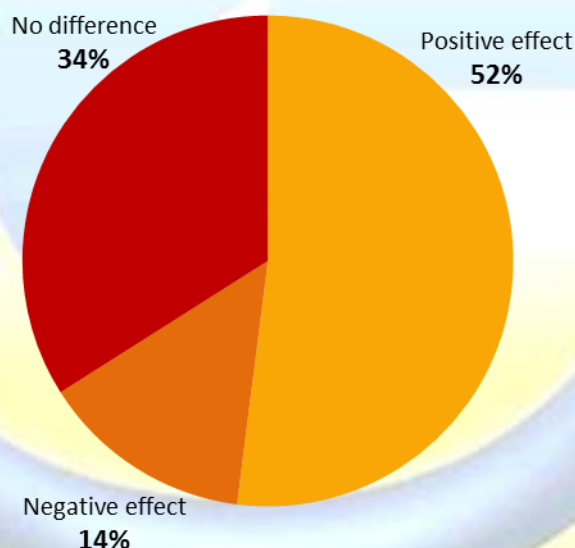
More than half Pakistanis think that Imran Khan's marriage will have a positive effect on his politics. GILANI RESEARCH FOUNDATION (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 52% Pakistanis think that Imran Khan's marriage will have a positive effect on his politics; 14% think it will have a negative effect.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people say that Imran Khan's marriage will have a positive effect on his politics, while others believe that it will have a negative effect on his politics, while still others believe that it will have no effect. What is your opinion?" In response to this question, 52% respondents said Imran Khan's marriage will have a positive effect on his politics, whereas 14% respondents said it will have a negative effect on his politics and 34% respondents said it will make no difference.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1389 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 19 - January 26, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

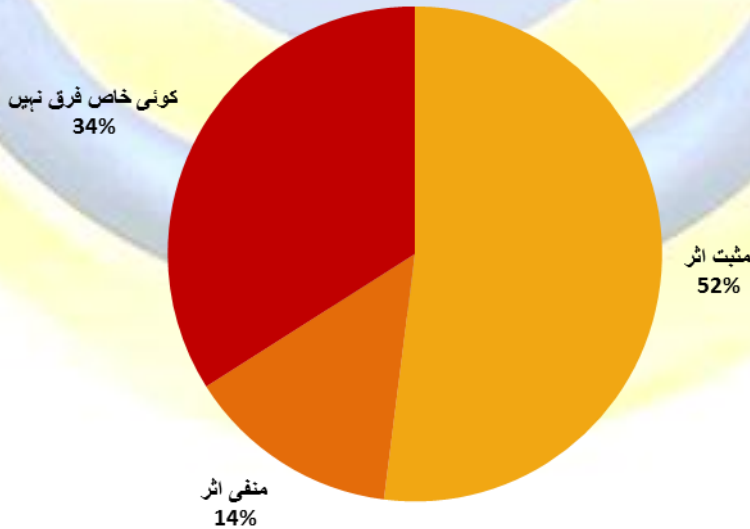
