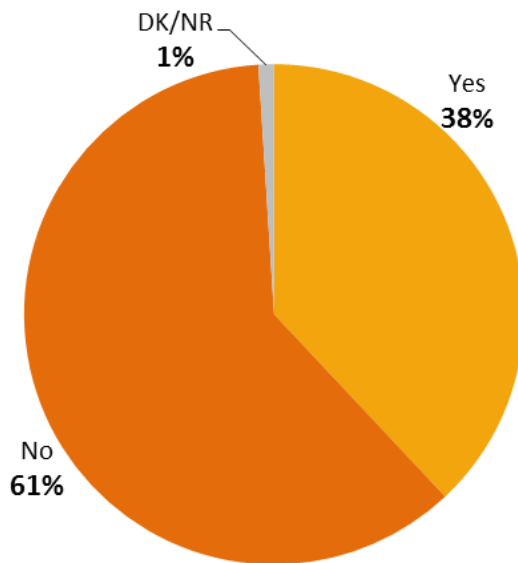

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 38% Pakistanis said they or someone from their household personally know the area’s post man; 61% Pakistanis do not.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell us, do you or anyone from your household personally know your area’s post man?” In response to this question, 38% respondents said they or someone from their household know their area’s postman personally. On the other hand, 61% respondents said that neither they nor anyone from their household personally know the area’s post man, while 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2597 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 8 – December 15, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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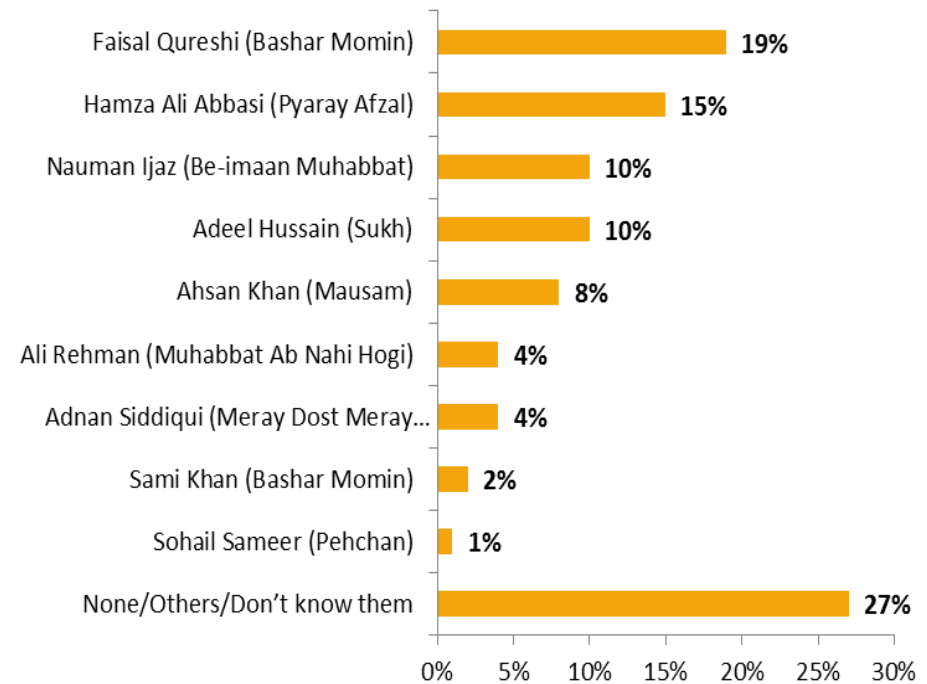

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 19% Pakistanis considered Faisal Qureshi's performance in Bashar Momin as the best; 15% named Hamza Ali Abbasi.

