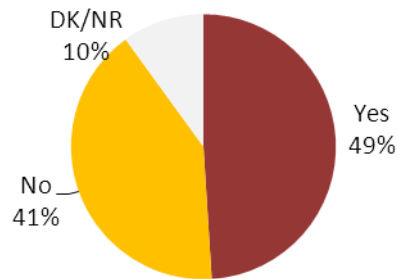

Error margin is estimated to be approximately  $\pm 2-3$  per cent at 95% confidence level.

To what extent do you think that Operation Zarb-e-Azab carried out by Pakistan Army is showing positive or negative results?





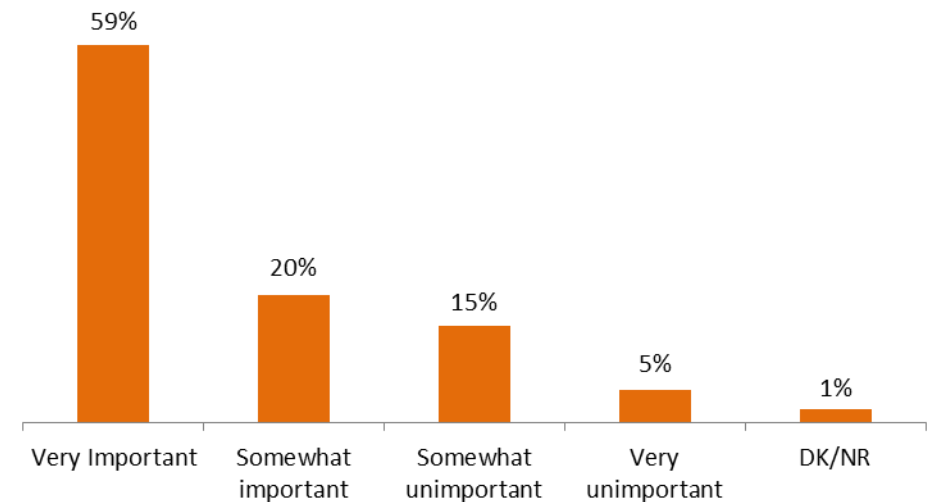

A nationally representative sample of men and women who were aware of Pak-China Economic Corridor were asked, "To what extent do you feel that Pak-China Economic Corridor is important for Pakistan's development?" In response to this question 59% said it is very important, 20% said it is somewhat important, 15% said it is somewhat unimportant and 5% said it is completely unimportant. 1% did not respond.

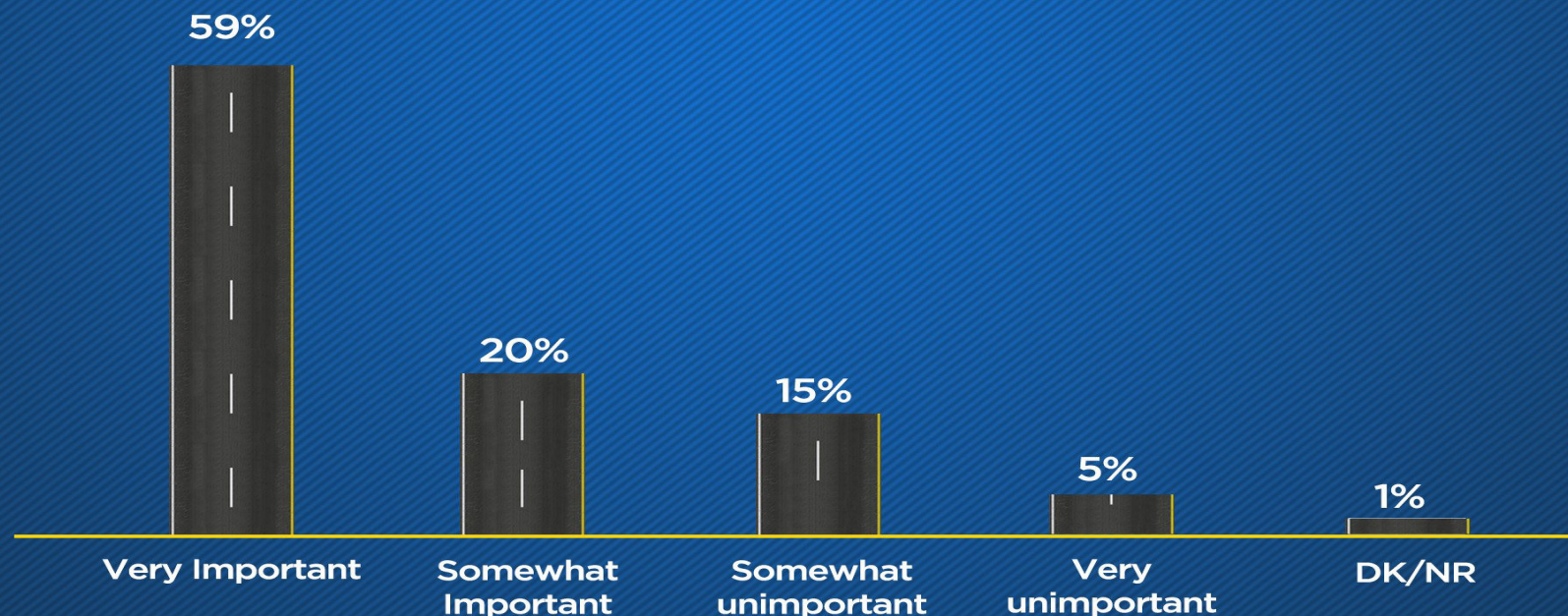
