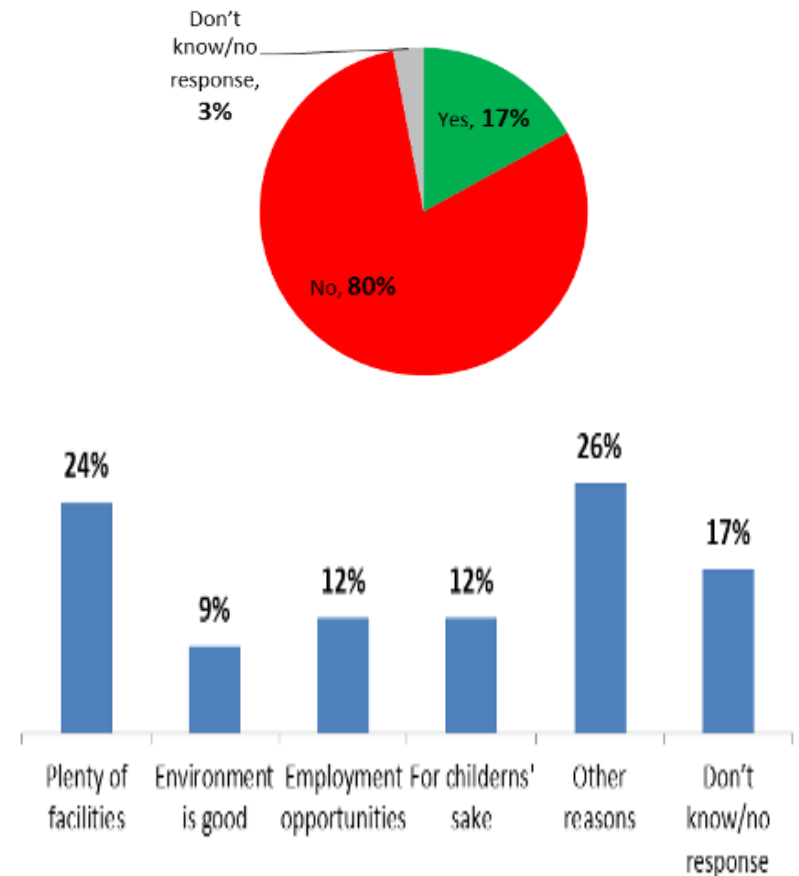
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A nationally representative sample of men and women from rural areas across the four provinces was asked “**Have you ever contemplated moving to a city?**” Responding to this, 17% said yes and 80% said no. 3% did not give a response. Those who said yes were further asked “**Why did you contemplate moving to the city?**” Responding to this, 24% said because of the availability of many facilities, 12% said because of employment opportunities, another 12% said

for the sake of their children, 9% said because of the good environment and 26% identified other reasons for thinking about moving to a city. 17% chose not to respond.

