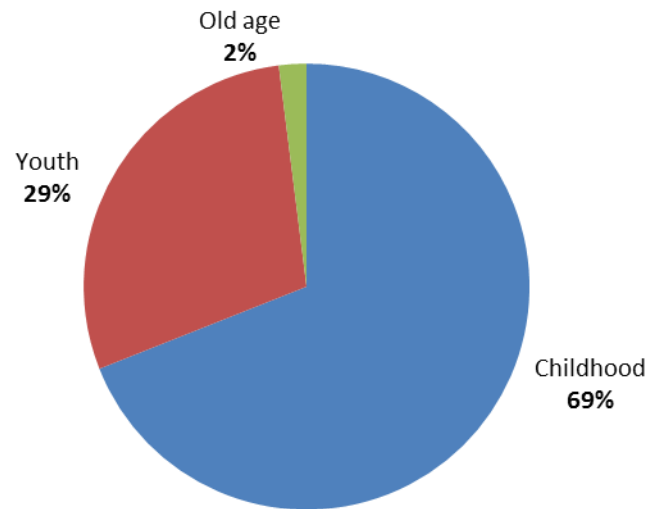

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 69% Pakistanis mention childhood as their favourite phase in life.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people enjoy their childhood phase, others like their youth and still others prefer old age. Please tell, which phase of your life did/do you like the most?” In response to this question, 69% mentioned childhood, 29% mentioned youth while 2% mentioned old age.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1849 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 11 – January 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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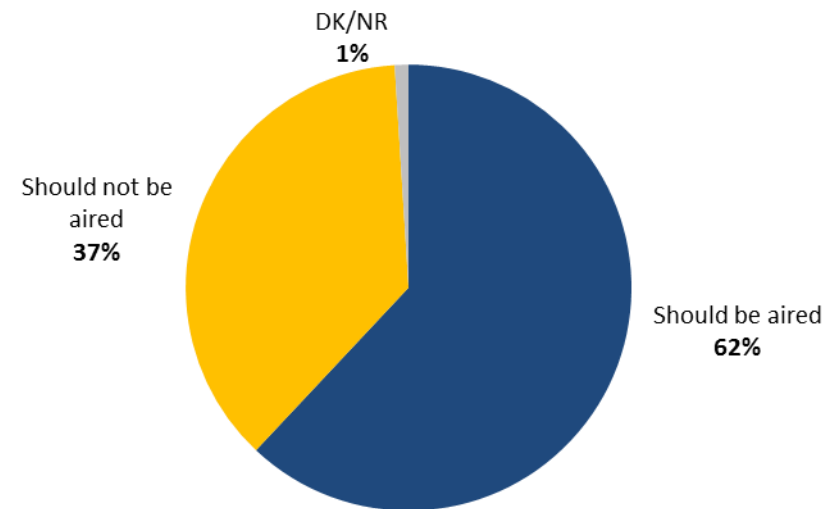

