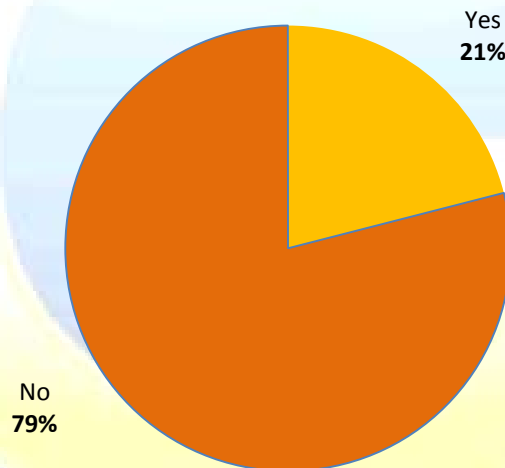

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 79% Pakistanis claim to have made no resolutions at the beginning of the new year.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In order to not repeat past mistakes, many people make new year resolutions. Did you make any resolutions at the beginning of the New Year?” In response to this question, 21% said yes while 79% said no

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1755 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 25 – February 01, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
