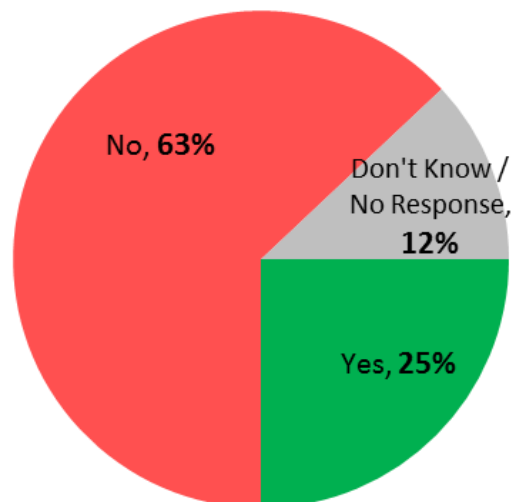

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 25% of Pakistanis say one or more persons in their family suffered illness due to recent heat wave.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Has anyone in your home fallen ill due to heat?” Responding to this, 25% claim that someone in their family has fallen ill due to heat whereas 63% claim that nobody in their family has fallen ill. However, 12% did not give a view.

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The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2671 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 10, 2012 – June 16, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 51% of Pakistanis say seasonal diseases are majorly caused by unhygienic water.

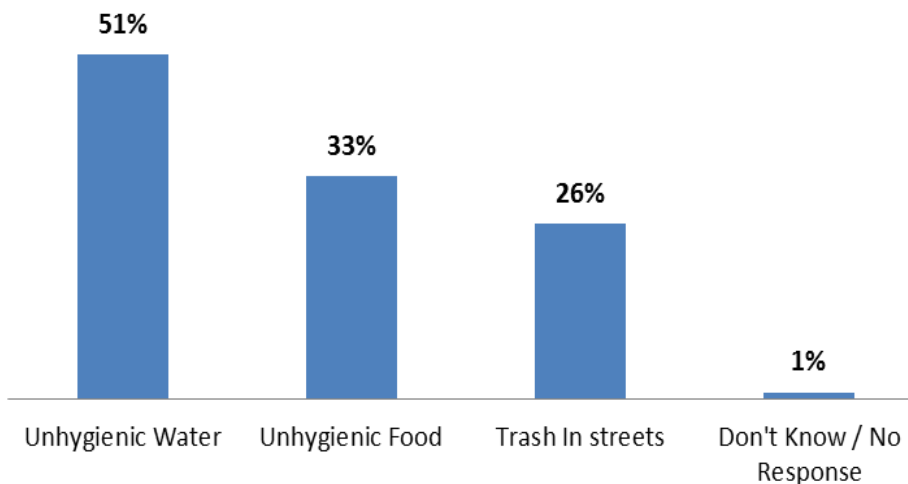


A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Normally many diseases spread in summer like Malaria, Cholera and Hepatitis etc. In your opinion what is the reason of the spread of such diseases?” Responding to this, 51% claim that the major reason of seasonal diseases is use of unhygienic water, 33% believe unhygienic food to be the major reason whereas 26% claim that these diseases are caused due to trash in streets. However, 1% did not give a view.

(Note: This was a multiple response question so the percentage sum may exceed 100.)

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2663 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 17, 2012 – June 23, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

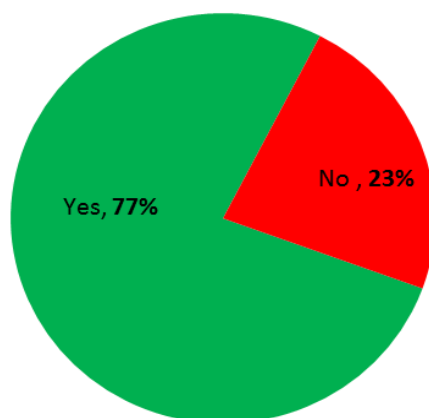

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 77% claim to know about recent death of legendary singer Mehdi Hassan. Among them 70% said they felt sad or very sad.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Recently, famous Pakistani singer Mehdi Hassan passed away. Have you heard or read anything about his death?” Responding to this, 77% claim that they have heard or read about Mehdi Hassan’s death whereas 23% claim to have no information about it.

Question: “Recently, famous Pakistani singer Mehdi Hassan passed away. Have you heard or read anything about his death?”

