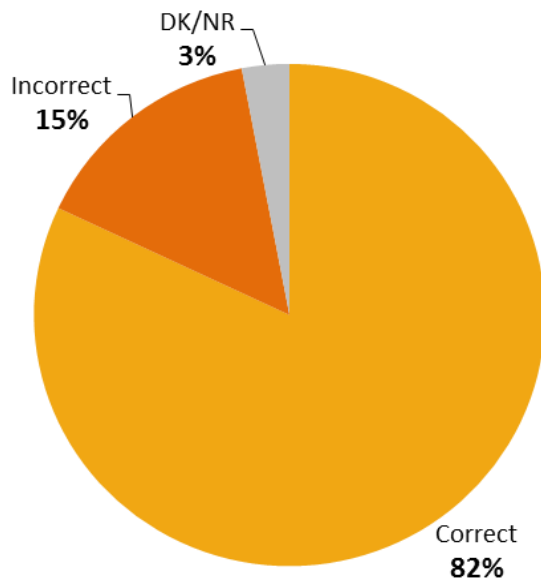
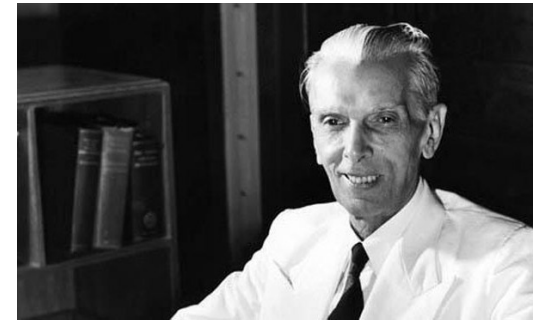

A nationally representative sample of those adult men and women who named the founder of Pakistan correctly, from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell us the date of Quaid-e-Azam’s birth?” In response to this question, 82% respondents gave the correct date of Quaid-e-Azam’s birth, while 15% gave the incorrect date and 3% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1882 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 29, 2014 – January 05, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

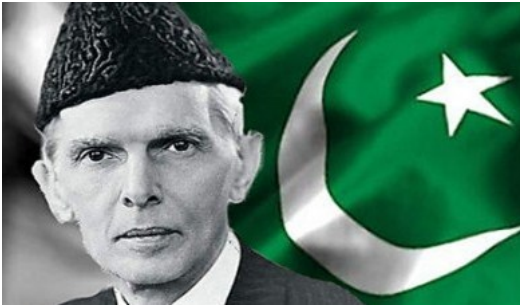

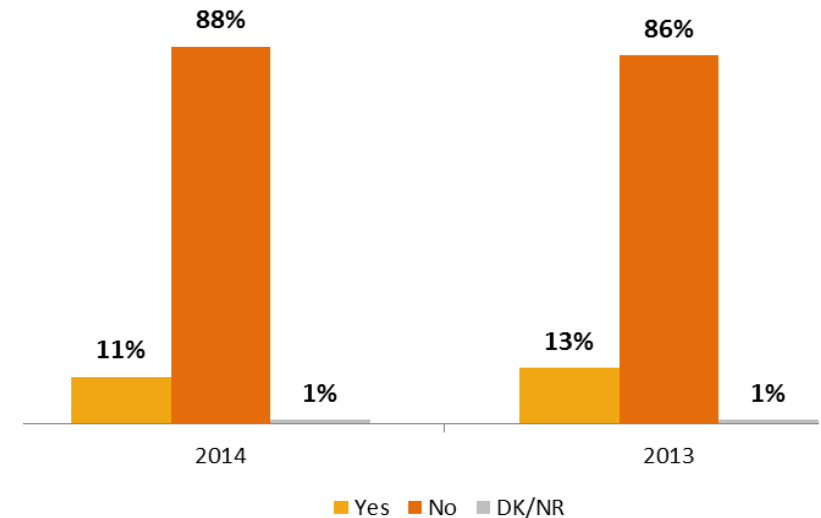

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 11% Pakistanis had the opportunity to attend a ceremony on Quaid-e-Azam's birthday; 88% Pakistanis did not.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, "This year on Quaid's birthday, did you have the opportunity to take part in any ceremony or not?" In response to this question, 11% respondents said they had the opportunity to attend a ceremony on Quaid-e-Azam's birthday, while 88% respondents did not have the opportunity to attend any ceremony and 1% respondents did not respond.

