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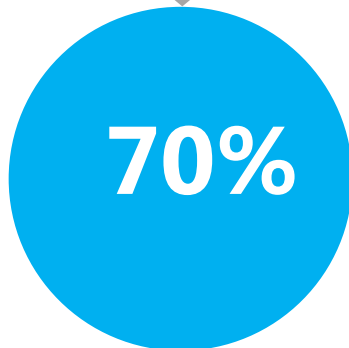

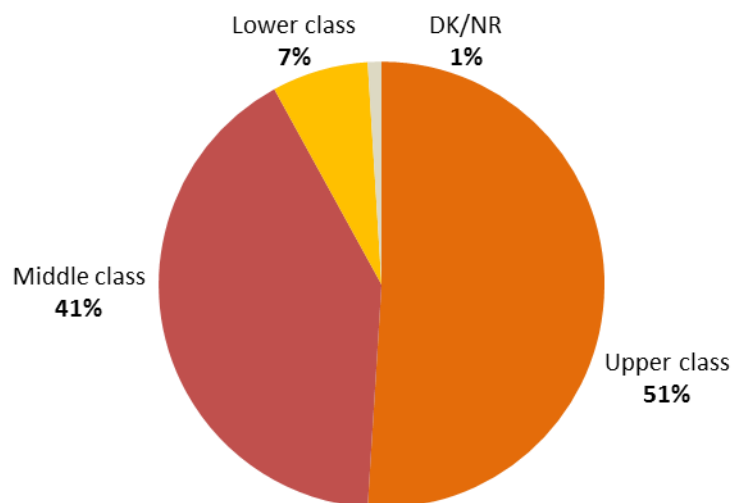

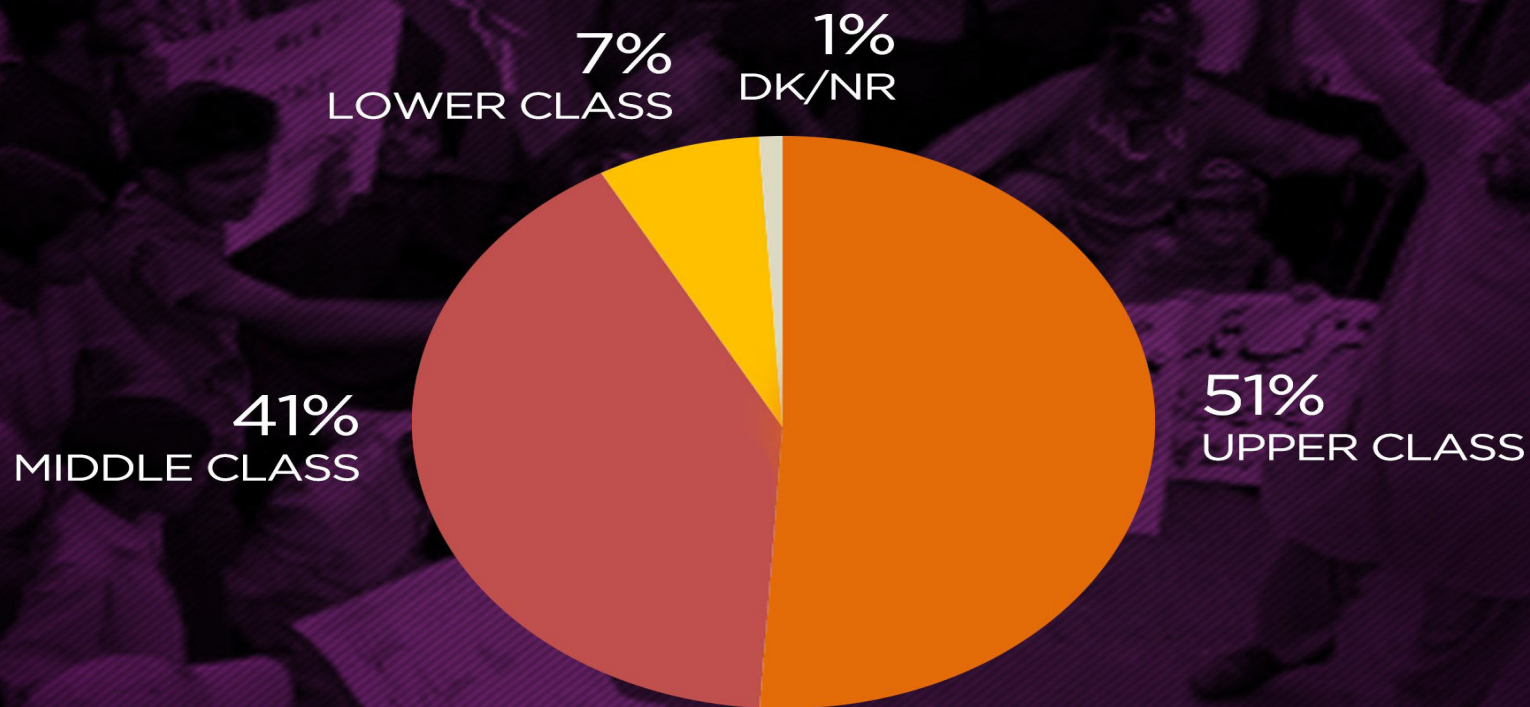
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 51% respondents say that the MNA from their area belongs to the upper class.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who were aware of the party affiliation of their local MNA was asked, “Please tell, from an economic and social point of view, which class does the MNA in your area belong to? As in upper class, middle class or lower class?” In response to this question, 51% said that their MNA belongs to upper class, 41% said that their MNA belongs to middle class and 7% said that their MNA belongs to lower class. 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1781 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 18 – January 25, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

