MOST IMPORTANT PROBLEM LADDER at Personal, Local & National Level (part 2)

*This is a **3 part** series on Perceived Problems at Personal, Local and national level. **Part 1** deals with the problems which a Pakistani citizen feels most acutely at a **Personal Level**; **Part 2** deals with problems perceived at a **Local** (neighborhood) level and **part 3** deals with problems perceived at a **National** level. In each case a list of problems mentioned most often in open ended surveys was provided on a round card and the respondents chose one out of the list which they considered most acute.*

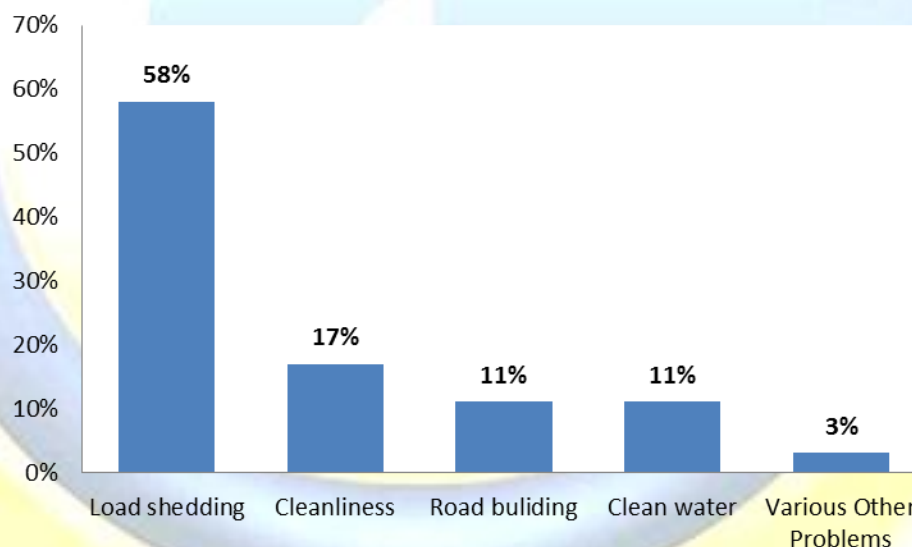
58% of Pakistanis see Electricity Shortages (load shedding) as the most important local problem: GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

Islamabad, February 24, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan 58% of Pakistanis see Electricity Shortages (load shedding) as the most important local problem.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Kindly tell, what is the most important problem in your neighborhood at the moment?” Responding to this 58% claim that load shedding is the most important problem of their neighborhood, 17% believe cleanliness to be the most important, 11% term road building and 11% claim that clean water is the most important problem. While 3% claim various problems to be the most important problems of their neighborhood.

Question: “Kindly tell, which of the following is the most important problem in your neighborhood at the moment?”

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2695 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 12 – February 18, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.

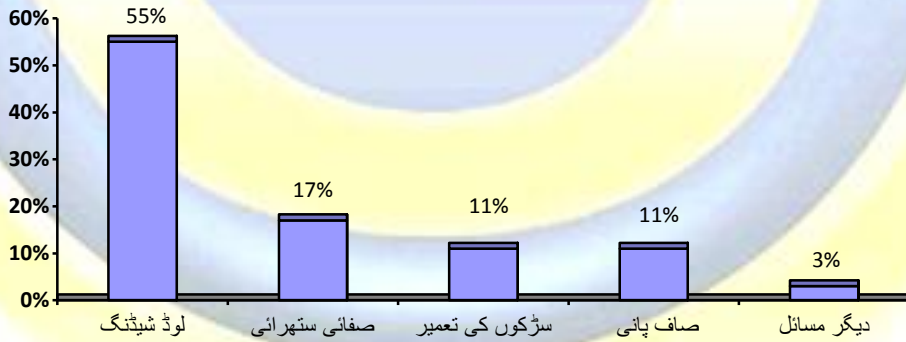

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، 58% پاکستانیوں کے مطابق بجلی کا بحران (لوڈ شیڈنگ) ان کے علاقے کا سب سے اہم مسئلہ ہے۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شریاتی طور پر منتخب خواتین و حضرات سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "آپ کے خیال میں اس وقت آپ کے علاقے کا سب سے بڑا مسئلہ کونسا ہے؟" اس سوال کے جواب میں 58% افراد کے مطابق لوڈ شیڈنگ ان کے علاقے کا سب سے بڑا مسئلہ ہے، 17% کے خیال میں صفائی ستھرائی، 11% کے مطابق سڑکوں کی تعمیر اور 11% کے مطابق صاف پانی ان کے علاقے کا سب سے بڑا مسئلہ ہے، جبکہ 3% کے مطابق ان کے علاقے کو دیگر مسائل درپیش ہیں۔

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کا حالیہ سروے گیلپ انٹرنیشنل سے منسلک گیلپ پاکستان کی مدد سے کیا گیا۔ یہ سروے پاکستان کے چاروں صوبوں کی دیہی اور شہری آبادی کے 2695 مرد اور خواتین سے 12 فروری تا 18 فروری 2012 میں منعقد ہوا۔ غلطی کے امکان کا تخمینہ شماریاتی طور پر تقریباً $\pm 2-3\%$ لگایا گیا ہے۔
