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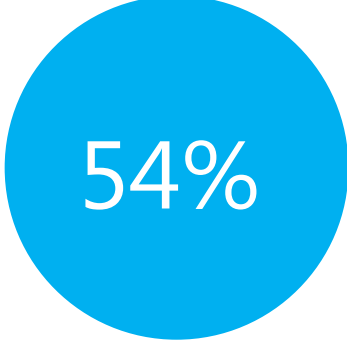

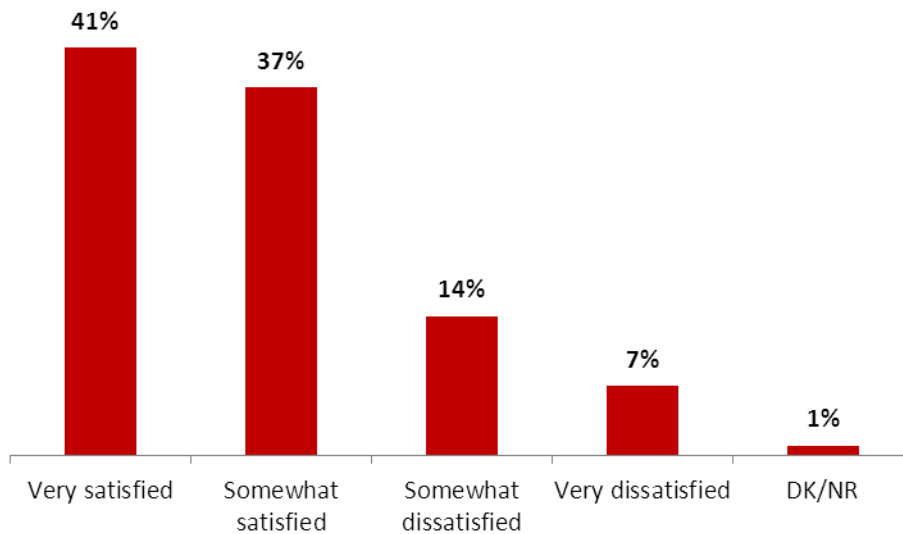

A nationally representative sample of working men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell, to what extent are you satisfied with your current source of employment/job/source of income?” In response to this question, 41% respondents said that they are very satisfied and 37% said they are somewhat satisfied. 14% on the other hand said they are somewhat dissatisfied and 7% said they are very dissatisfied. 1% did not respond.

The questions for this press release series (starting today till 7th December 2015) were picked from Gallup World Poll 2007 from Gallup USA website www.gallup.com. These questions were asked in USA and for comparison results can be accessed at Gallup USA website.