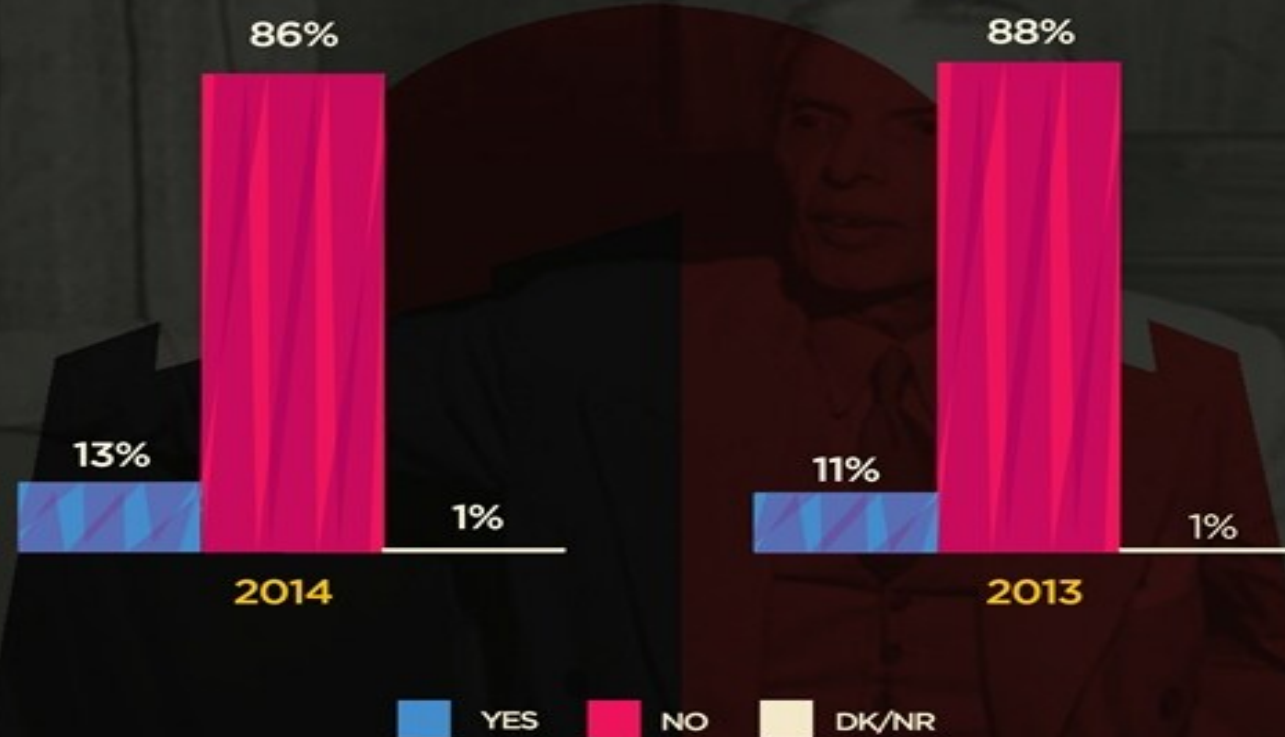
This question was also asked in 2013. Participation in ceremonies on Quaid-e-Azam's birthday seems to have dropped slightly since last year. In 2013, 13% respondents said they had attended a ceremony on Quaid-e-Azam Day, while 86% had not attended any ceremony and 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2442 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 29, 2014 – January 05, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