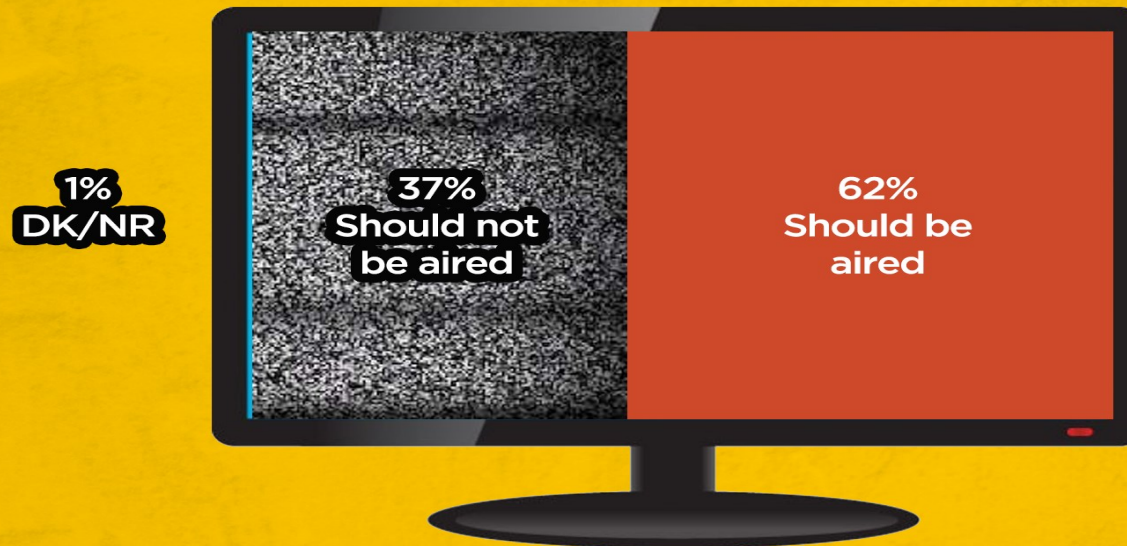
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, should the kind of news that spreads awareness among the masses yet also portrays the country in a negative light be aired on media or not?” In response to this question, 62% said that it should be aired while 37% said that it should not be aired and 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1755 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 25 – February 01, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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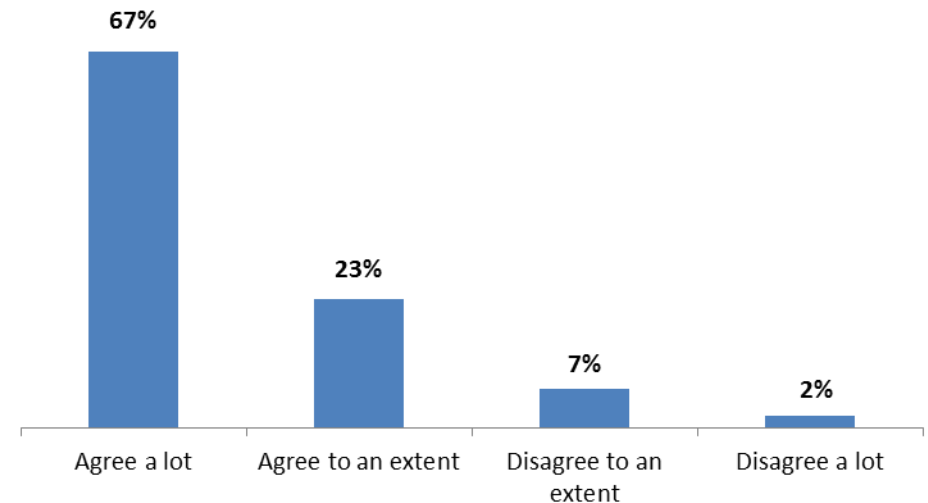

