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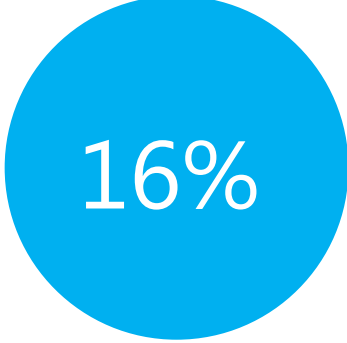

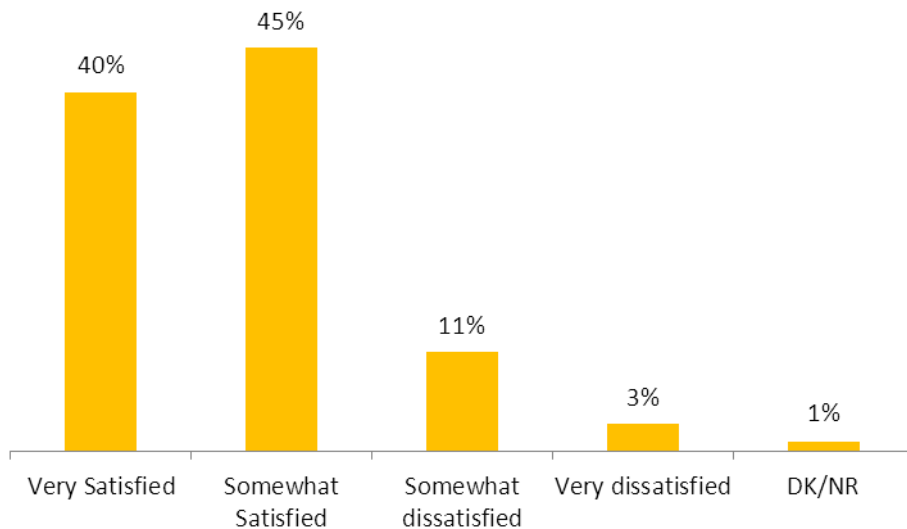

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 85% Pakistanis are satisfied (40% very satisfied and 45% somewhat satisfied) with their current house, residence or place of living.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell us to what extent are you satisfied or dissatisfied with your current house, residence or place of living?” In response to this question, 40% said that they are very satisfied, 45% said that they are somewhat satisfied, 11% said they are somewhat dissatisfied, and 3% said they are very dissatisfied. 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1786 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 05 – October 12, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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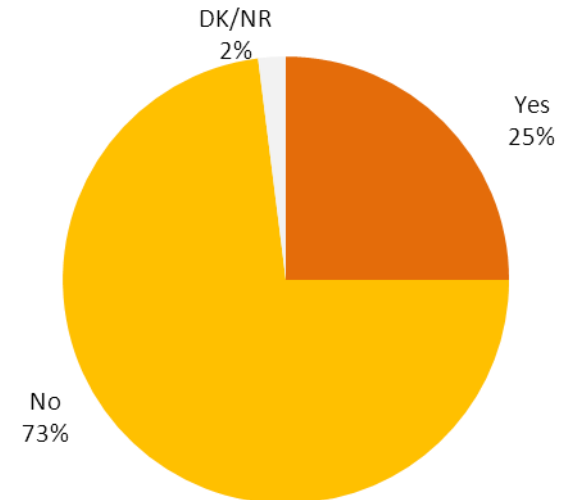

