Views about 'Lottery' in Pakistan (Part 1)

*This is a 2 part series on views about lottery in Pakistan. **Part 1** measures the proportion of people who have ever bought any lottery ticket; **part 2** seeks views on the propriety of lottery for financial gains, and whether it is permissible for Muslims.*

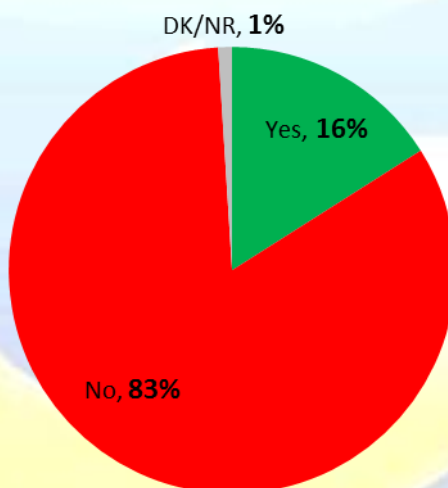
Only 16% of Pakistanis say they have ever purchased a lottery ticket. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

Islamabad, October 30, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, only 16% of Pakistanis say they have ever purchased a lottery ticket.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "Have you or anyone in your household had the opportunity to buy a lottery ticket?" Responding to this, 16% said yes and 83% said no. However, 1% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2674 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 07, 2012 – October 13, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

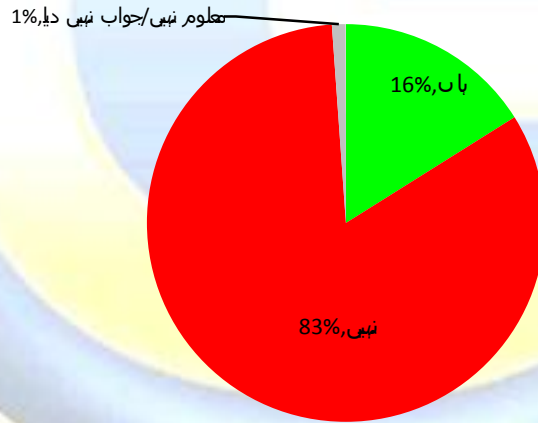

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کے ایک حالیہ سروے کے مطابق، صرف 16% پاکستانیوں کا کہنا ہے کہ انھیں لاٹری کا ٹکٹ خریدنے کا موقع ملا ہے۔ سروے میں ملک بھر سے شاریاتی طور پر منتخب خواتین و حضرات سے یہ سوال پوچھا گیا کہ، "کیا آپ یا آپ کے گھر کے کسی فرد کو لاٹری کا ٹکٹ خریدنے کا موقع ملا ہے؟"، اس سوال کے جواب میں 16% نے "ہاں" میں جواب دیا اور 83% نے "نہیں" میں جواب دیا، جبکہ 1% نے کسی رائے کا اظہار نہیں کیا۔

گیلانی ریسرچ فاؤنڈیشن کا حالیہ سروے گیلپ انٹرنیشنل سے منسلک گیلپ پاکستان کی مدد سے کیا گیا۔ یہ سروے پاکستان کے چاروں صوبوں کی دیہی اور شہری آبادی کے 2674 مرد اور خواتین سے 7 اکتوبر تا 13 اکتوبر 2011 میں منعقد ہوا۔ غلطی کے امکان کا تخمینہ شاریاتی طور پر تقریباً $\pm 2-3\%$ لگایا گیا ہے۔
