



Opinion Poll **SOCIAL BEHAVIOR** **Religious Practices in Pakistan (Part 4)**

*This is a **5 part series** on **5 aspects** of religious practice in Pakistan. **Part 1** deals with claims about attending Friday prayers at a local mosque; **Part 2** deals with attending annual congregation/festival (Urs) at a Sufi shrine; **Part 3** deals with participation in religious education (Tabligh) by listening to someone who visited your home for this purpose (Dawaa); **Part 4** deals with participation in religious education (Tabligh) by participating in a group which went to other people's homes for this purpose (Dawaa). **Part 5** deals with source of Guidance on religious matters, that is, the person who influences you most on religious matters.*

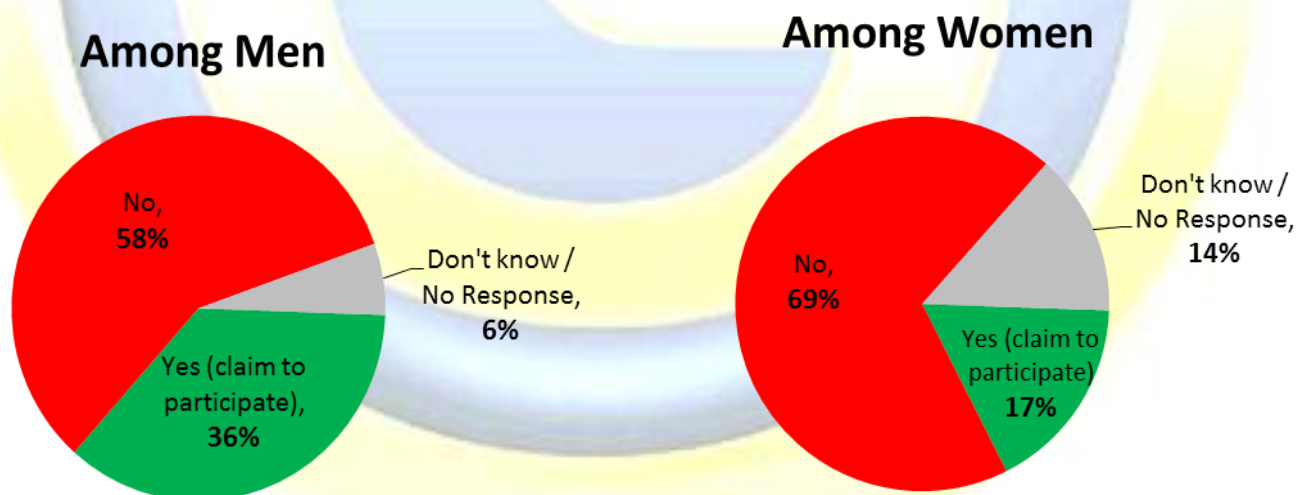
36% of Men and 17% of Pakistani Women say they participated in bringing religious education (Dawaa) to others during the last one year. **GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN**

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 36% of Men and 17% of Pakistani Women say they participated in bringing religious education (Dawaa) to others during the last one year.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "Did you participate in any delegation to spread religious knowledge to others in the last one year?" Responding to this, 36% of men claim that they participated in a delegation to spread religious knowledge to others, 58% claim that they did not participate whereas 6% did not give a view. However, 17% of women claim that they participated in bringing religious knowledge in the last one year, 69% claim they did not participate in any such activity whereas 14% did not give a view.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2697 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 15 - April 21, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.

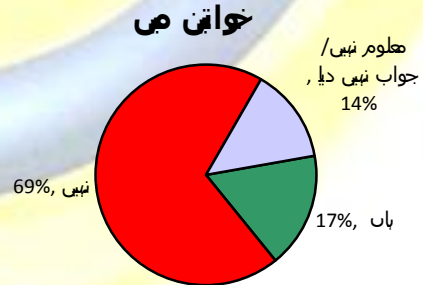
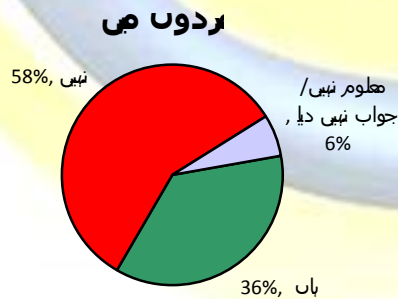

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، 36% پاکستانی مرد حضرات اور 17% خواتین کے مطابق انہوں نے گزشتہ ایک برس میں مذہبی تعلیمات کی تبلیغ میں شرکت کی ہے۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شماریاتی طور پر منتخب خواتین و حضرات سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "کیا آپ نے گزشتہ ایک سال میں کسی وفد کے ساتھ مذہبی تعلیمات کی تبلیغ میں شرکت کی؟"، اس سوال کے جواب میں 36% مرد حضرات کے مطابق انہوں نے کسی وفد کے ساتھ مذہبی تعلیمات کی تبلیغ میں شرکت کی۔ 58% کے مطابق انہوں نے ایسی کسی سرگرمی میں حصہ نہیں لیا، جبکہ 6% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔ تاہم 17% خواتین کے مطابق انہوں نے مذہبی تعلیمات کے فروغ کے لیے گزشتہ برس کسی وفد کے ساتھ شرکت کی، جبکہ 69% خواتین کے مطابق انہوں نے ایسی کسی سرگرمی میں حصہ نہیں لیا۔ بقایا 14% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔

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گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کا حالیہ سروے گیلپ انٹرنیشنل سے منسلک گیلپ پاکستان کی مدد سے کیا گیا۔ یہ سروے پاکستان کے چاروں صوبوں کی دیہی اور شہری آبادی کے 2697 مرد اور خواتین سے 15 اپریل تا 21 اپریل 2012 میں منعقد ہوا۔ غلطی کے امکان کا تخمینہ شماریاتی طور پر تقریباً $\pm 2-3\%$ لگایا گیا ہے۔