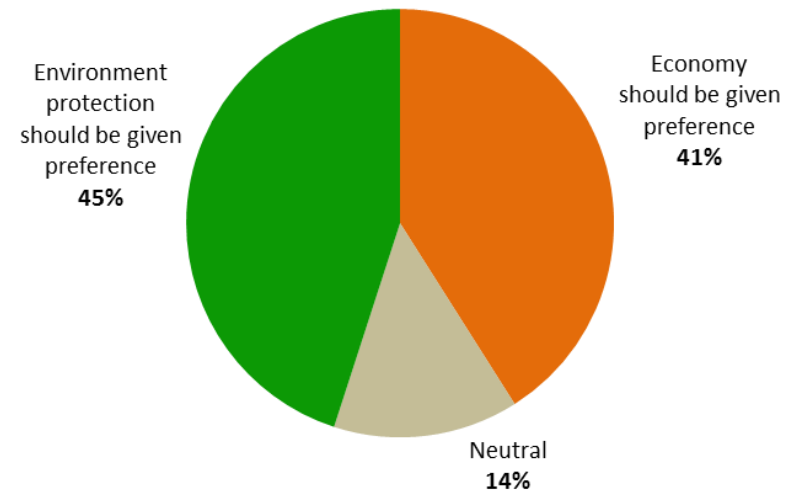

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 45% Pakistanis believe that environment protection should be given preference over economic considerations; 41% believe that the economy should be given preference over environmental considerations.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people are of the opinion that environment protection should be given most priority even if at the expense of its cost to the economy. Others are of the opinion that economy should be given preference even if it does not protect the environment. On a scale of 1 to 10, please give your personal opinion where 0 refers to 'Economy should be given preference' and 10 refers to 'Environment protection should be given preference'?" In response to this question, 41% rated between 0 and 4 while 45% rated between 6 and 10. 14% on the other hand, were neutral and gave a median rating of 5.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1850 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 18 – January 25, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level