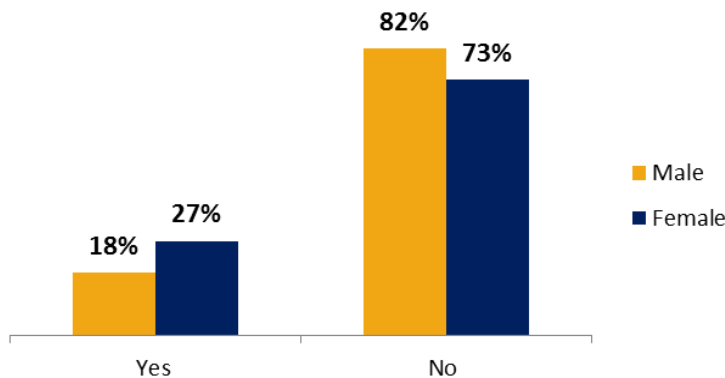
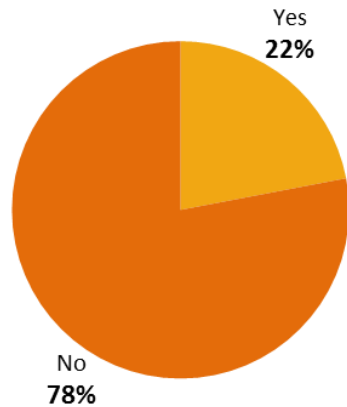

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “In the past one year, have you faced any of the following problems/diseases related to hair: Premature greying of hair?” In response to this question, 22% respondents said they have faced this problem during the past one year, while 78% have not faced premature greying of hair during the last year. According to the gender-wise breakdown of the survey, 18% men said they faced the problem of premature greying of hair, while 82% did not. Moreover, 27% women faced the problem, while 73% did not.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1389 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 19 - January 26, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm$ 2-3 per cent at 95% confidence level.

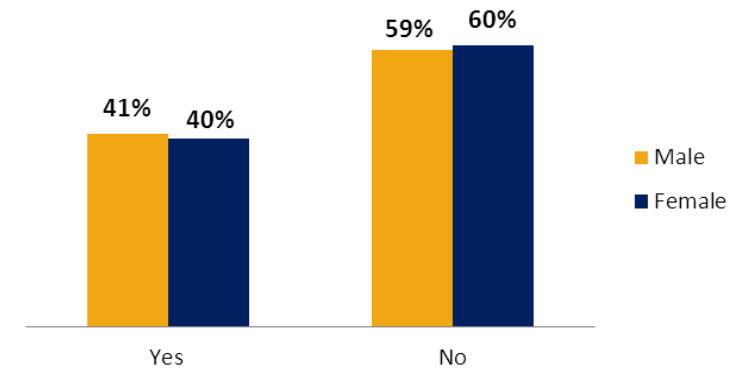
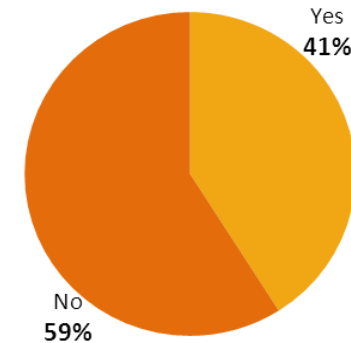

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 41% Pakistanis said they faced hair fall during the last year; 59% Pakistanis did not face the problem.

