A recent global study released by Vaccine Confidence Group at London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine in its Annual Vaccine Confidence Report 2015 (for which survey expertise was provided by Gallup Pakistan and ORB UK) shows that UK leads the Vaccine Confidence crisis followed by Pakistan among the five countries polled.

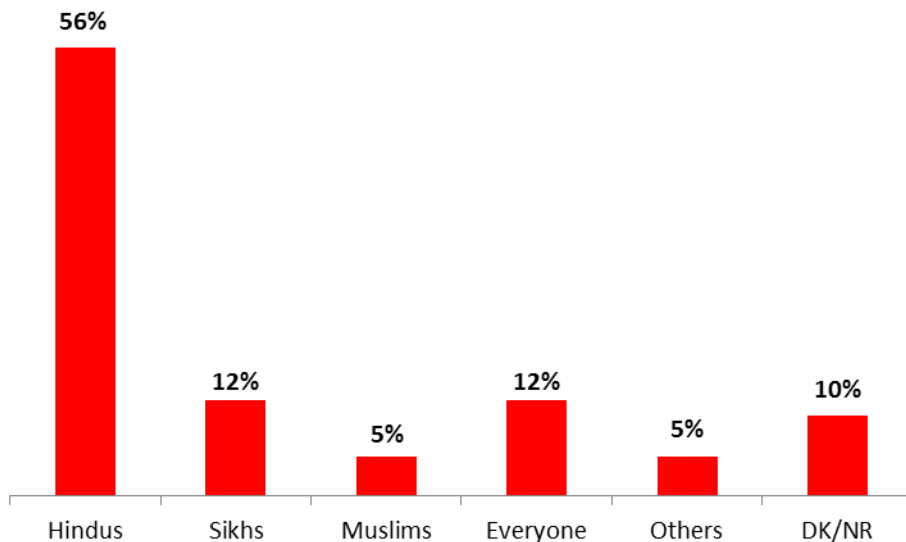


According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 56% Pakistanis believe that during India's partition in 1947, Hindus were the most responsible in causing chaos and conflict.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "In your opinion, who was the most responsible in causing chaos and conflict during partition of India in 1947?" In response to this question 56% responded with Hindus, 12% said Sikhs, 5% said Muslims while 12% said that everyone was responsible. 5% mentioned others and 10% did not respond.

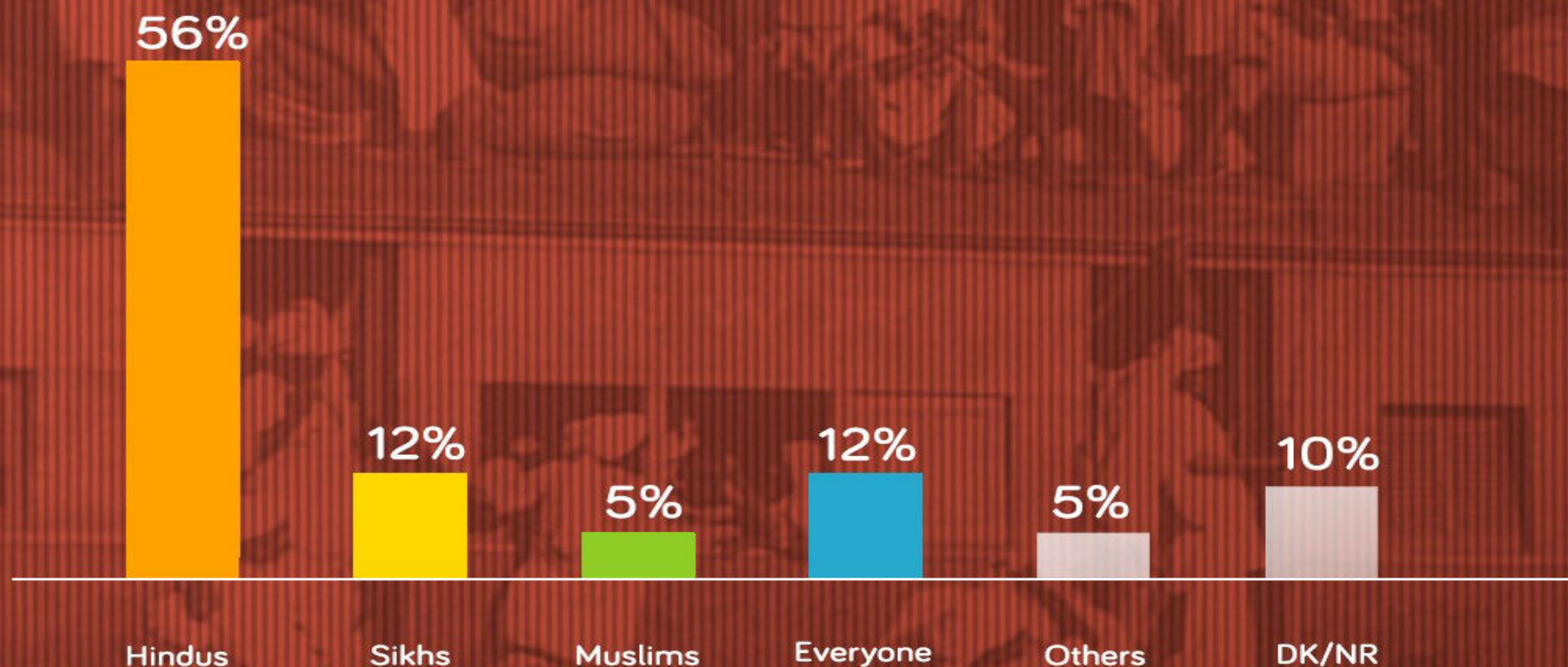
Bilal I. Gilani, Executive Director at Gallup Pakistan adds, "This poll is among a series of polls that Gallup Pakistan plans to do to explore views of Pakistanis regarding partition after 65 years."

