Pakistani Youth

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, on the eve of this year's UN International Youth Day, a majority of Pakistanis (62%) say that the Pakistani youth ranks amongst the most talented in the world.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "The UN's International Youth Day is being celebrated this August 12th 2013. On this occasion, we'd like to ask if you are amongst those who believe that the Pakistani youth ranks amongst the most talented in the world, capable of successfully competing at the international level in a variety of fields or among those disagree with this statement." Responding to this, 62% said they believed the Pakistani youth ranked amongst the most capable world over, whereas 28% said they disagreed with this viewpoint. 10% chose not to respond.

Question: "The UN's International Youth Day is being celebrated this August 12th 2013. On this occasion, we'd like to ask if you are amongst those who believe that the Pakistani youth ranks amongst the most talented in the world, capable of successfully competing at the international level in a variety of fields or among those disagree with this statement."

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2533 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 30, 2013 – August 05, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