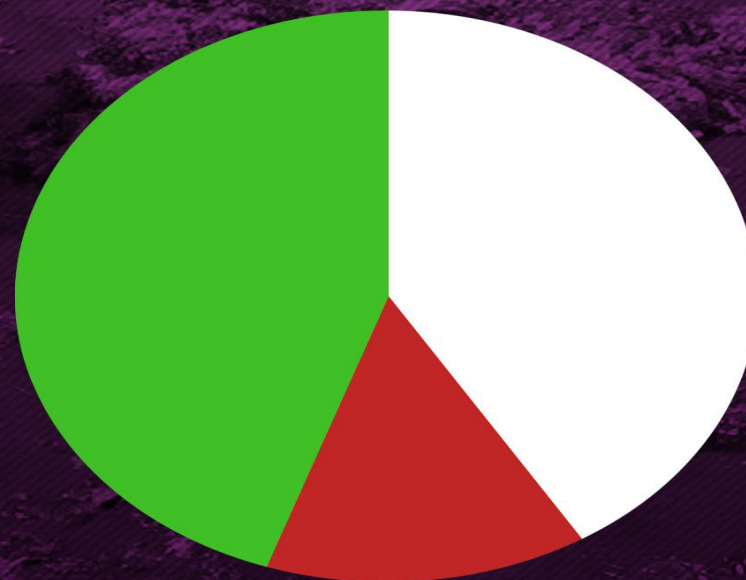

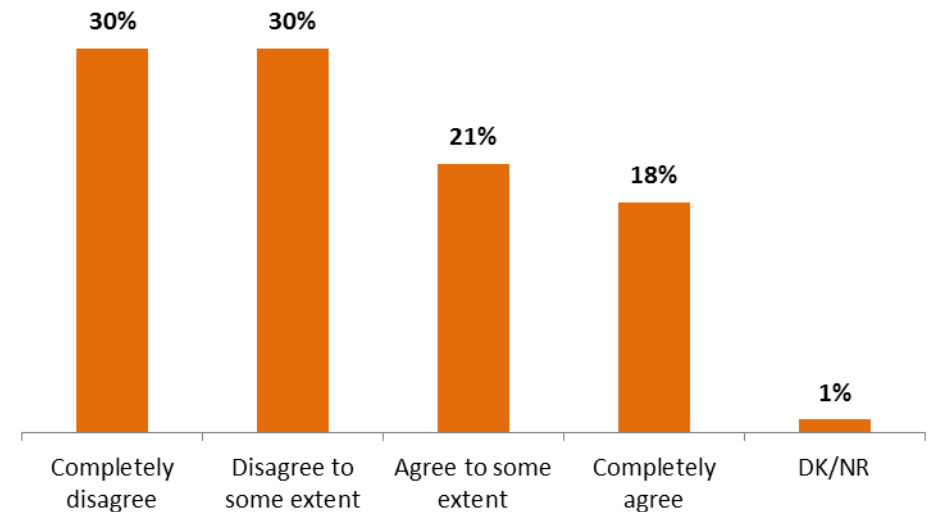

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Casting one’s vote or going to cast the vote is a very difficult task.” In response to this question, 30% respondents completely disagreed, 30% disagreed to some extent while 21% said that they agreed to some extent and 18% said that they completely agreed. 1% did not respond.

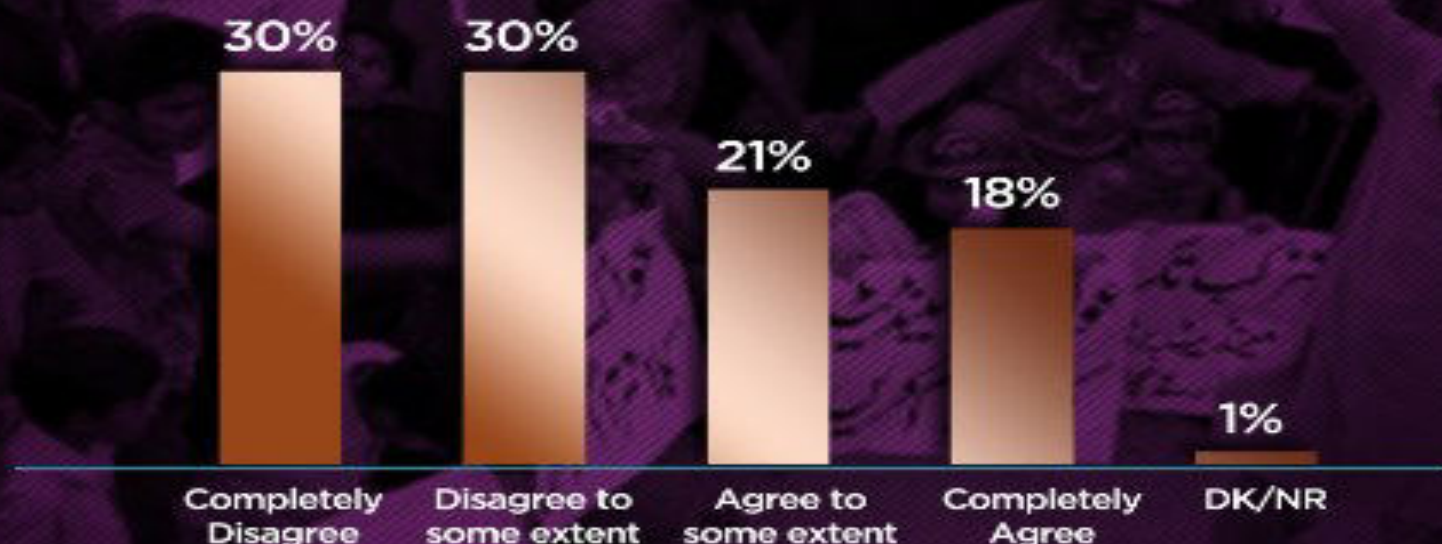

Casting one's vote or going to cast the vote is a very difficult task.