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1887 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during November 30 – December 07, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

Partition 1947: Overwhelming majority of Pakistanis (92%) say that they would have voted in favour of Pakistan's creation in 1947.

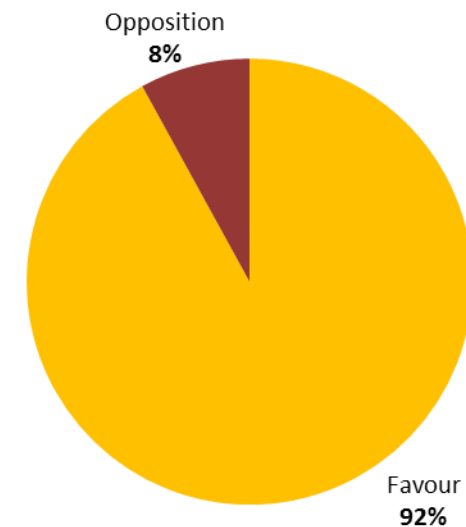
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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, an overwhelming majority of 92% Pakistanis said that they would have voted in favour of Pakistan's creation in 1947.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Suppose if you were a mature adult in 1947 (capable of voting). Would you have voted in favour or in opposition of Pakistan's creation?” In response to this question 92% said they would have voted in favour of Pakistan's creation, 8% said they would have voted in opposition.