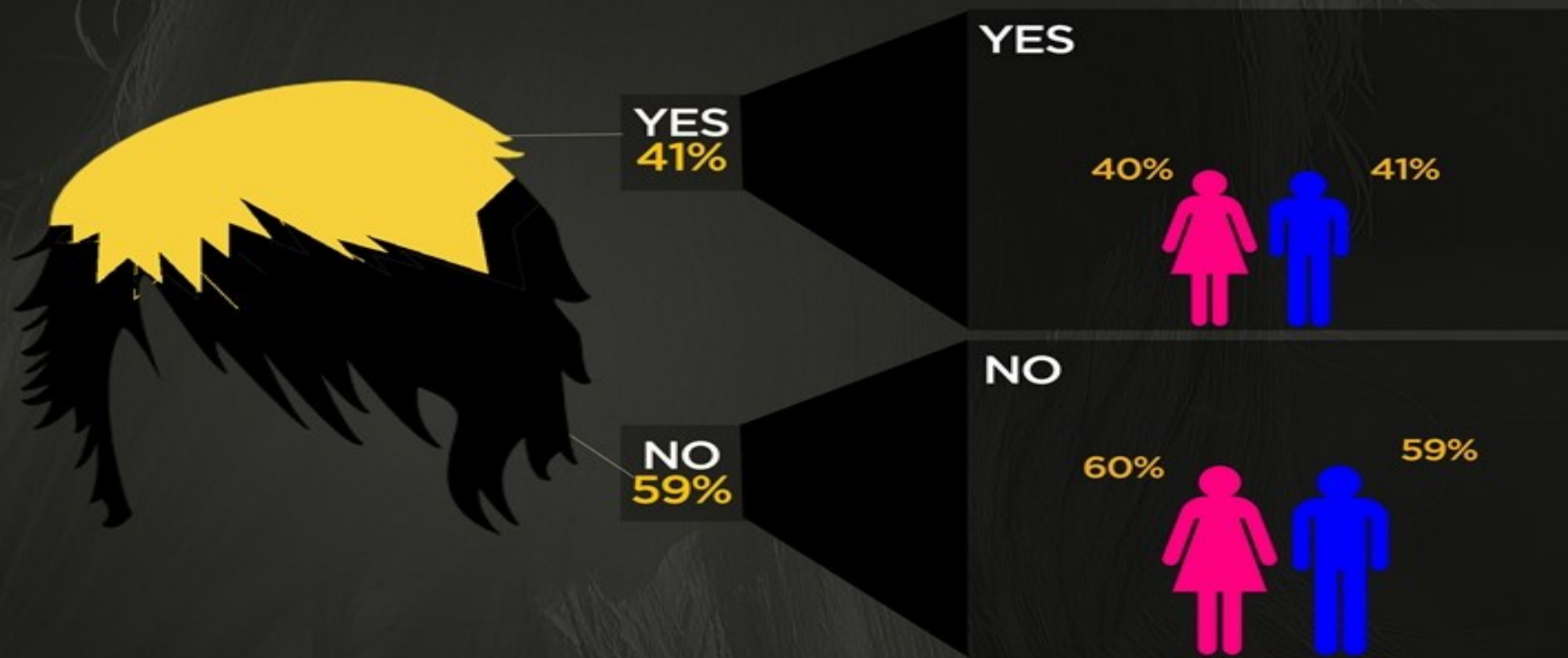
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “In the past one year, have you faced any of the following problems/diseases related to hair: Hair fall?” In response to this question, 41% respondents said they faced hair fall during the last year, while 59% said that they did not face hair fall during the last year. According to the gender-wise breakdown of the survey, there was not much difference between the percentage of men and women who faced the problem last year. Among men, 41% said they faced the problem while 59% did not. Among women, 40% said they faced the problem while 60% did not.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1389 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 19 - January 26, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

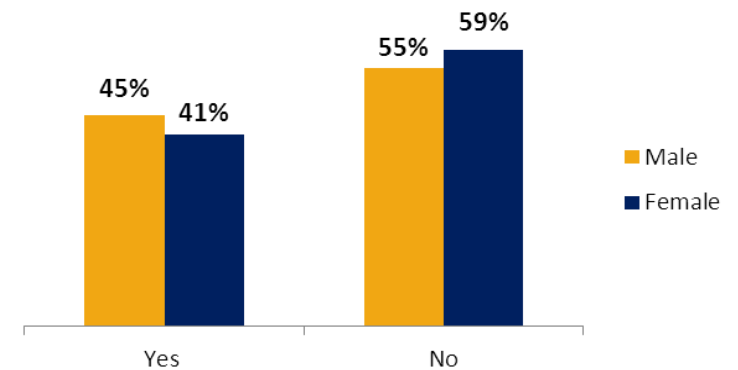
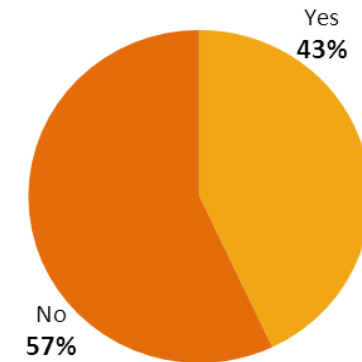