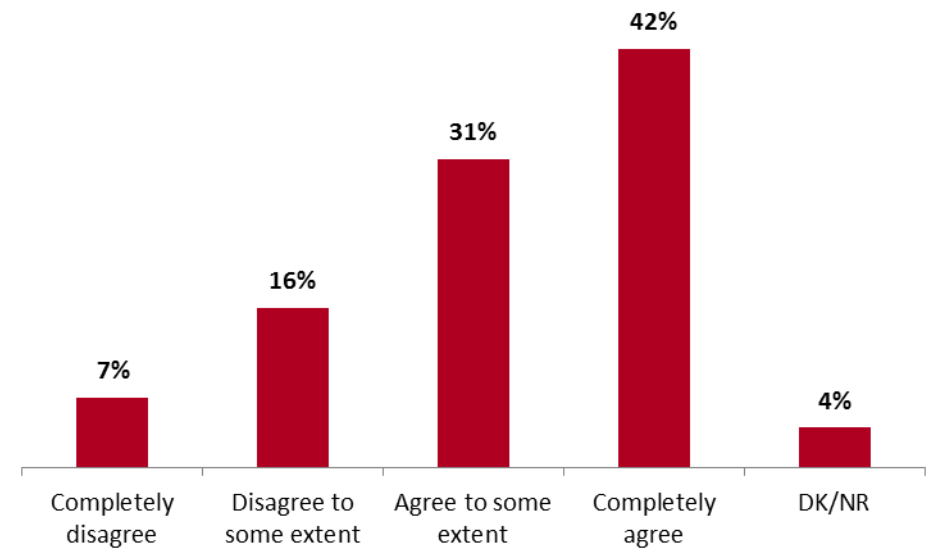

In response to this question, 7% completely disagreed, 16% disagreed to some extent while 31% said that they agree to some extent and 42% said that they completely agree. 4% did not respond.

