Women's Rights (Part 5)

This is a **5** part series on popular views about women's rights and their status in Pakistan. In **part 1**, we discuss perceptions of Pakistanis about in which society are women respected more; **part 2** seeks nation-wide views on whether a woman can become head of state, **part 3** seeks views on whether there is equal treatment of men and women in Pakistan, **part 4** seeks opinions on whether women should be involved in Land and Property related issues and if they are involved in them usually, and **part 5** asks whether women in Pakistan get their rightful claims on inheritance as prescribed in Islam.

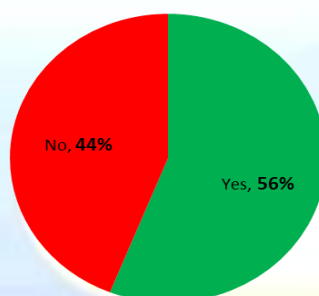
56% of Pakistanis think women get their rightful claims on inheritance as prescribed in Islam. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

Islamabad, November 27, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 56% of Pakistanis think women get their rightful claims on inheritance as prescribed in Islam.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "In your opinion, do women in your household or relatives households get their claims on inheritance as prescribed in Islam?" Responding to this, 56% said yes and 44% said no.

Question: "In your opinion, do women in your household or relatives households get their claims on inheritance as prescribed in Islam?"

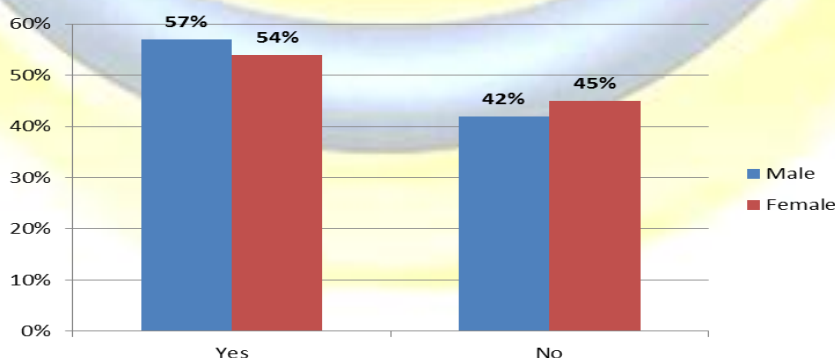

There is not much difference in the views of men and women on this issue as shown by the chart below.

COMPARATIVE DATA FOR MEN AND WOMEN



The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2673 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 28, 2012 – November 02, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

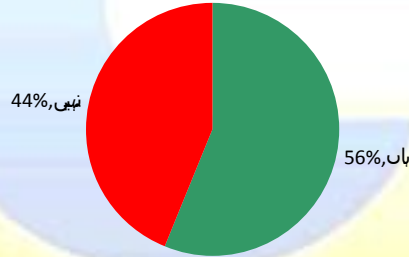

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، 56% پاکستانیوں کے مطابق خواتین کو وراثت میں ان کا شرعی حق ملتا ہے جیسا کہ اسلام میں متعین ہے۔

سروے میں ملک بھر سے شماریاتی طور پر منتخب مرد و خواتین سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "آپ کے خیال میں آپ کے اپنے یا قریبی جاننے والے گھرانوں میں خواتین کو وراثت میں ان کا شرعی حق دیا جاتا ہے یا نہیں؟"، اس سوال کے جواب میں 56% جوابدہندگان نے کہا "ہاں" خواتین کو وراثت میں ان کا شرعی حق ملتا ہے اور 44% نے کہا "نہیں" خواتین کو وراثت میں ان کا شرعی حق نہیں ملتا۔

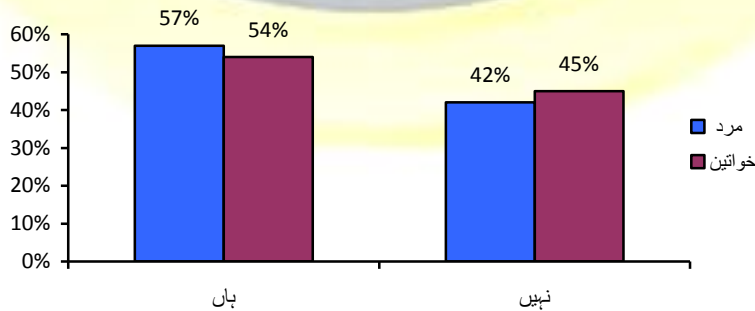
