Physical Measurement of Pakistani Men and Women (Part 3)

(self-reported measurements)

This is a 4 part series on physical measurements of Pakistani men and women. **Part 1** provides data on self reported weight of Pakistani men; **part 2** on self reported height of Pakistani men. **Part 3** and **part 4** provide self reported weight and height of Pakistani women.

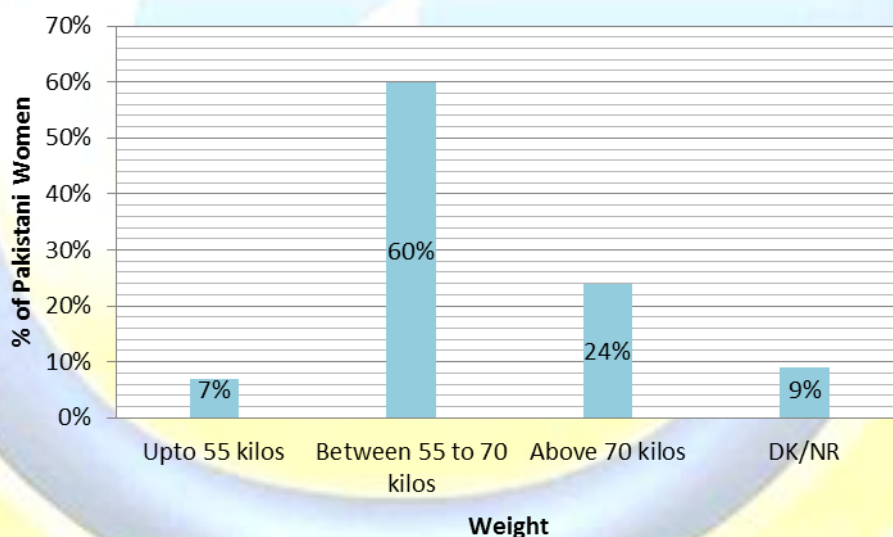
Most Pakistani women (60%) weigh between 55 to 70 kilos, the remaining 31% are heavier (24%) or leaner (7%) than the mainstream. 9% did not give a response. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, most Pakistani women (60%) weigh between 55 to 70 kilos, the remaining 31% are heavier (24%) or leaner (7%) than the mainstream. 9% did not give a response.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “What is your weight?” Responding to this, 60% of women said they weigh between 55 to 70 kilos, 24% said they weigh over 70 kilos and 7% said they weigh up to 55 kilos. However, 9% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1282 women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 09, 2012 – September 15, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

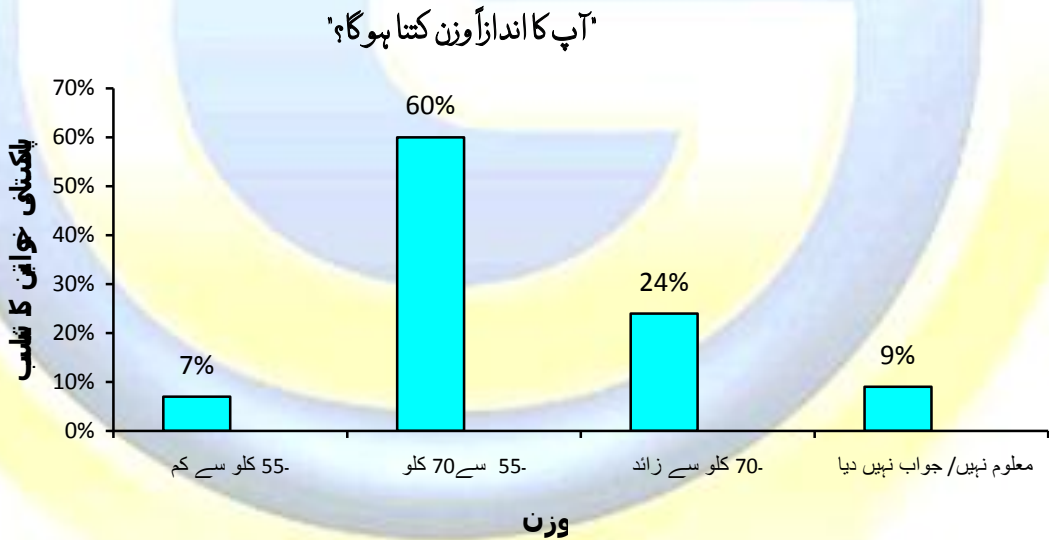

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، زیادہ تر پاکستانی خواتین (60%) کا وزن 55 سے 70 کلو کے درمیان ہے۔ بقایا 31% کا وزن اس سے زیادہ (24%) یا کم (7%) ہے۔ 9% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شماریاتی طور پر منتخب خواتین حضرات سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "آپ کا اندازاً وزن کتنا ہوگا؟"، اس سوال کے جواب میں 60% خواتین نے بتایا کہ ان کا وزن 55 سے 70 کلو کے درمیان ہے، 24% خواتین کے مطابق ان کا وزن 70 کلو سے زائد، جبکہ 7% کے مطابق ان کا وزن 55 کلو سے بھی کم ہے۔ بقایا 9% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔
