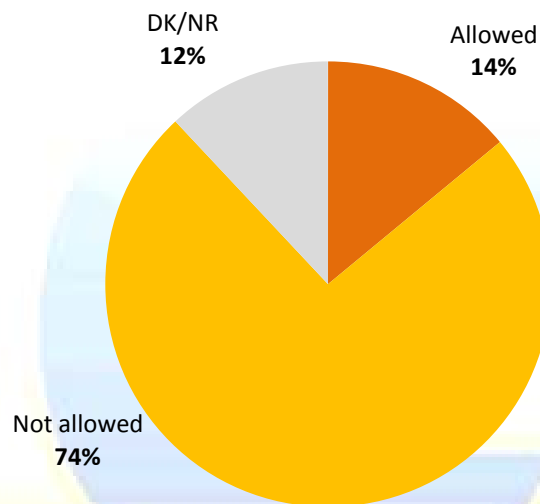
Majority Pakistanis (74 %) believe that Islam does not allow men to wear silk. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 74% Pakistanis believe that Islam does not allow men to wear silk.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “According to your knowledge, does Islam allow men to wear silk?” In response to this question 14% said that it is allowed, 74% said that it is not allowed and 12% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1849 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 11 – January 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