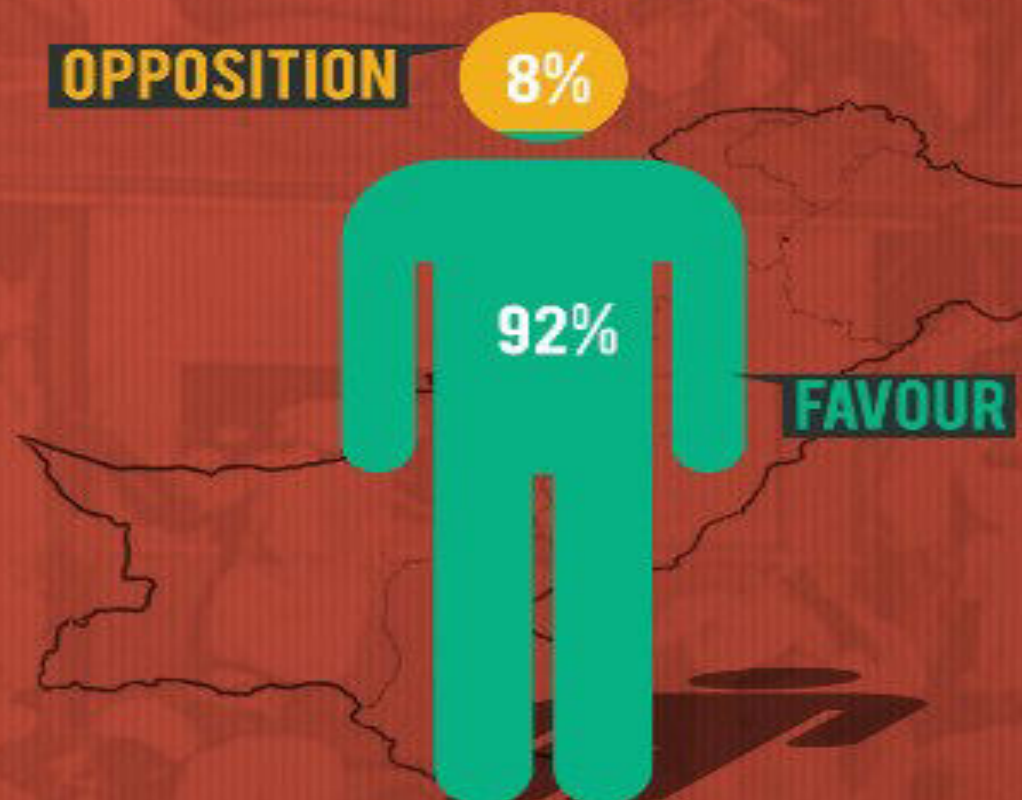

Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.

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Suppose if you were a mature adult in 1947 (capable of voting). Would you have voted in favour or in opposition of Pakistan's creation?



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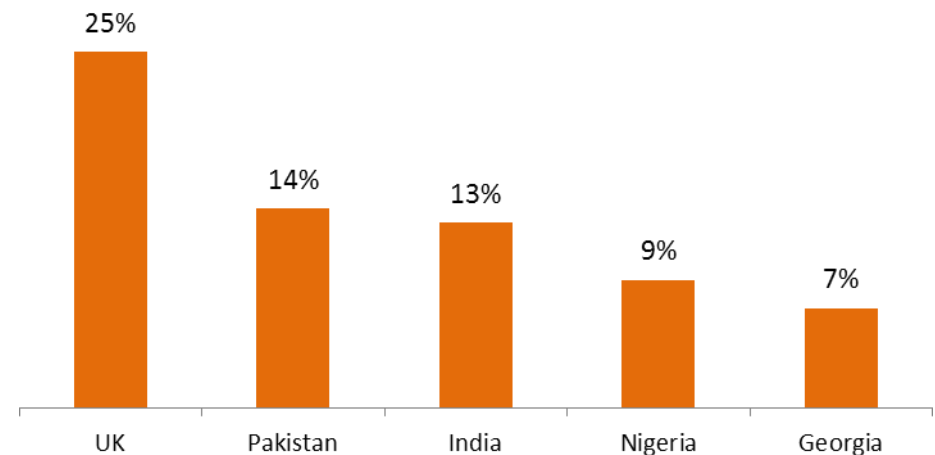
GLOBAL POLL SHOWS LOW CONFIDENCE IN VACCINES: UK leads confidence crisis among the 5 nations that were polled; Pakistan ranks 2nd in Hesitancy.

A recent global study released by Vaccine Confidence Group at London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine in its Annual Vaccine Confidence Report 2015 (for which survey expertise was provided by Gallup Pakistan and ORB UK) reveals that confidence in vaccines, including polio vaccine, is not limited to poor countries of Asia and Africa. In fact the study shows that UK leads the Vaccine Confidence crisis among the five countries polled in this first ever poll of its kind. When asked “Have you ever hesitated/been reluctant to have your youngest child (who is 5 years or under) vaccinated?”, the poll shows UK topped the list with 25% hesitants, followed by Pakistan at 14%, India at 13%, Nigeria at 9% and Georgia at 7%.

The poll was done among a national cross-section of 1000 or more men and women in each of the five countries, and was representative of the parents of young children under 5 years of age.