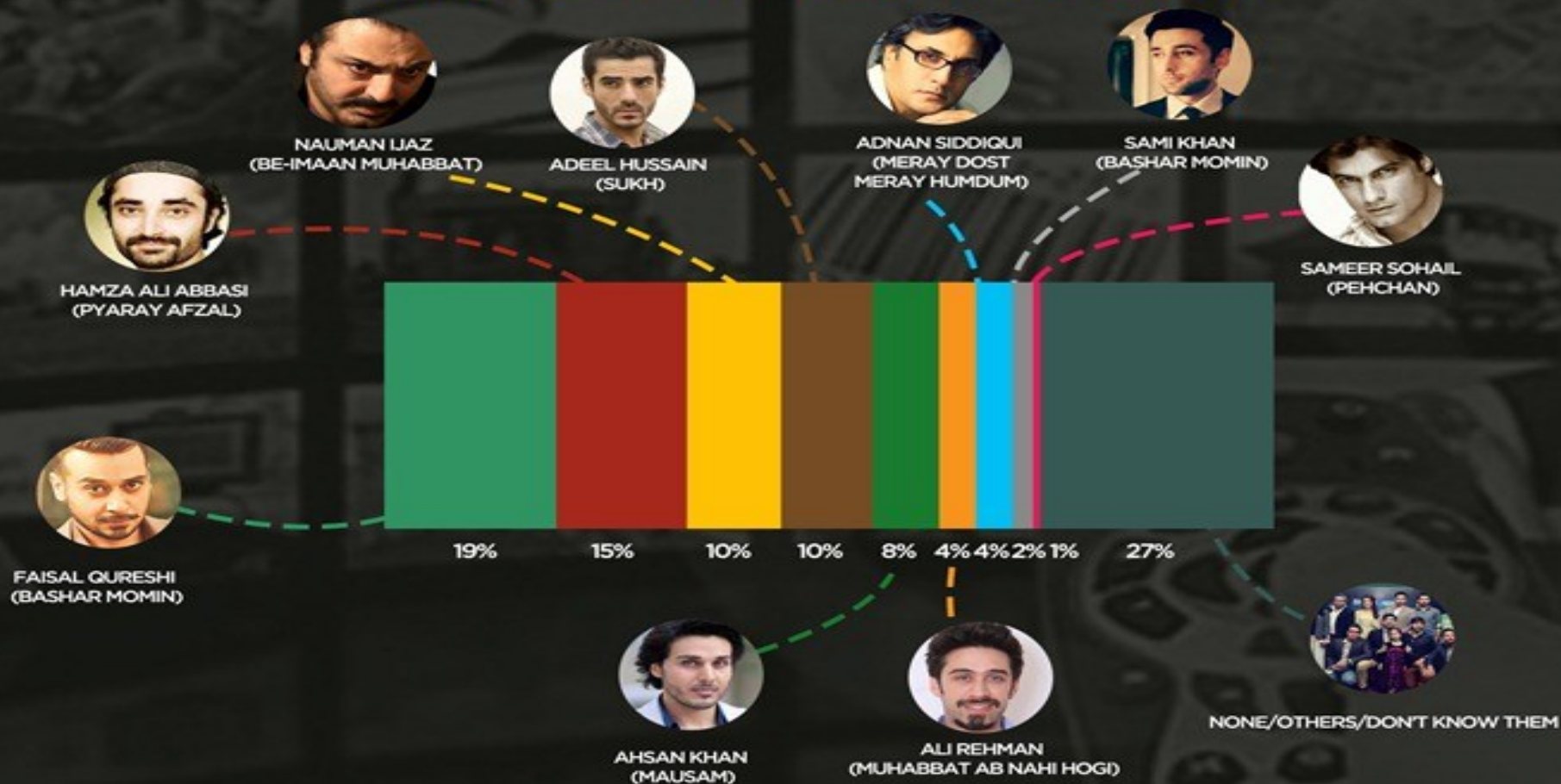
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, "Regarding these actors' performances in the following dramas, please tell us which Pakistani male actor's performance do you consider the best?" In response, 19% respondents said they considered Faisal Qureshi's performance in Bashar Momin as the best, 15% named Hamza Ali Abbasi in Pyaray Afzal, 10% named Nauman Ijaz in Be-imaan Muhabbat, and 10% named Adeel Hussain in Sukh. Ahsan Khan's performance in Mausam was considered the best by 8% respondents, 4% considered Ali Rehman (Muhabbat Ab Nahi Hogi) as the best performer, 4% thought Adnan Siddiqui (Meray Humdum Meray Dost) was the best performer, while 2% named Sami Khan (Bashar Momin) and 1% named Sohail Sameer (Pehchan). 27% of the respondents either considered none of these performances the best, or did not know them.

