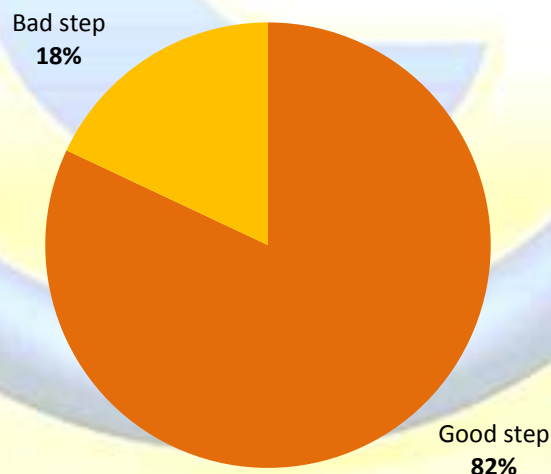
A substantial majority of Pakistanis (82%) said that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Pakistan was a good step that will improve relations between India and Pakistan. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 82% Pakistanis believe that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Pakistan was a good step that will improve relations between both countries.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who had heard or read about Prime Minister Narendra Modi's sudden visit to Pakistan was asked, "Some people are of the view that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Pakistan is good news that will improve relations between both countries while others are of the view that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi should not have visited Pakistan. What is your opinion regarding this matter, did the Indian Prime Minister take a good or a bad step by visiting Pakistan?" In response to this question 82% said that it was a good step and 18% said that it was a bad step.

Question: "Some people are of the view that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Pakistan is good news that will improve relations between both countries while others are of the view that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi should not have visited Pakistan. What is your opinion regarding this matter, did the Indian Prime Minister take a good or a bad step by visiting Pakistan?"

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1211 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 04 – January 11, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
