Perceptions about Summer Rains in Pakistan (Part 2)

This is a 3 part series on popular perceptions about Summer Rains in Pakistan. Part 1 looks into Perceptions on whether Rains are more or less than previous years; Part 2 looks into the possible impact of less than average rains on the Personal economy of Pakistanis. Part 3 looks into perceptions about the root-cause of less than average rains and the extent to which it is explained by long term weather change or a divine admonition.

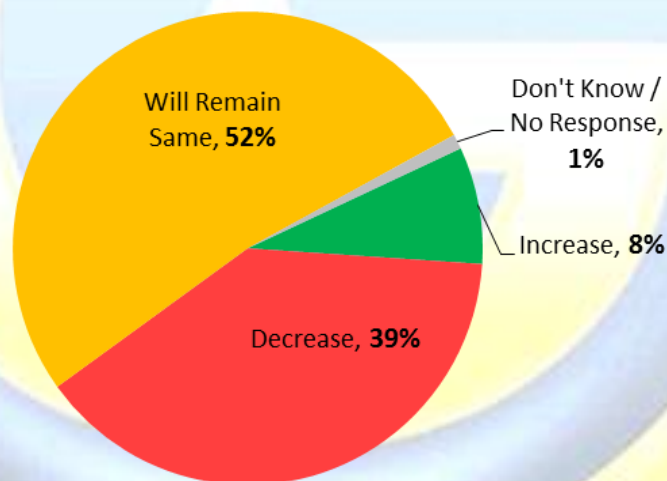
39% of Pakistanis say their personal incomes fall when summer rains are less than usual. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

Islamabad, August 02, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 39% of Pakistanis say their personal incomes fall when summer rains are less than usual.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, will less rainfalls this year make any difference on your personal income?” Responding to this, 8% believe that their income will increase with fewer rainfalls, 39% believe their income will decrease whereas 52% claim that fewer rainfalls will have no effect on their personal income. However, 1% did not give a view.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2689 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 03, 2012 – June 09, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

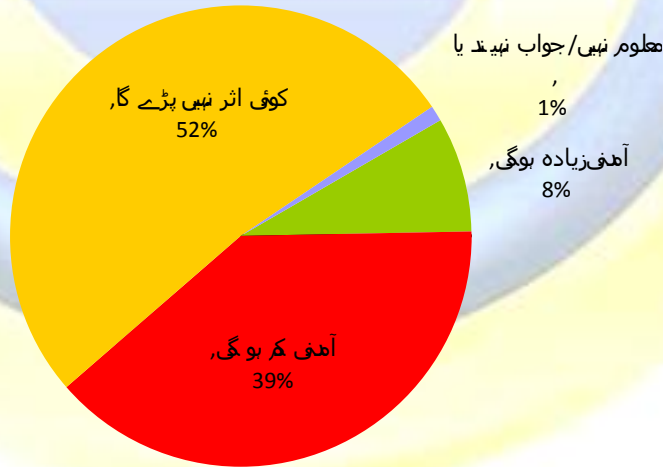

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، 39% پاکستانیوں کے مطابق جب موسم گرما میں بارشیں معمول سے کم ہوتی ہیں تو ان کی ذاتی آمدنی کم ہو جاتی ہے۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شماریاتی طور پر منتخب خواتین و حضرات سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "آپ کے خیال میں بارشیں کم ہونے سے آپ کی ذاتی آمدنی پر کوئی اثر پڑے گا؟"، اس سوال کے جواب میں 8% جوابدہندگان نے کہا کہ کم بارشیں ہونے سے ان کی آمدنی زیادہ ہوگی، 39% افراد کے مطابق ان کی آمدنی کم، جبکہ 52% افراد کے مطابق بارشیں کم ہونے سے ان کی آمدنی پر کوئی اثر نہیں پڑے گا۔ بقیہ 1% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔