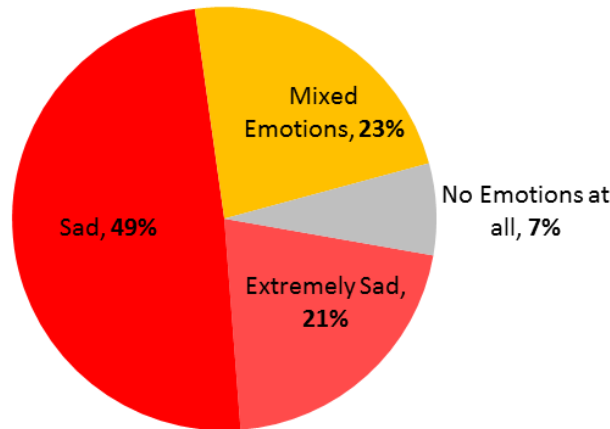

Among the respondents who have heard or read about Mehdi Hassan’s death were asked “What were your feelings when you got to know about Mehdi Hassan’s death?” Responding to this 21% claim to be extremely sad about it, 49% claim to be sad, 23% claim to have mixed emotions whereas 7% feel no emotion at all.

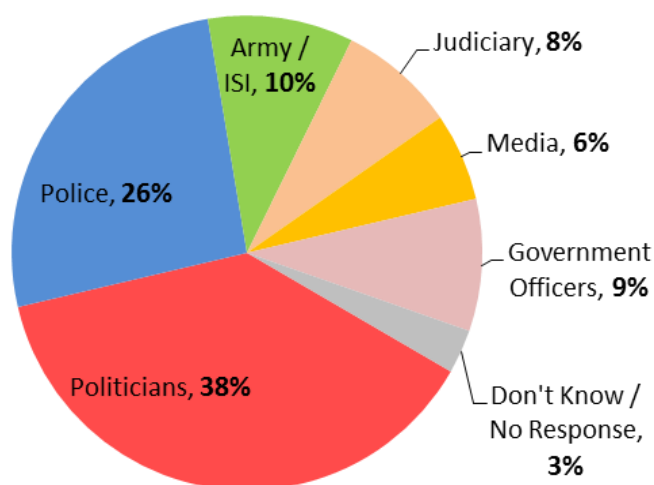

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "Imagine that you have to audit one of the following organizations, which one will you like to audit?" Responding to this, 38% claim that they would like to audit the politicians, 26% chose Police, 10% would like to audit Army / ISI, 8% chose judiciary, 6% would like to audit Media and 9% would like to audit government officers. However 3% did not give a view.

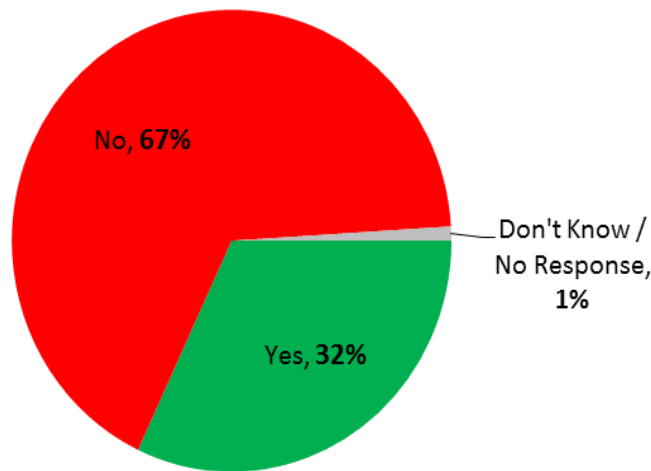

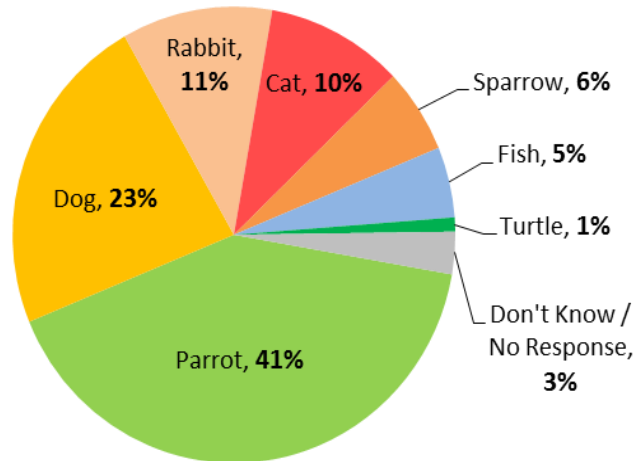

In a follow up question, the respondents were asked “Kindly tell if you were to keep a pet in your home, which animal would you prefer?” Responding to this, 41% prefer to have a parrot as their pet, 23% prefer dog, 11% prefer rabbit, 10% prefer cat, 6% prefer sparrow, 5% prefer Fish whereas 1% prefer to have turtle as their pet. However 3% did not give a view.