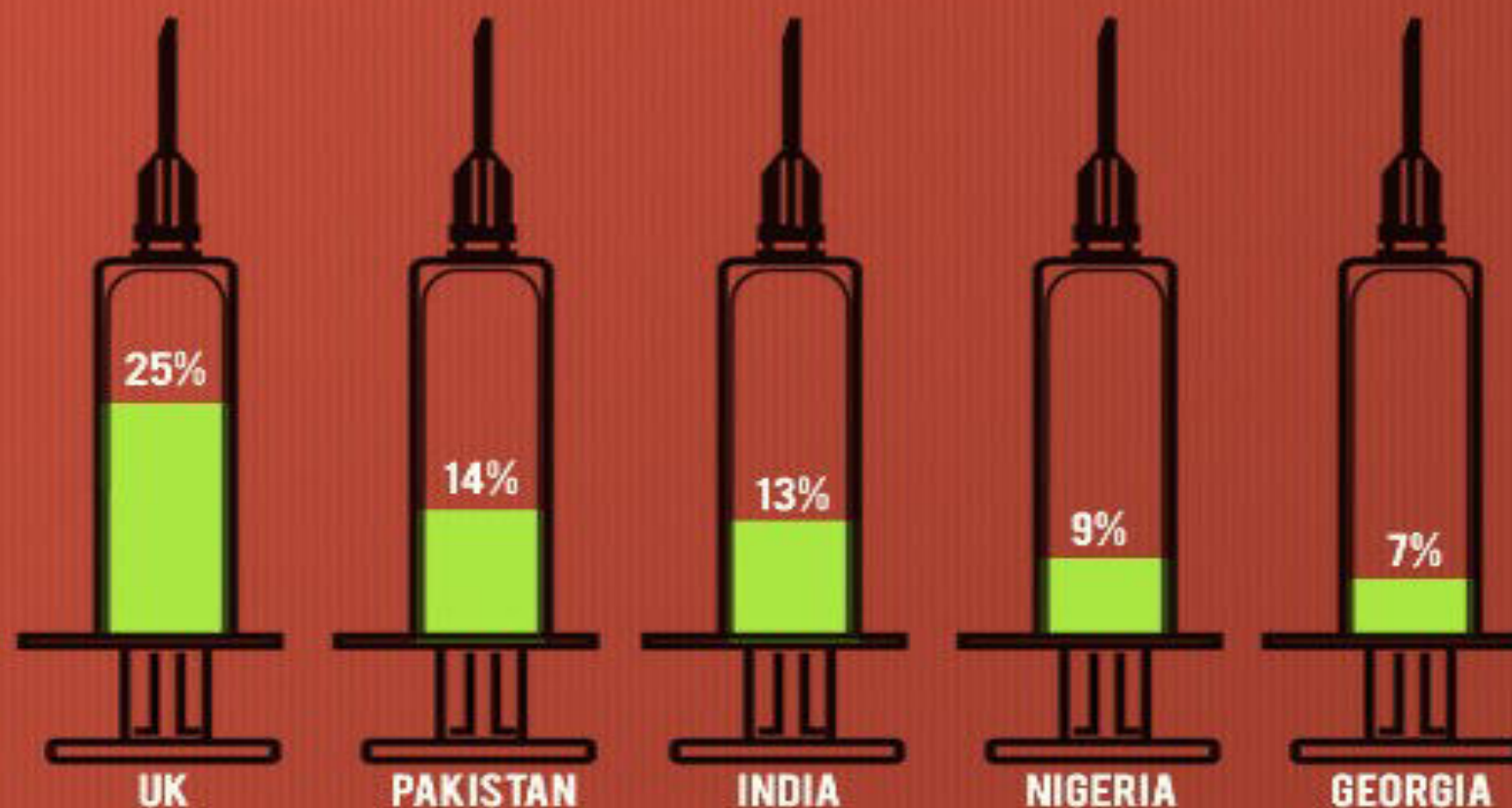
The global study was released by London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1756 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, between 31 March and 7 April 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

Have you ever hesitated/been reluctant to have your youngest child (who is 5 years or under) vaccinated?



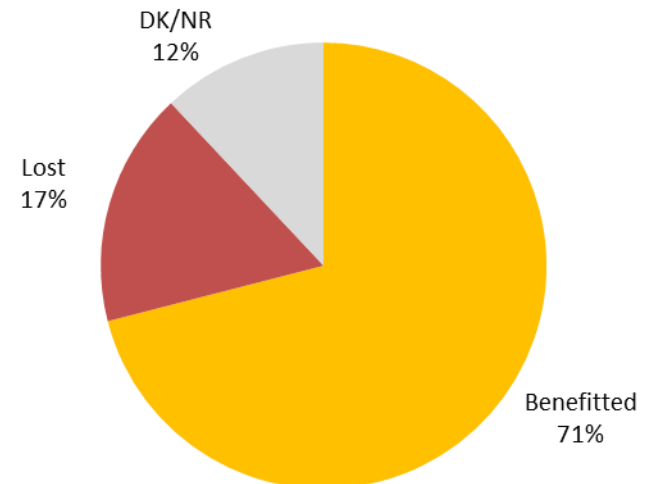

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 71% Pakistanis believe that Muslims living in Pakistan have benefitted as a result of creation of Pakistan.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “According to some people, Muslims have benefitted more from the creation of Pakistan whereas others are of the opinion that Muslims have lost more from this. In your opinion did Muslims benefit more from the creation of Pakistan or did they lose more?” In response to this question, 71% Pakistanis said that Muslims living in Pakistan have benefitted as a result of creation of Pakistan. On the other hand 17% said that Muslims lost and 12% did not respond.

