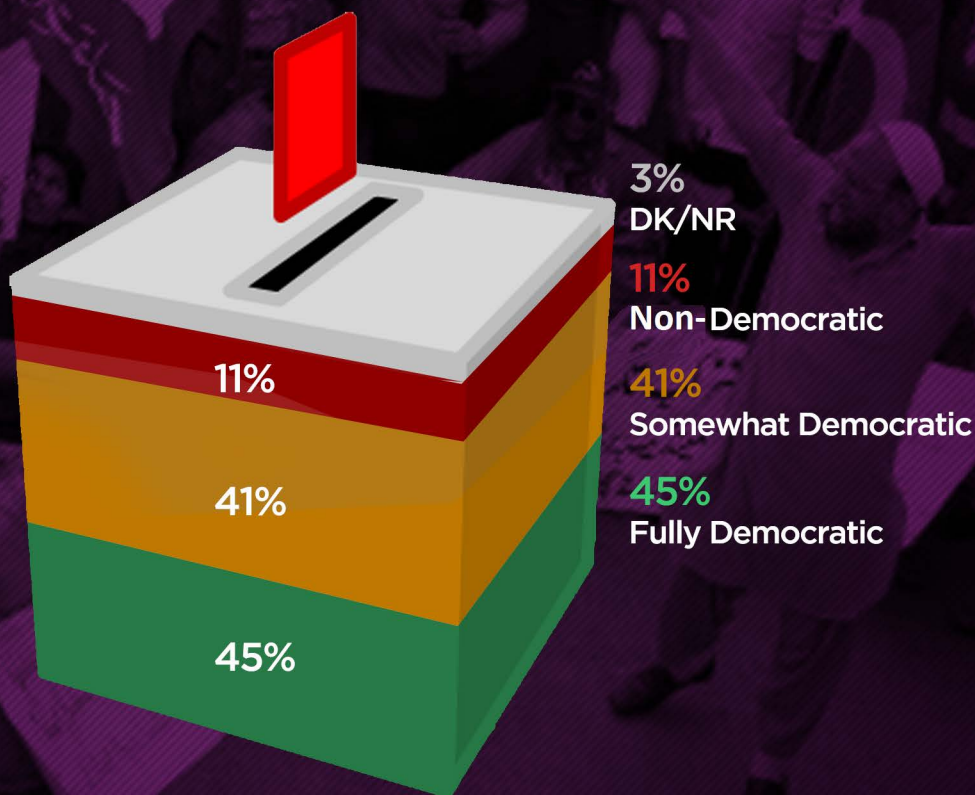


NEAR MAJORITY PAKISTANIS OPINE THAT THE CURRENT SYSTEM OF GOVERNANCE IN PAKISTAN IS FULLY DEMOCRATIC.

Opinion Poll Politics Democracy

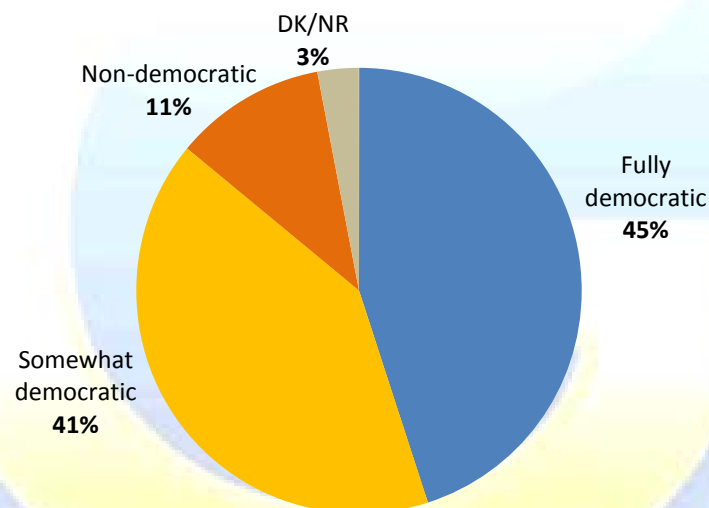
Majority Pakistanis (86 %) opine that the current system of governance in Pakistan is democratic. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, March 22, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 86% Pakistanis believe that the system of governance in Pakistan is democratic; 45% opine that it is fully democratic while 41% say that it is somewhat democratic.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, is the system of governance in Pakistan somewhat democratic, fully democratic or non-democratic?” In response to this question, 45% said that it is fully democratic, 41% said that it is somewhat democratic and 11% said that it is non-democratic. 3% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1850 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 18 – January 25, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
