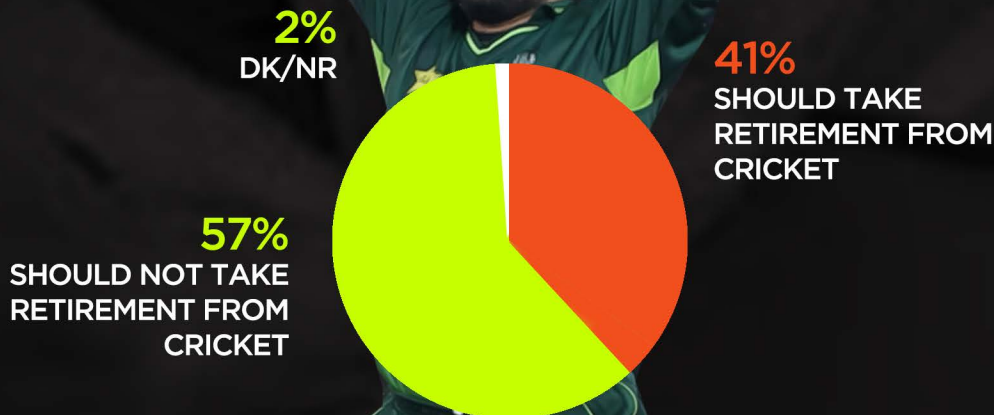


57% PAKISTANIS BELIEVE THAT SHAHID AFRIDI SHOULD NOT SEEK RETIREMENT FROM CRICKET.

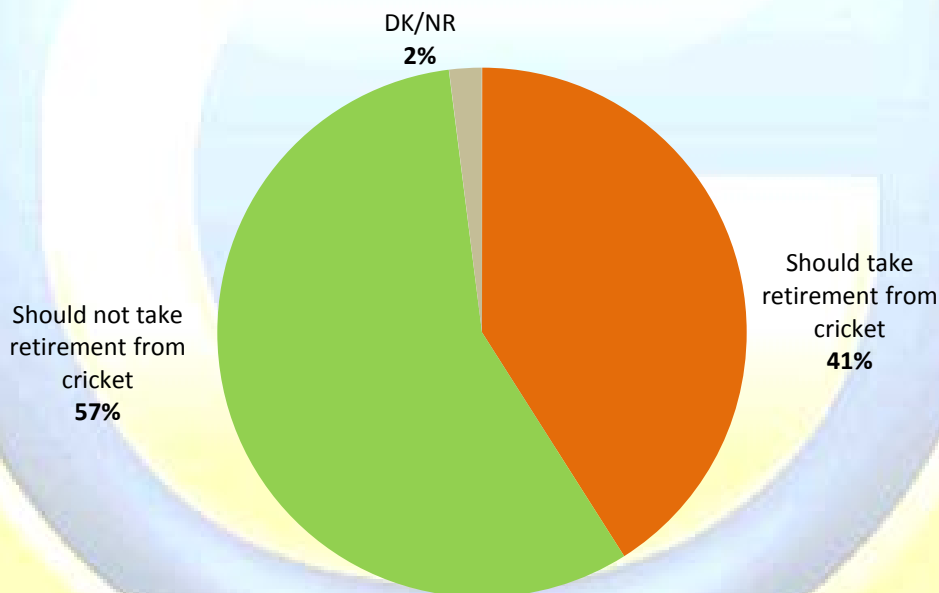
57 % Pakistanis believe that Shahid Afridi should not seek retirement from cricket. GILANI RESEARCH FOUNDATION (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, May 20, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 57% Pakistanis believe that Shahid Afridi should not seek retirement from cricket.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people are of the opinion that Shahid Afridi should take retirement from cricket while others are of the opinion that Shahid Afridi should not seek retirement and should instead continue his career in cricket. What is your opinion on this?” In response to this question, 41% said that Shahid Afridi should take retirement while 57% said that he should not seek retirement. 2% did not respond.

Question: “Some people are of the opinion that Shahid Afridi should take retirement from cricket while others are of the opinion that Shahid Afridi should not seek retirement and should instead continue his career in cricket. What is your opinion on this?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1835 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 07 – March 14, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
