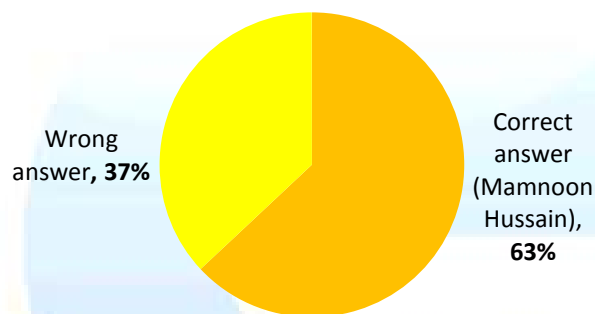
Declining Relevance: 1/3rd Pakistanis unable to correctly name current President of Pakistan, majority fail to name Chief Justice. GILANI RESEARCH FOUNDATION (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 63% Pakistanis, when asked the name of the President of Pakistan, answered correctly. On the other hand, when asked to name the Chief Justice of Pakistan, majority Pakistanis (52%) answered incorrectly.

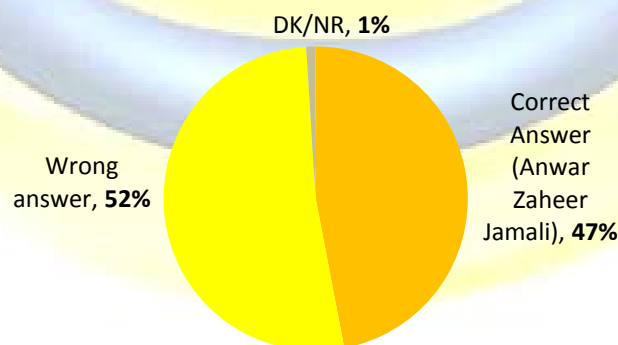
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following questions: “What is the name of the President and the Chief Justice of Pakistan?” In response to this question, 63% Pakistanis correctly named the President of Pakistan (Mamnoon Hussain) while 37% gave an incorrect answer.

Question: “What is the name of the President of Pakistan?”



Respondents were further asked, “What is the name of the Chief Justice of Pakistan?” In response, 47% correctly named the Chief Justice of Pakistan (Anwar Zaheer Jamali) whereas 52% gave an incorrect answer. 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1783 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 15 – February 22, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
