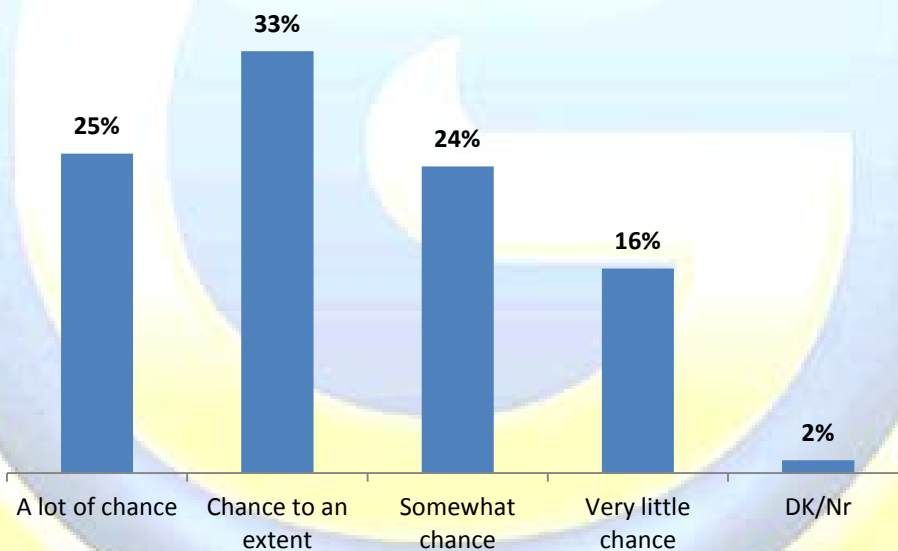

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 82% Pakistanis say that there is ‘somewhat’ to ‘a lot of chance’ that peace and harmony will be restored in Afghanistan within the next 6 months.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, what are the chances that within the next 6 months, peace and harmony will be restored in Afghanistan?” In response to this question 25% said that there is a lot of chance, 33% said that there are chances to an extent while 24% said that there is a somewhat chance and 16% said there is very little chance. 2% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1849 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 11 – January 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