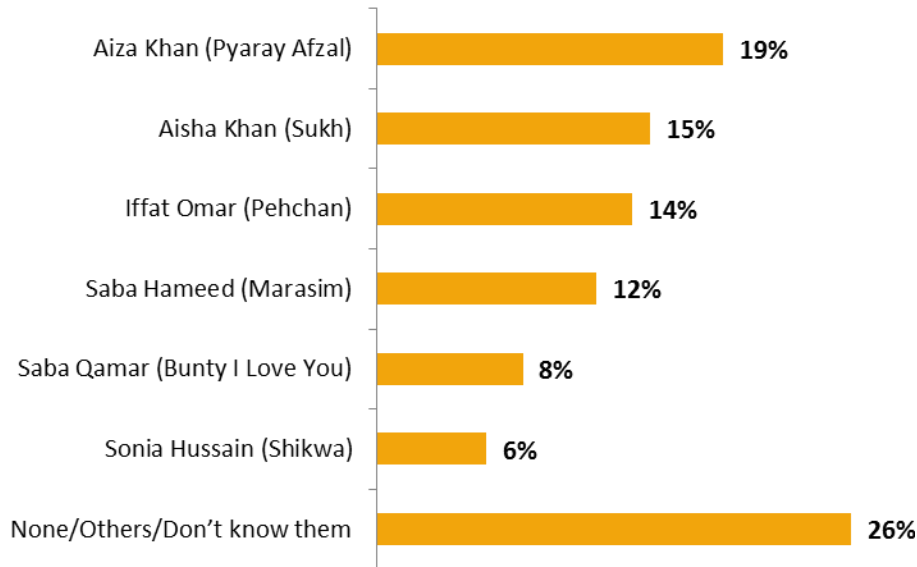

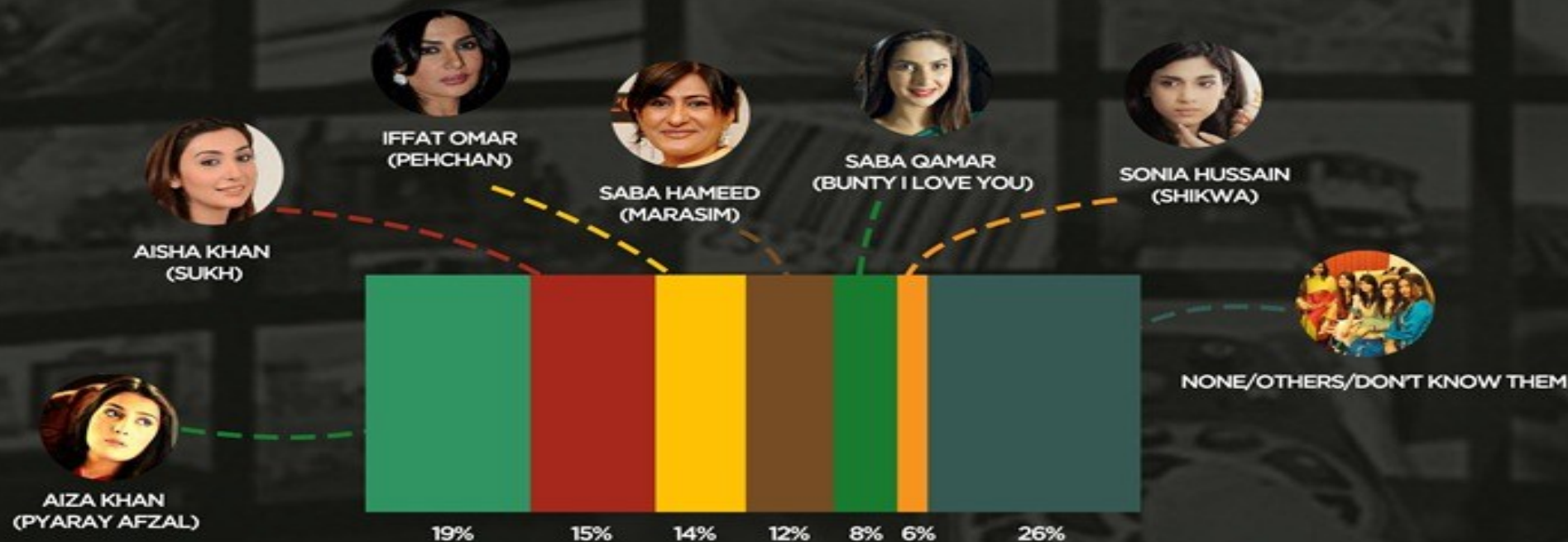

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “Regarding these actresses’ performances in the following dramas, please tell us which Pakistani female actor’s performance do you consider the best?” In response, 19% respondents said they considered Aiza Khan’s performance in Pyaray Afzal as the best, 15% named Aisha Khan in Sukh, 14% named Iffat Omar in Pehchan, 12% named Saba Hameed in Marasim, while 8% named Saba Qamar (Bunty I Love You) and 6% named Sonia Hussain (Shikwa). 26% respondents either considered none of these performances the best, or did not know these actors.

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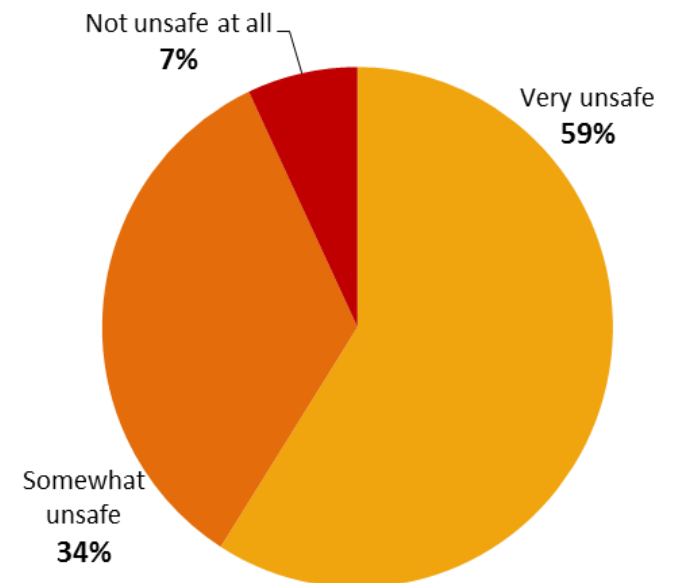

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 59% Pakistanis said they feel very unsafe after the Peshawar tragedy; 7% Pakistanis don't feel unsafe at all.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, "May Allah keep you and everyone from your household safe and secure. After the Peshawar tragedy, how unsafe do you feel you and members of your household are?" In response to this question, 59% respondents said they feel very unsafe, while 34% respondents said they feel somewhat unsafe and 7% don't feel unsafe at all.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2582 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 22 – December 29, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

