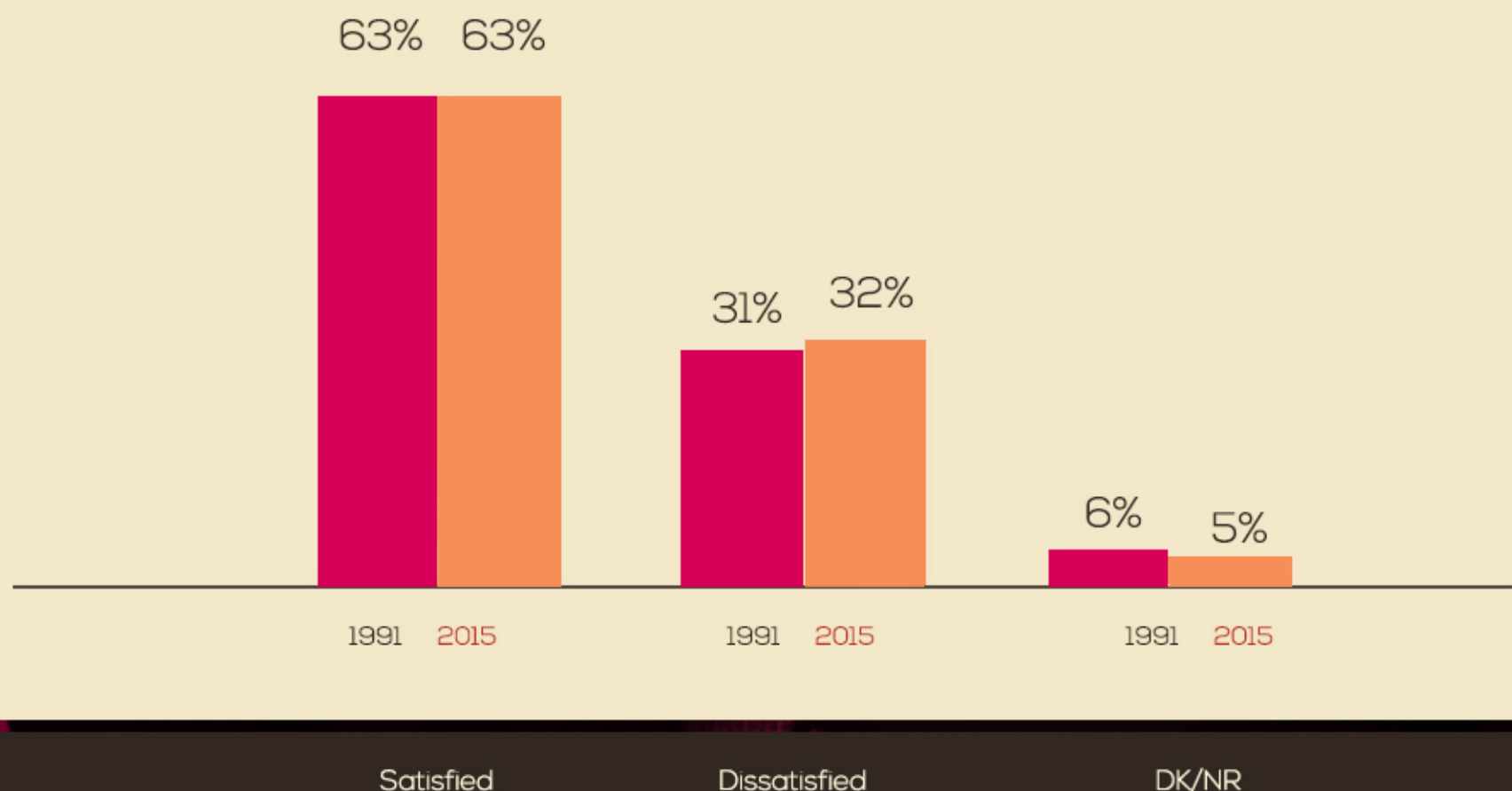

## Public Opinion in Pakistan in the Year 1991

#### General Political Opinion

**Public satisfaction with Nawaz Sharif government's efforts at establishing law and order – overall similar results in 1991 and 2015. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN**

Islamabad, October 22, 2015

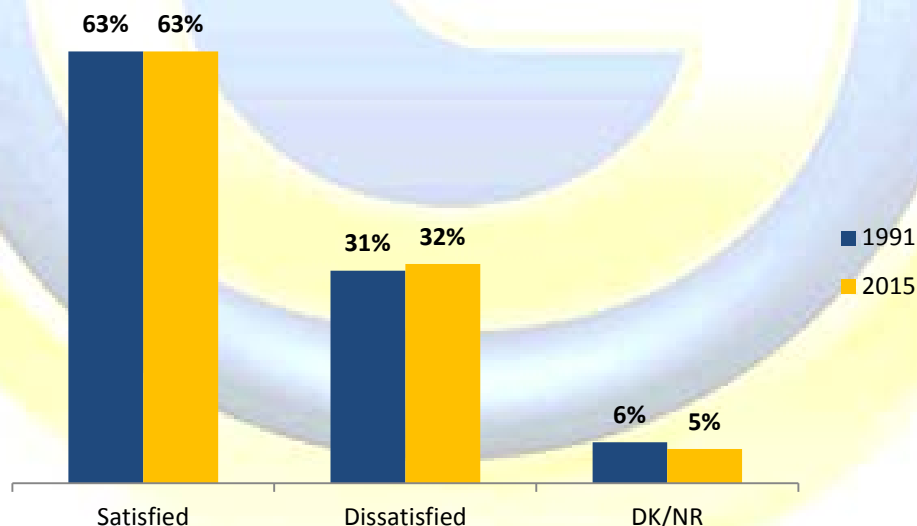
According to a Gallup Pakistan National Survey conducted in the year 1991 (24 years ago), 63% Pakistanis were satisfied with Nawaz Sharif government's efforts at establishing law and order in the country. 31% on the other hand were dissatisfied with the government's efforts, and 5% did not respond.

**Comparative Picture:** The question was asked again in 2015 to enable a concrete comparison. In 2015, 63% respondents said that they are satisfied with the steps being taken by the current government at establishing law and order while 32% claimed to be dissatisfied with the government's efforts. 5% did not respond.

Public perception regarding Nawaz Sharif government's efforts at establishing law and order has generally remained the same over the course of 24 years. Exactly the same percentage of respondents claimed to be satisfied with the government in 1991 and 2015, and only 1% more respondents claimed to be dissatisfied with it in 2015.
