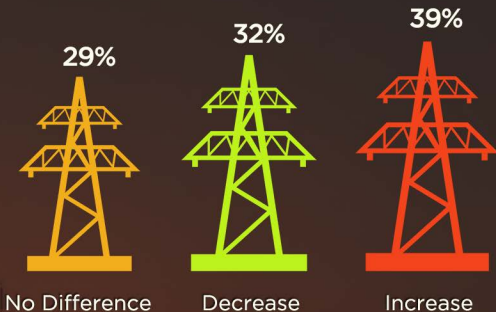


MORE THAN 1/3RD PAKISTANIS BELIEVE THAT ELECTRICITY LOAD SHEDDING HAS INCREASED COMPARED TO LAST YEAR I.E. DECEMBER 2014

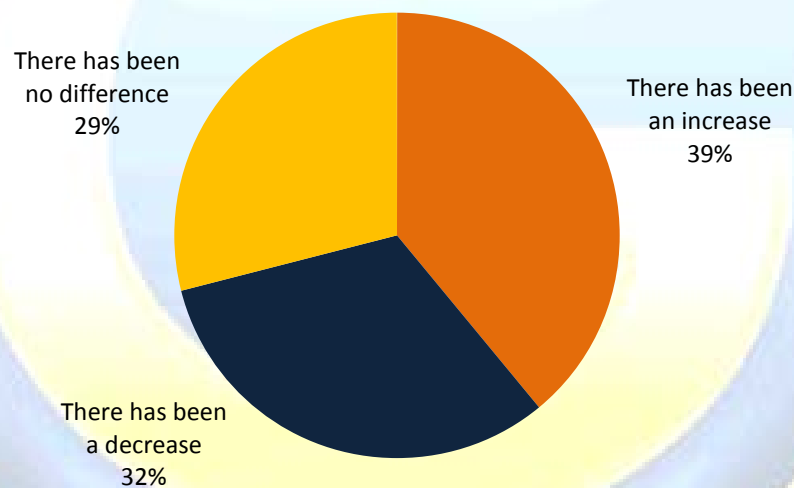
More than 1/3rd Pakistanis believe that electricity load shedding has increased compared to last year i.e. December 2014. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 39% Pakistanis believe that electricity load shedding in their area has increased compared to last year i.e. December 2014.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “With regards to last year i.e. December 2014, has the duration of load shedding in your area increased, decreased or has there been no difference?” In response to this question 39% said that there has been an increase, 32% said that there has been a decrease and 29% said that there has been no difference.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1883 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 04 – January 11, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