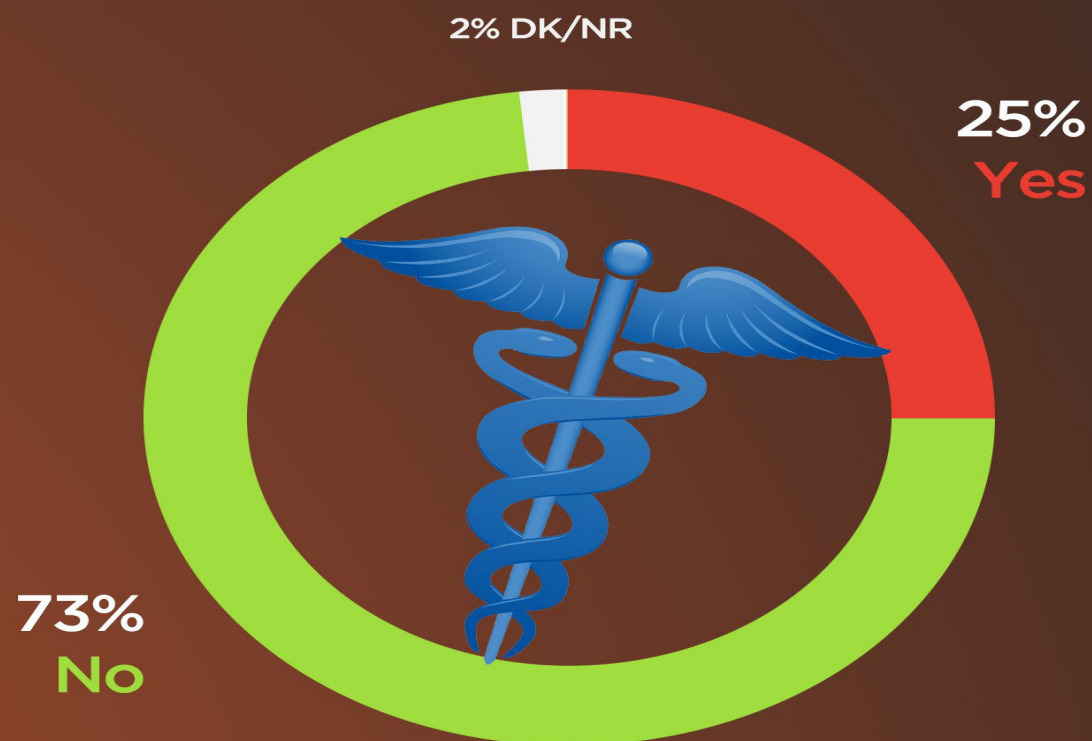

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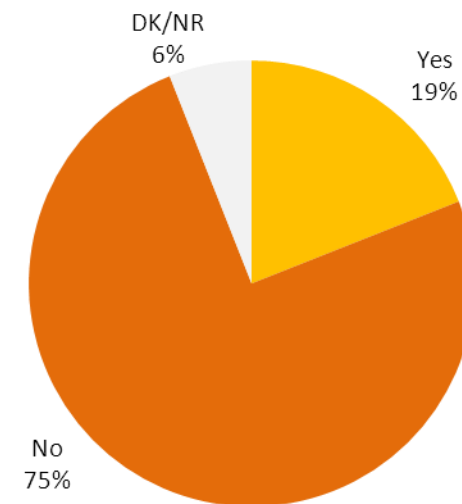
Food Poverty: 19% Pakistanis said that they were not able to purchase grain or food due to shortage of money for themselves or household members sometime in the last 12 months.

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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 19% Pakistanis said that at some point in the last 12 months they were not able to purchase grain or food for themselves or household members.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “With reference to the last 12 months, please tell if there was ever a time when you did not have enough money to cater to the following need: Purchasing grain or providing food for yourself or your household?” In response to this question, 19% said yes while 75% said no. 6% did not respond.