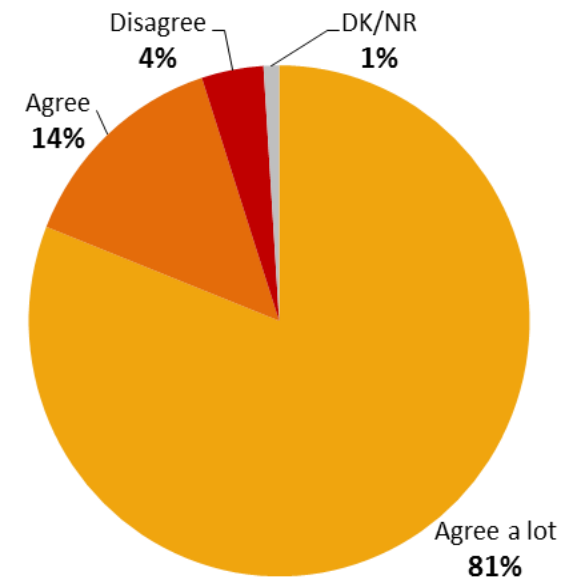

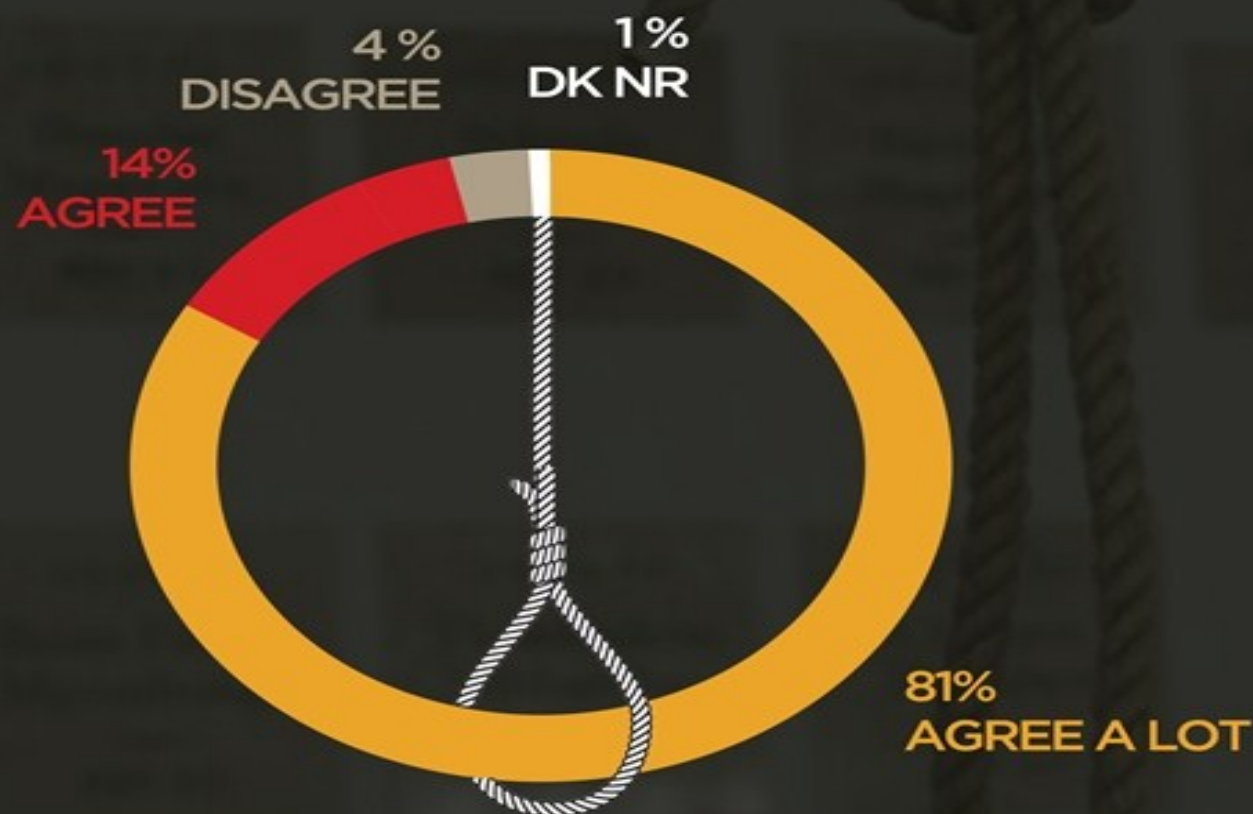
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell us, to what extent do you agree or disagree with the following sentence: ‘Convicted terrorists should be given the death penalty?’” In response to this question, 81% respondents said they agree with this statement a lot, 14% respondents said they agree with this statement, while 4% respondents disagree with the statement and 1% did not respond.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2582 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 22 – December 29, 2014.