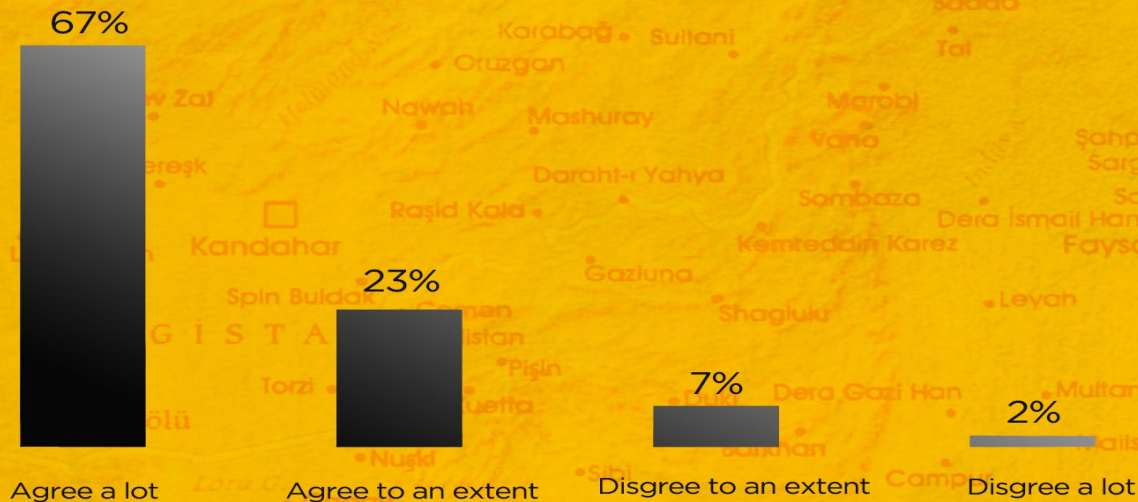

Please tell, to what extent do you agree or disagree with this?” In response to this question, 67% agree a lot, 23% agree to an extent while 7% disagree to an extent and 2% disagree a lot.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1755 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 25 – February 01, 2016. Quarter Pakistanis believe that appropriate age for girls to get married is before their 18th birthday.

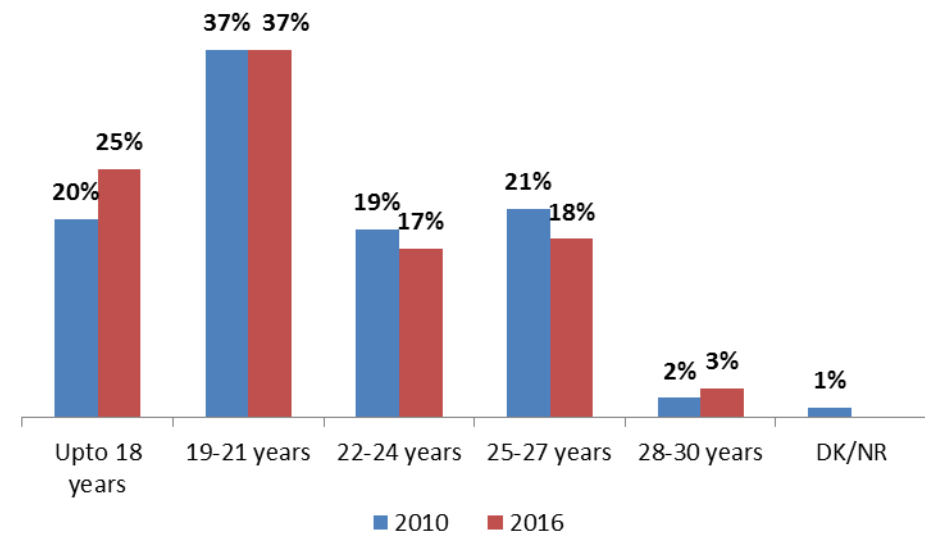


According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 25% Pakistanis believe that the right age for a girl to get married is up to 18 years; 37% believe that the appropriate age to get married is between 19-21 years.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “What, in your opinion, is the appropriate age for a girl to get married?” In response to this question, 25% said Up to 18 years, 37% said 19-21 years, 17% said 22-24 years and 18% said 25-27 years. 3% on the other hand said 28-30 years. 1% on the other hand said 28-30 years. 3% on the other hand said 28-30 years. 1% on the other hand said 28-30 years.

The same question was also asked in November 2010. In 2010, 20% respondents had said that girls should get married up to the age of 18 years and this increased to 25% who said the same in 2016. 37% said that girls should get married within 19-21 years of age in 2010 while 19% said that they should get married within 22-24 years. 21% respondents said that girls should get married between 25-27 years and 2% said that they should get married between 28-30 years while 1% did not respond. Overall, the number of respondents who believe that girls should get married at a younger age has increased during these 6 years.