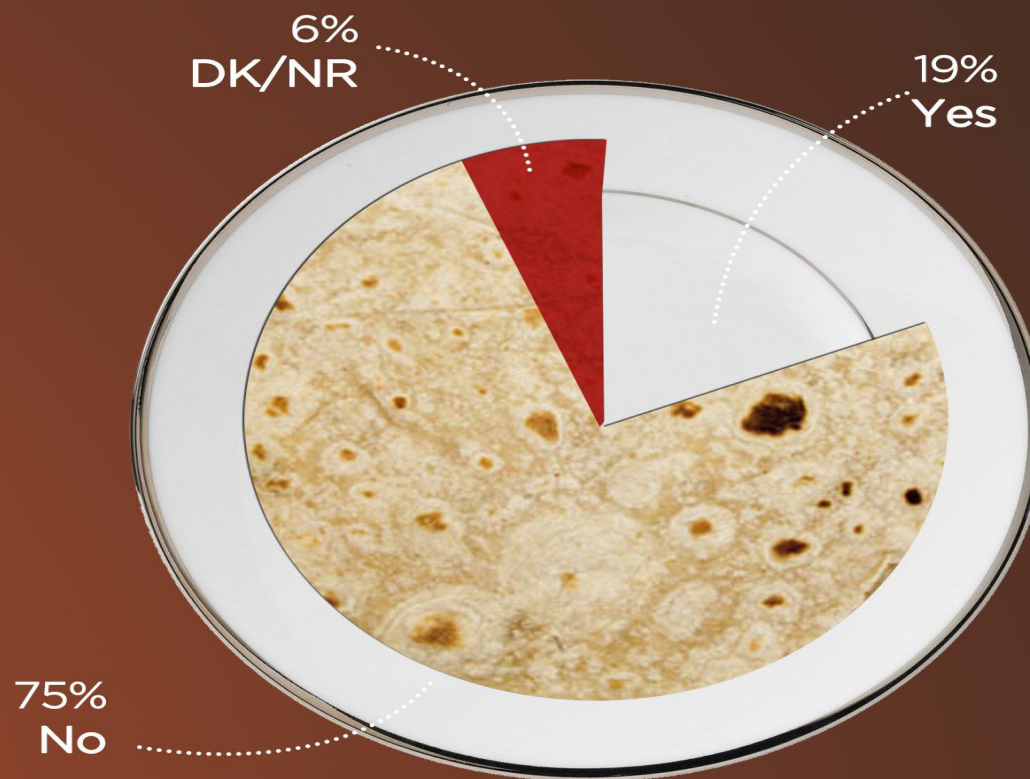

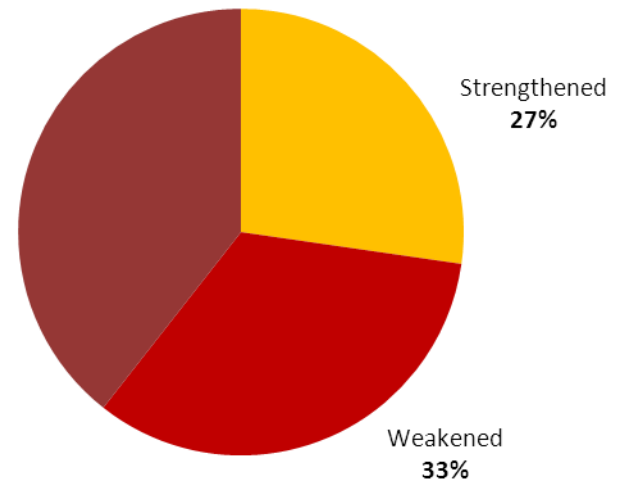

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “With regards to the past 12 months, please tell if you would say that your ties with household members have strengthened, weakened or remained the same as before?” In response to this question, 27% said that their ties have strengthened, 33% said that they have weakened and 40% said that they have remained the same as before.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1786 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 05 – October 12, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