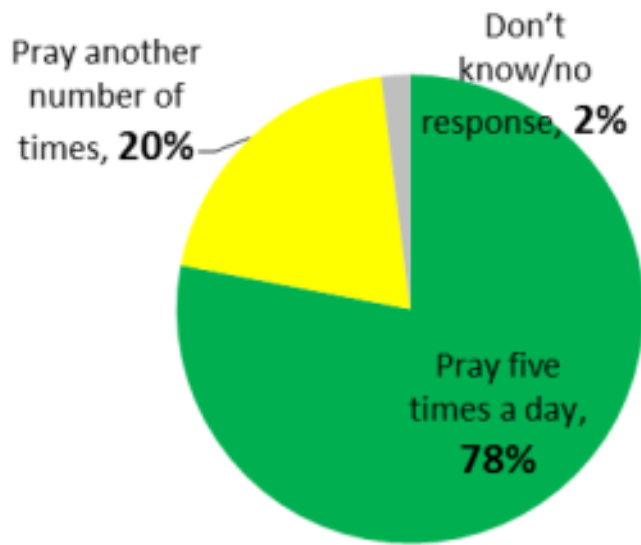

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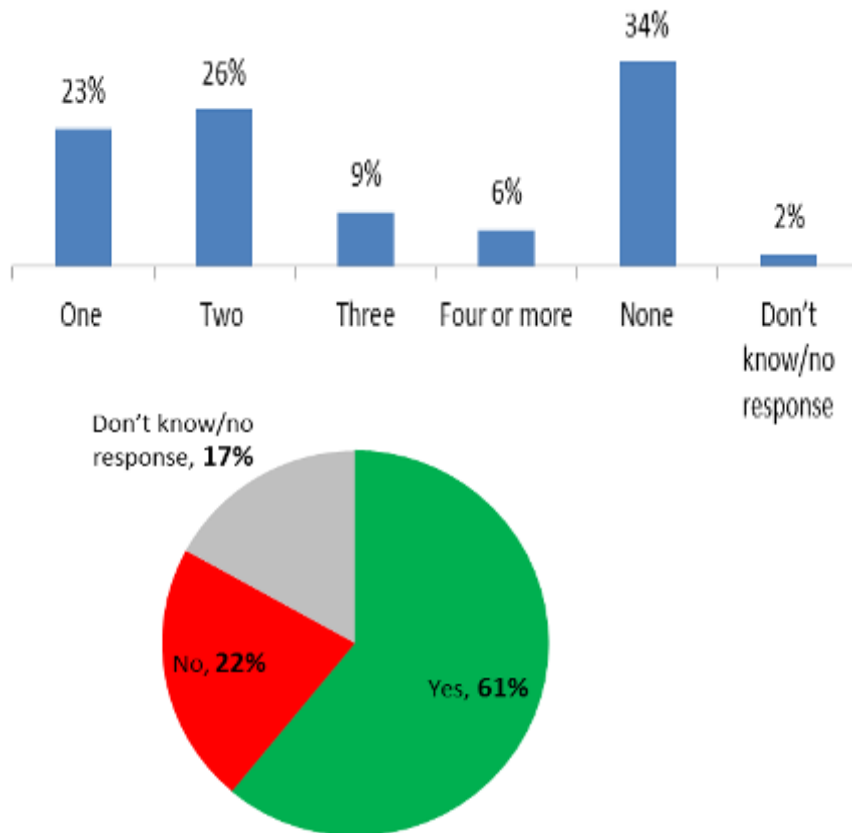
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Some people get the opportunity to pray whereas others don’t. Normally, how many times a day are you able to pray during Ramadan?” Responding to this, 78% said five times a day and 20% identified another number. 2% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2635 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 01, 2013 – July 8, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 61% Pakistanis say their children aged ten years or less have been vaccinated against measles.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from urban and rural areas across the four provinces was asked “**How many children aged less than ten years are there in your house?**” Responding to this, 23% said one, 26% said two, 9% said three, 6% said four or more children whereas 34% said none. 2% did not respond.

Respondents were further asked “**Do you remember if these children have been vaccinated against measles?**” Responding to this, 61% said yes, 22% said no whereas 17% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2606 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 24, 2013 – July 01, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

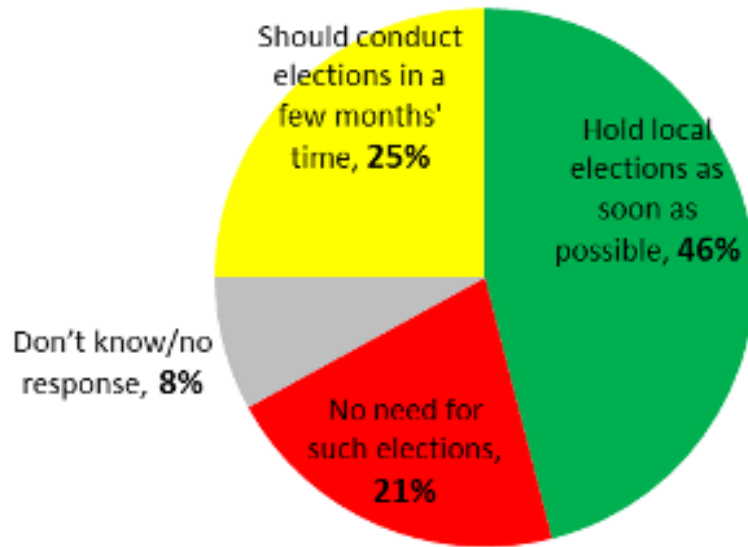
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A nationally representative sample of men and women from urban and rural areas across the four provinces was asked “Some people think the current government should conduct local government elections as soon as possible whereas others opine that the government should hold these elections in a few months’ time. Moreover, some believe there is no need for such elections. What is your opinion on this?” Responding to this, 46% said the elections should be conducted as soon as possible, 25% said they should be conducted in a few months’ time whereas 21% said there should be no elections. 8% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2635 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 01, 2013 – July 08, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.



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
