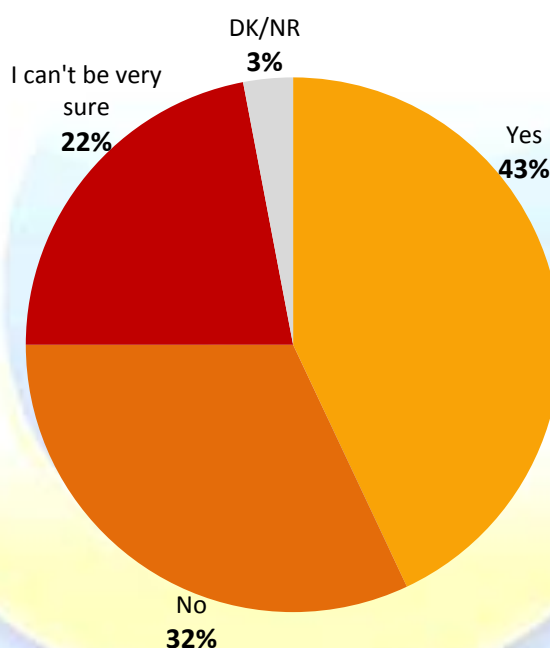
Mixed views among the Pakistani public about the need for foreign aid.

Islamabad, October 1, 2014

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 43% Pakistanis believe that Pakistan needs foreign aid; 32% disagree.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, "Does Pakistan need foreign aid?" In response to this question, 43% Pakistanis said that Pakistan needs foreign aid while 32% said that Pakistan does not need foreign aid and 22% said that they could not be sure. 3% respondents did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2705 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 09 – June 16, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

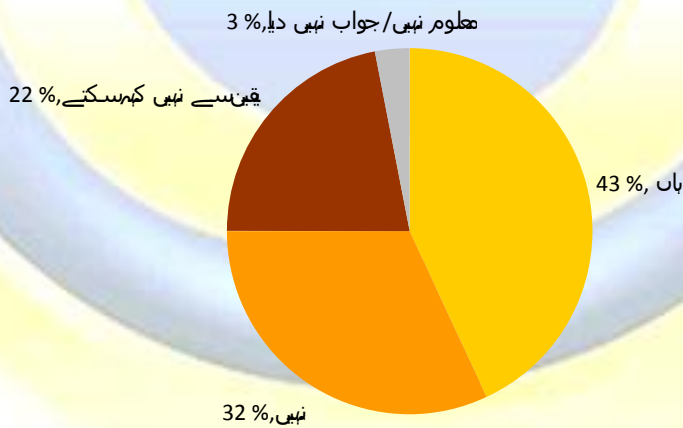
پاکستان کو غیر ملکی امداد کی ضرورت کے حوالے سے پاکستانیوں کی رائے تقسیم شدہ ہے:

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، 43% پاکستانیوں کے مطابق پاکستان کو غیر ملکی امداد کی ضرورت ہے، 32% افراد اس سے غیر متفق ہیں۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شمولیتی طور پر منتخب مرد و خواتین سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "کیا پاکستان کو غیر ملکی امداد کی ضرورت ہے؟"۔ اس سوال کے جواب 43% پاکستانیوں کا کہنا ہے کہ "ہاں" پاکستانیوں کو غیر ملکی امداد کی ضرورت ہے، جبکہ 32% افراد کے مطابق پاکستان کو غیر ملکی امداد کی بالکل بھی ضرورت نہیں ہے، 22% افراد نے بتایا کہ وہ یقین سے کہہ نہیں سکتے کہ پاکستان کو غیر ملکی امداد کی ضرورت ہے یا نہیں، تاہم 3% افراد نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔