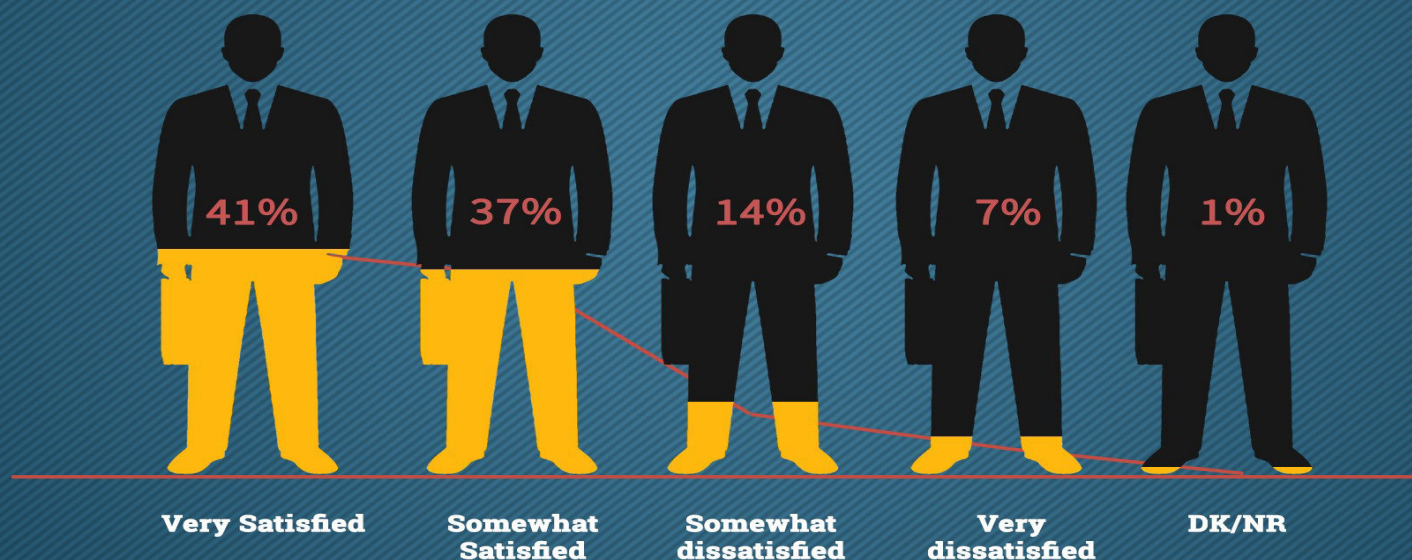

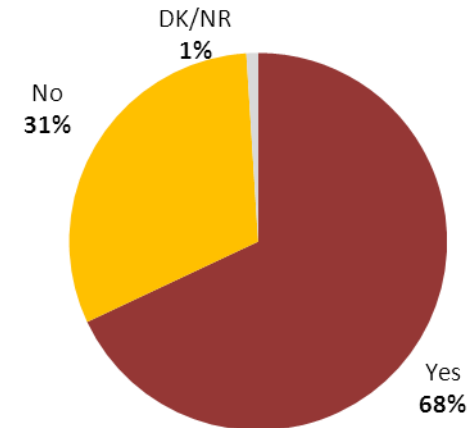

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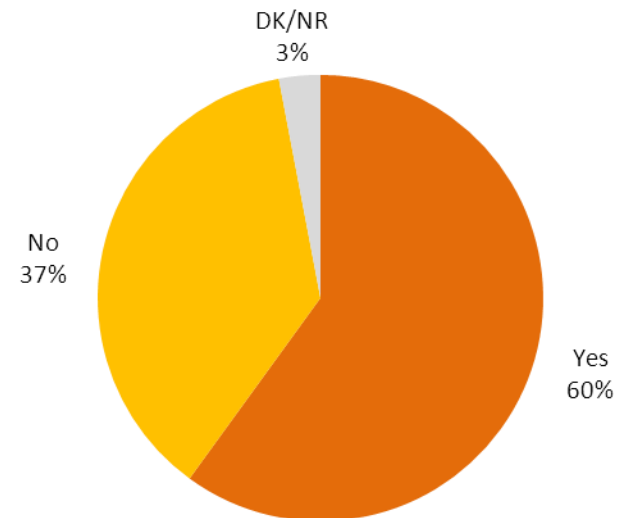

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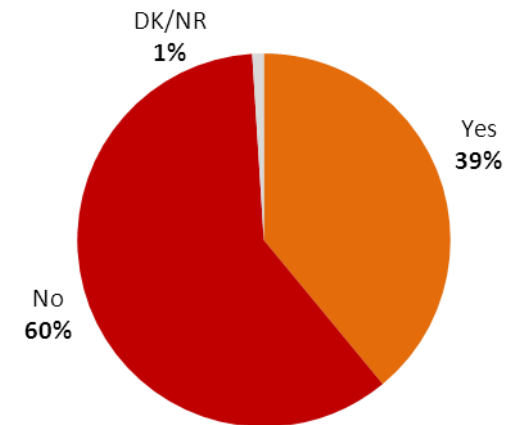

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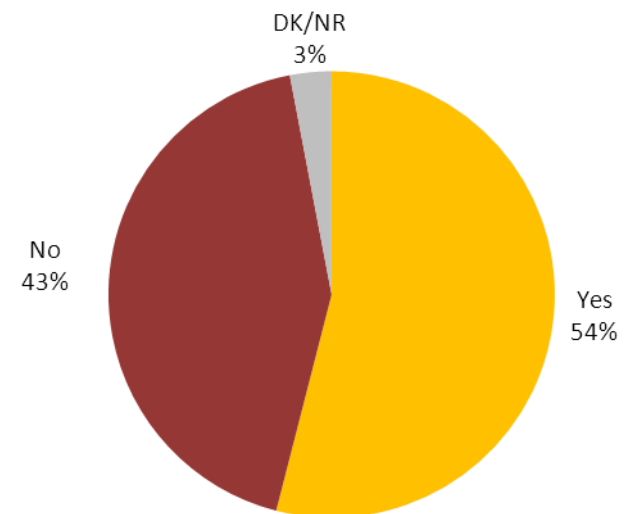