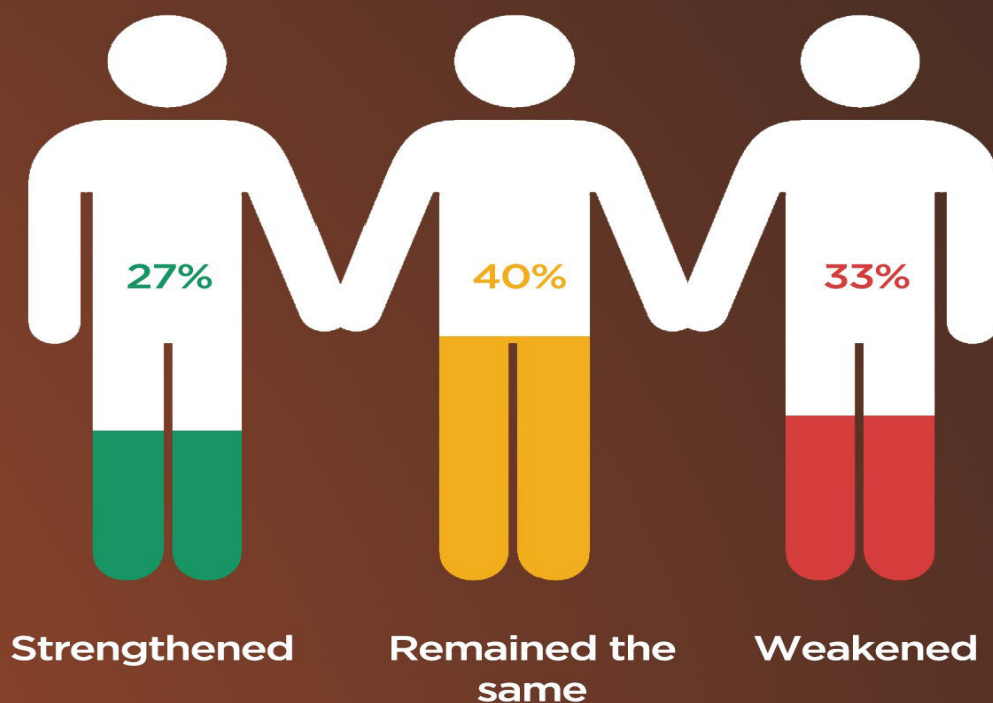

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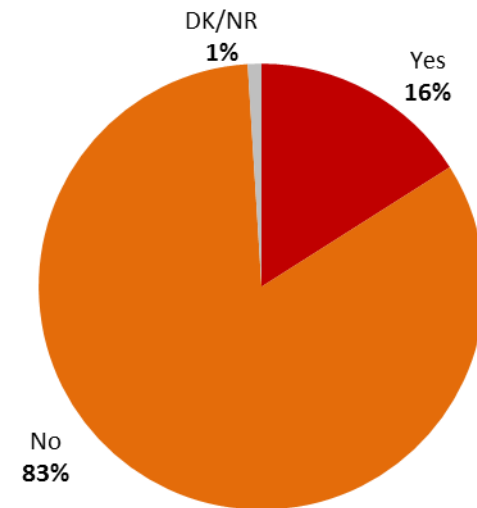

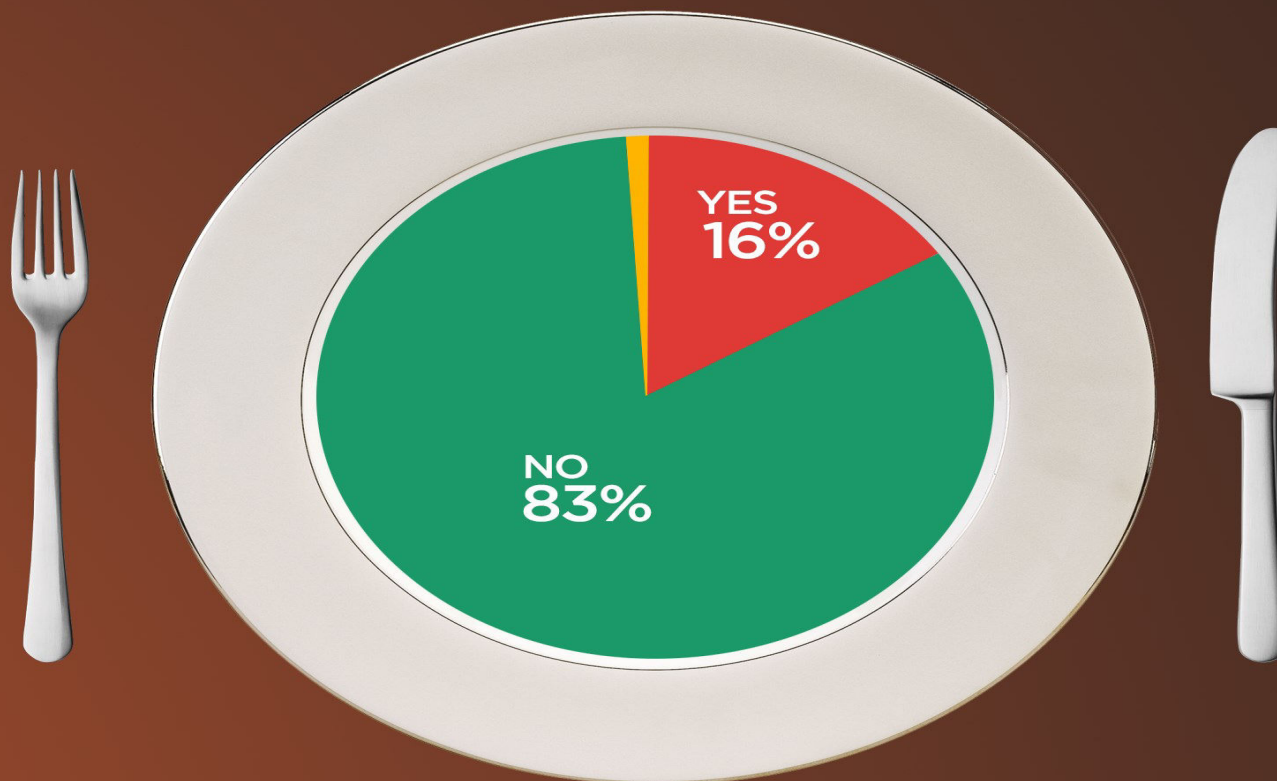