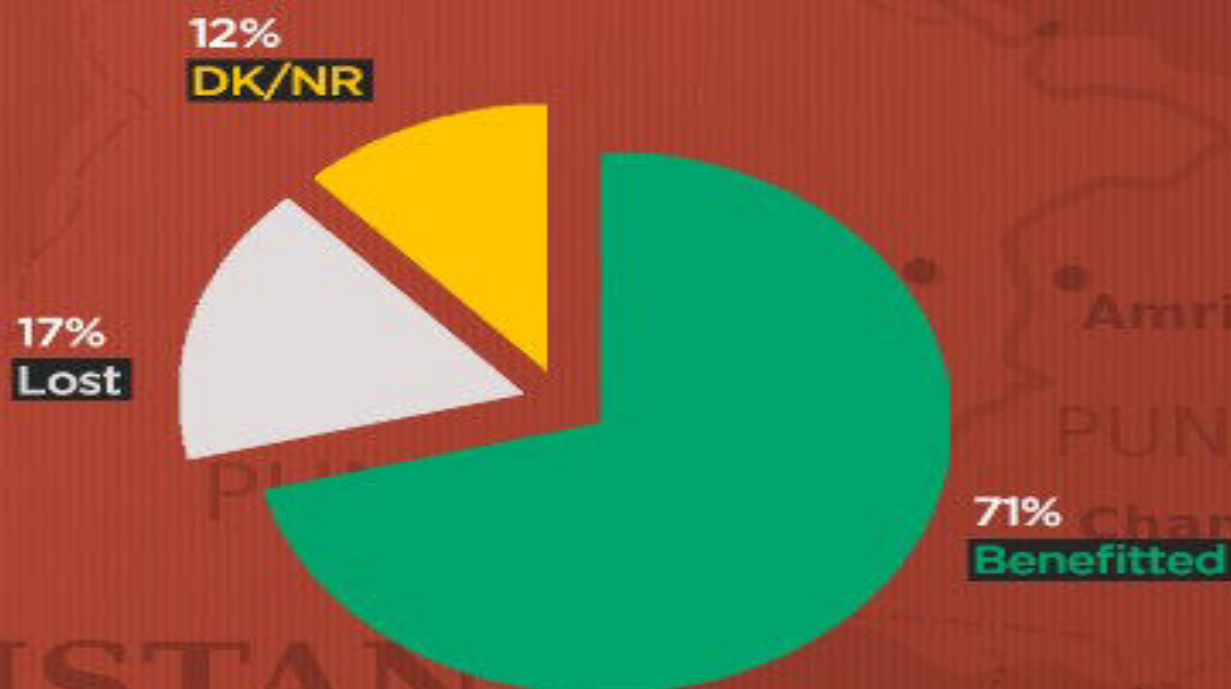

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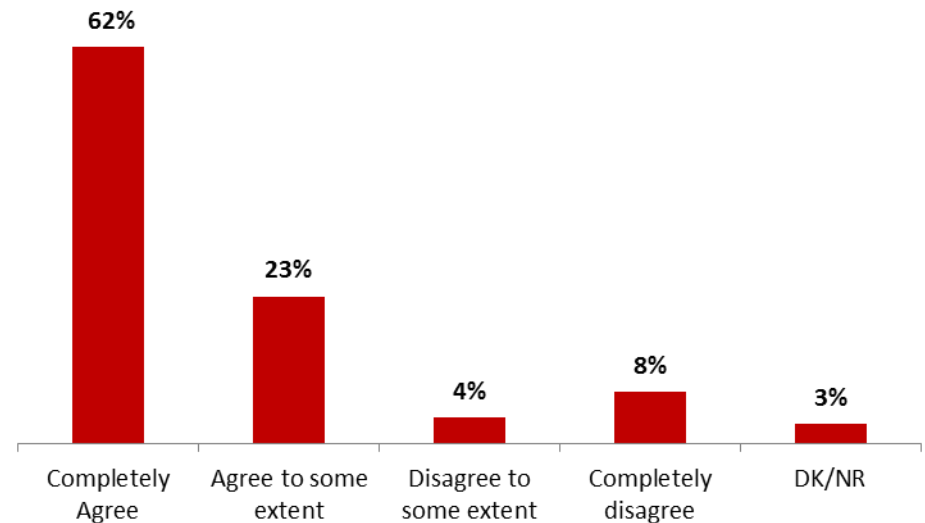

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 85% agree that if Pakistan was not created, Muslims in India would have lived in great difficulty.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement regarding creation of Pakistan: If Pakistan was not created, Muslims in India would have lived in great difficulty?” In response to this question 62% completely agree, 23% agree to some extent, 4% disagree to some extent and 8% disagree. 3% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1756 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 07 – December 14, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