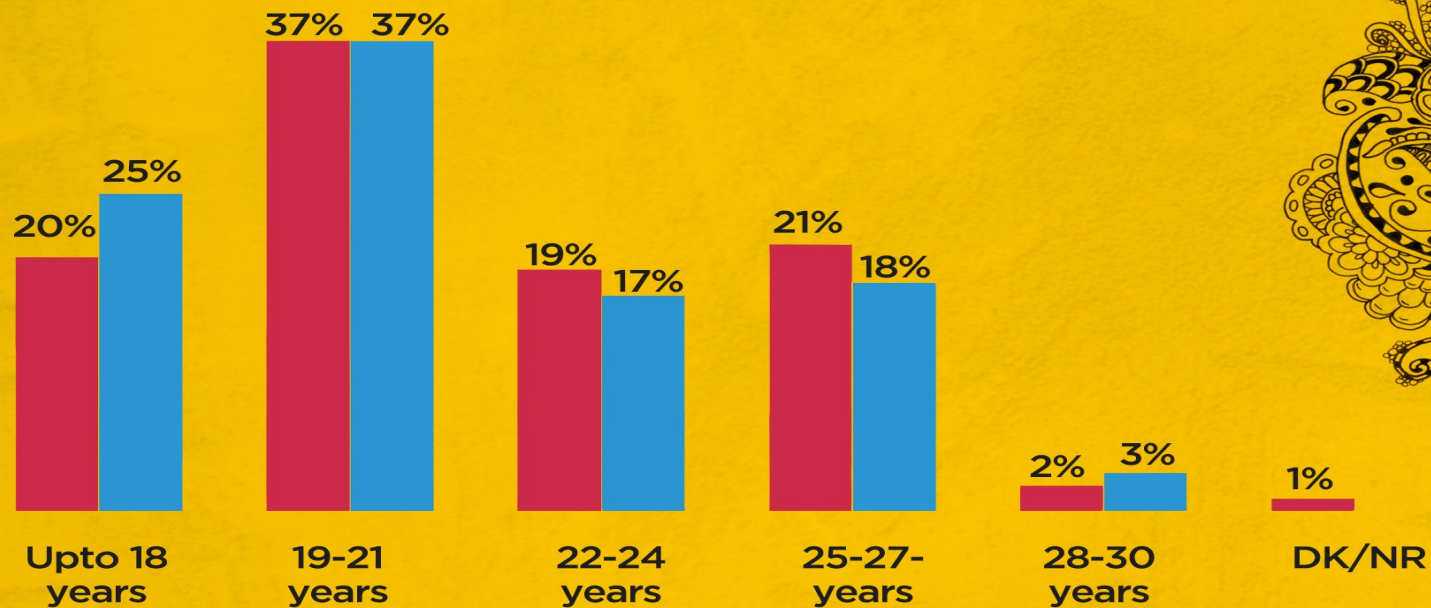

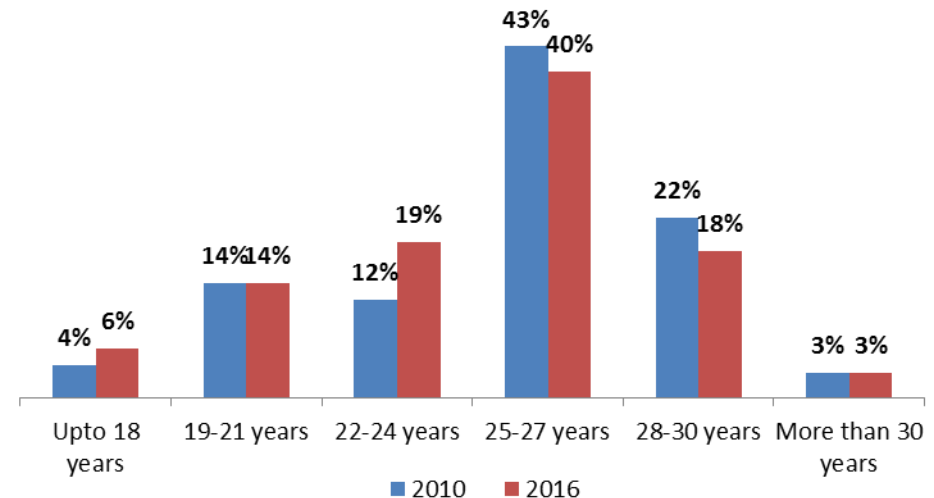
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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 39% Pakistanis believe that the appropriate age for a boy to get married is up to 24 years.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “What, in your opinion, is the appropriate age for a boy to get married?” In response to this question, 6% said up to 18 years, 14% said 19-21 years, 19% said 22-24 years and 40% said 25-27 years. 18% on the other hand said 28-30 years and 3% said more than 30 years.

