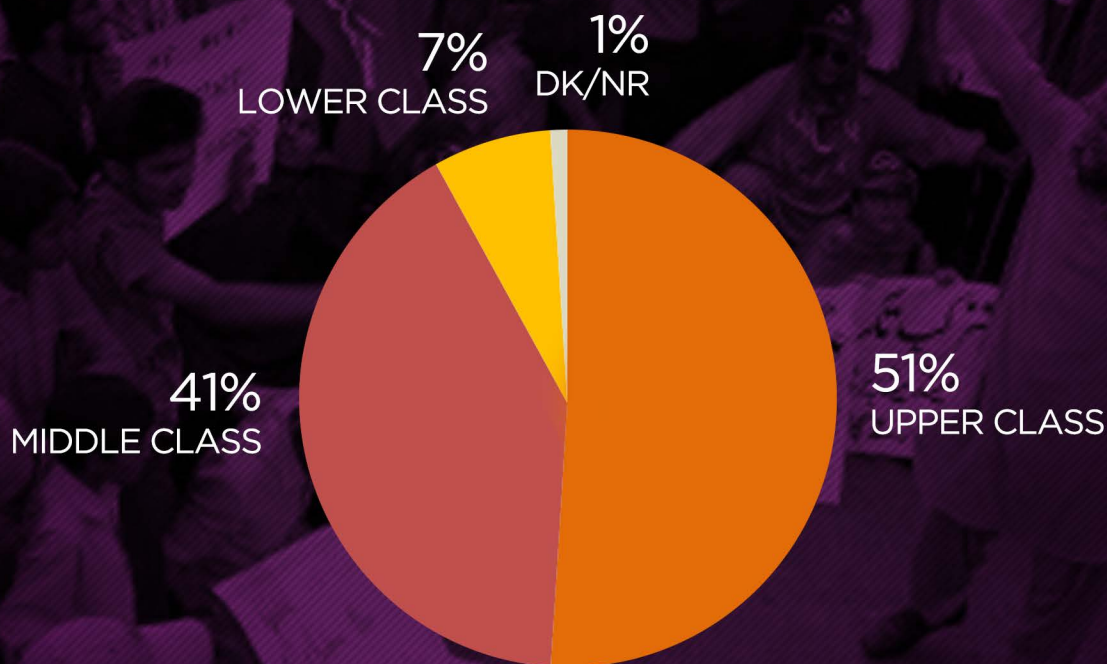

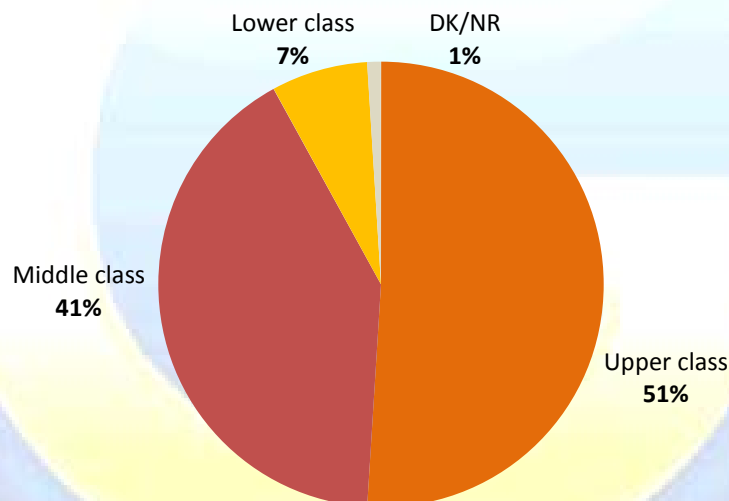
51 % Pakistanis believe that from a social and financial point of view, the MNA from their area belongs to the upper class. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 51% respondents say that the MNA from their area belongs to the upper class.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who were aware of the party affiliation of their local MNA was asked, “Please tell, from an economic and social point of view, which class does the MNA in your area belong to? As in upper class, middle class or lower class?” In response to this question, 51% said that their MNA belongs to upper class, 41% said that their MNA belongs to middle class and 7% said that their MNA belongs to lower class. 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1781 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 18 – January 25, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