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 43% Pakistanis said they suffered from the problem of dandruff during the last year; 57% Pakistanis did not face this problem.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “In the past one year, have you faced any of the following problems/diseases related to hair: Dandruff in hair?” In response to this question, 43% respondents said they did suffer from the problem of dandruff in hair during the last year, while 57% respondents did not suffer from the problem of dandruff. According to the gender-wise breakdown, slightly less than half respondents among both genders faced this problem. Among men, 45% said they faced this problem, while 55% did not. Among women, 41% faced this problem, while 59% did not.

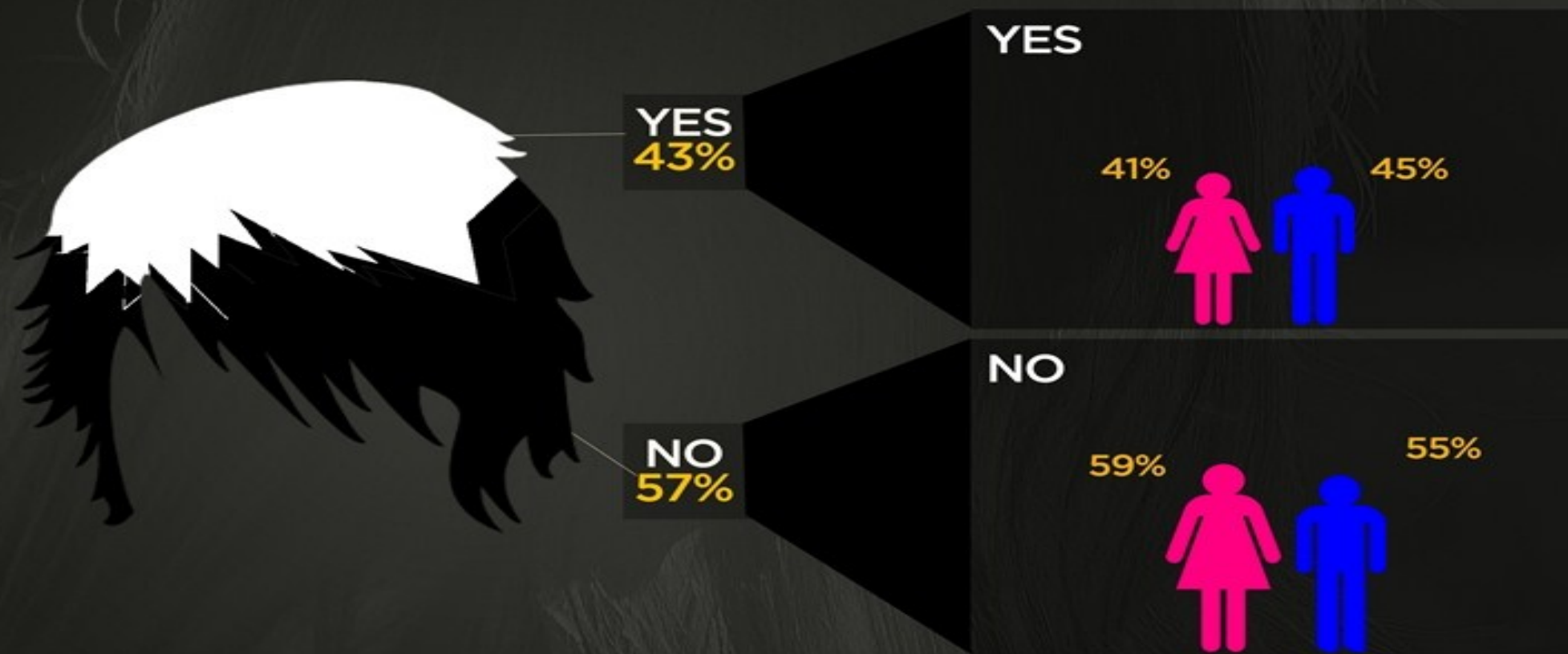