The same question was also asked in November 2010. In 2010, 4% respondents had said that boys should get married up to the age of 18 years, 14% said that they should get married within 19-21 years while 12% said that they should get married within 22-24 years. 43% respondents said that boys should get married between 25-27 years and 22% said that they should get married between 28-30 years. 3% mentioned more than 30 years as the appropriate age for marriage.

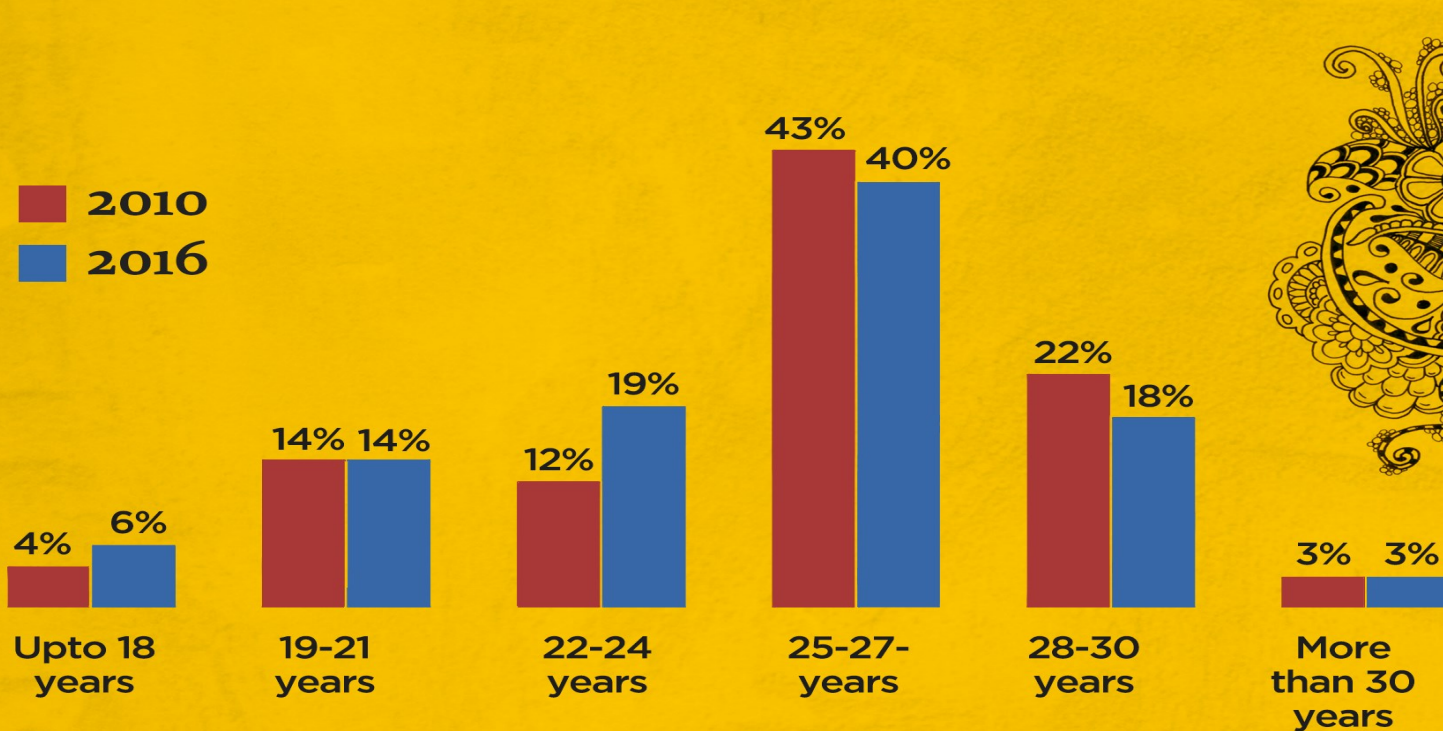