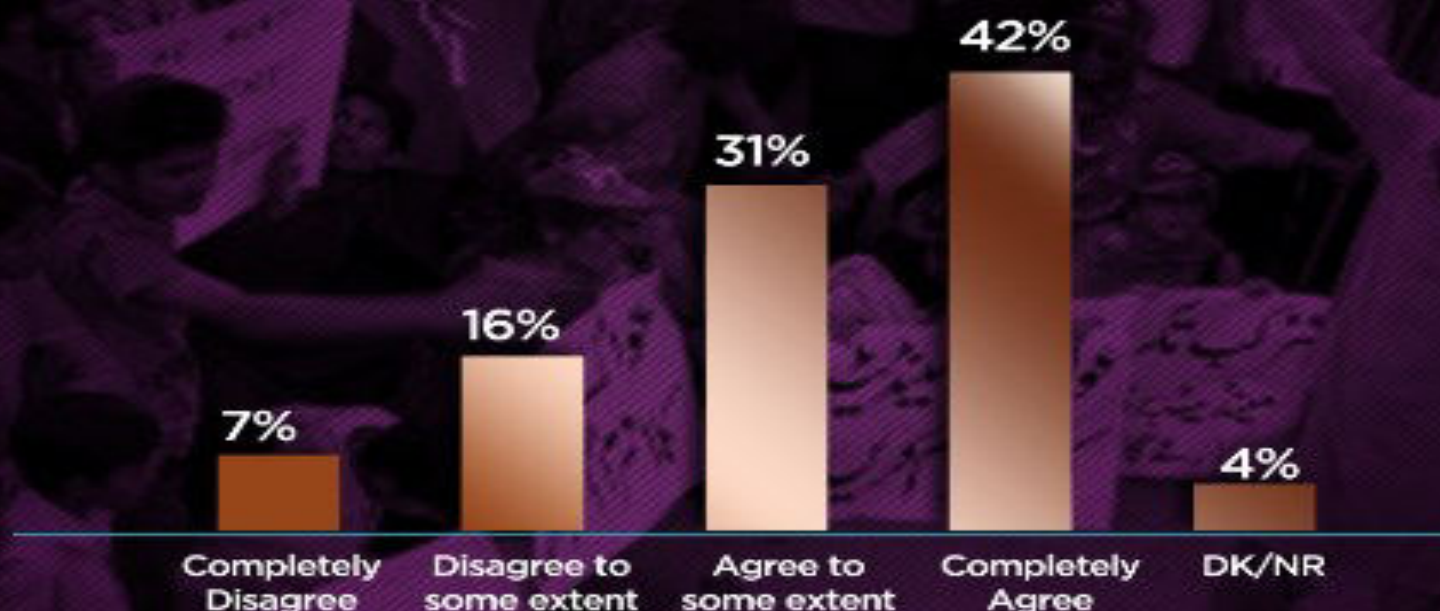

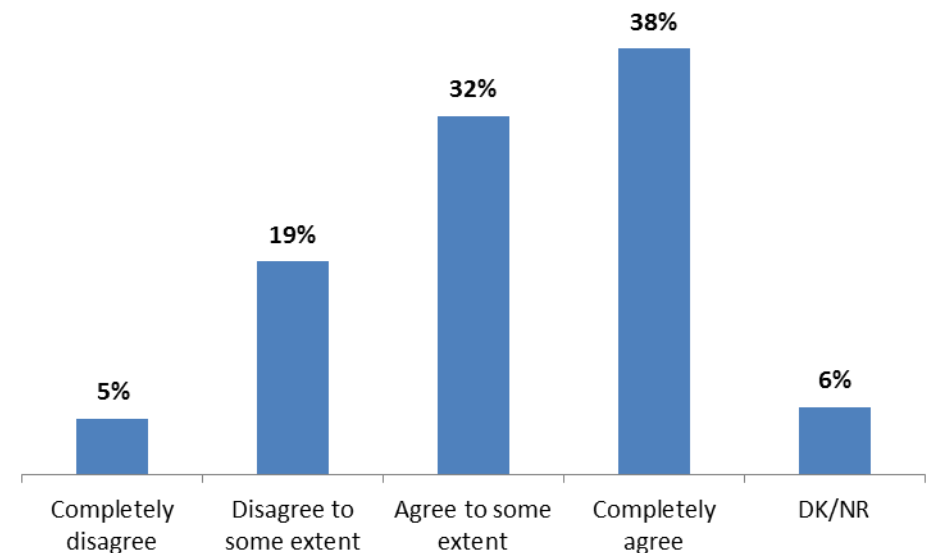

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1849 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 11 – January 18, 2016. 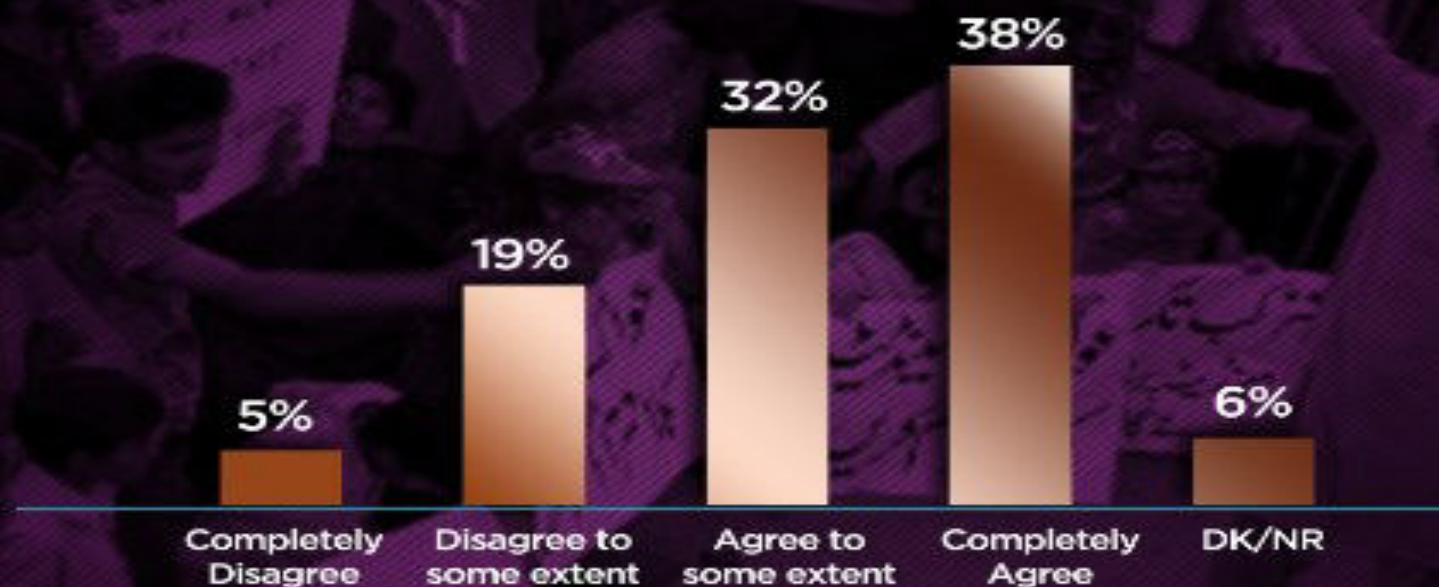
