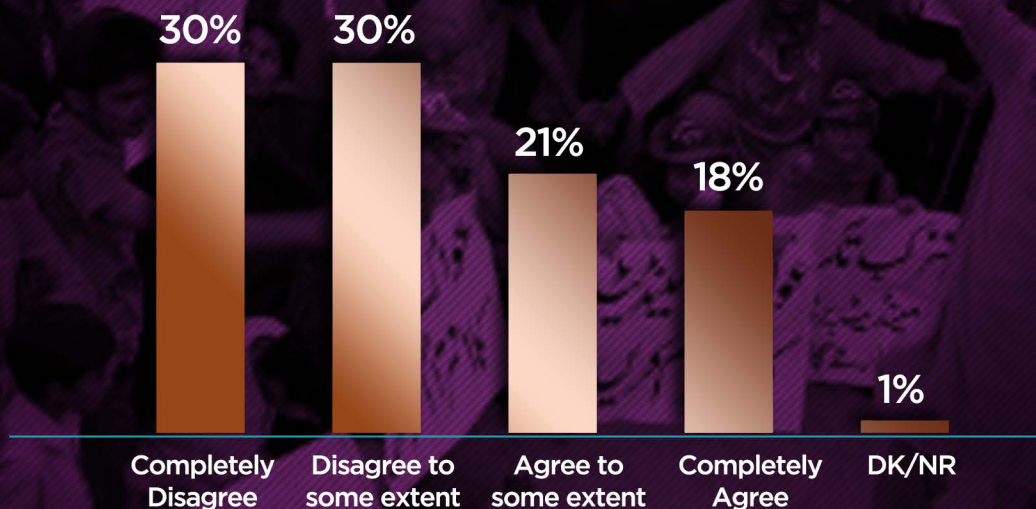

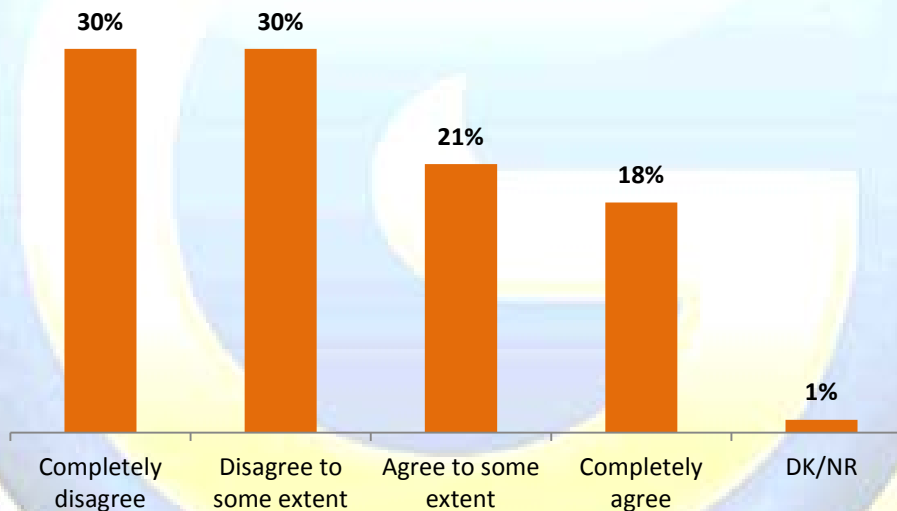
Majority Pakistanis (60%) believe that going to cast one's vote in Pakistan is not a difficult task. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 60% Pakistanis disagree with the statement that going to cast vote is a difficult task.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who were aware of the party affiliation of their local MNA was asked, "To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Casting one's vote or going to cast the vote is a very difficult task." In response to this question, 30% respondents completely disagreed, 30% disagreed to some extent while 21% said that they agreed to some extent and 18% said that they completely agreed. 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1850 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 18 – January 25, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
