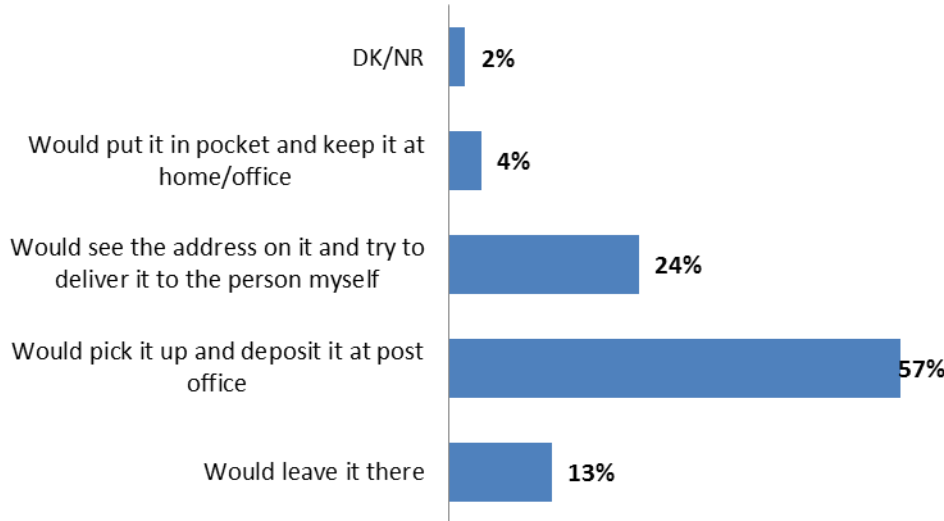
If they found a person's identity card on the ground while walking, then majority Pakistanis (57%) would pick it up and deposit it at the post office.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 57% Pakistanis, if they chanced upon a person's Identity card lying on the ground while they were walking, would pick it up and deposit it at the post office.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "If, while walking, you find an ID card fallen on the ground then which of the following would you do?" In response to this question, 13% said they would just leave it there, 57% said they would pick it up and deposit it at the office, 24% said they would try to deliver it to the person themselves using the address given on it while 4% said that they would put it in their pocket and keep it at home or the office. 2% did not respond.

Bilal Ijaz Gilani, Executive Director at Gallup Pakistan adds "This poll can be taken as a proxy for gauging 'civic culture' in Pakistan. At least with respect to this poll, the culture of helping a fellow citizen exists."

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1783 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 15 – February 22, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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Most Pakistanis would purchase a cell phone made either by Nokia or Samsung if they were given 10,000 rupees and told to buy a phone of their choice.

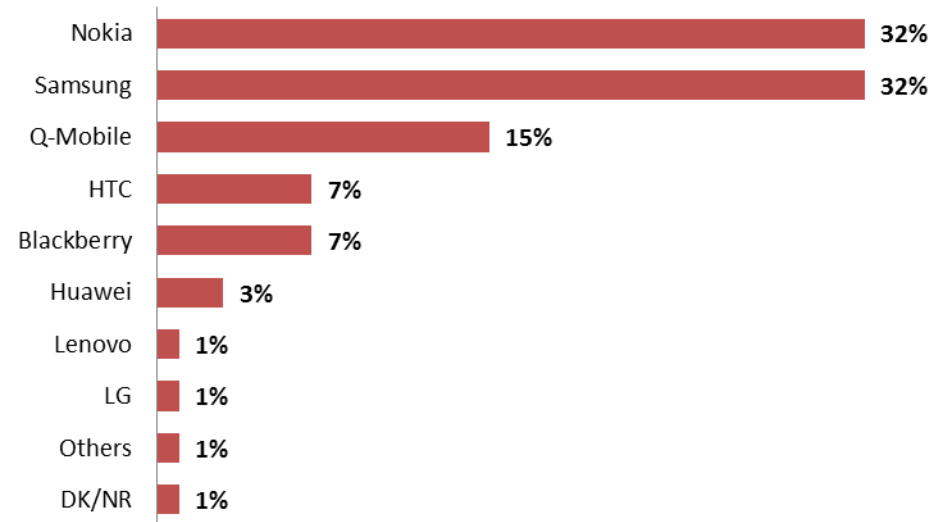
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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 32% Pakistanis would choose a cell phone made by Nokia if a person gave them Rs. 10,000 and told them to buy their favorite mobile phone while the same proportion of Pakistanis would choose a cell phone made by Samsung.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “If somebody gives you 10,000 rupees today and tells you to buy your favorite mobile phone then which brand would you choose?” In response to this question, 32% said Nokia, 32% said Samsung, 15% said Q-Mobile, 7% said HTC, 7% said Blackberry, 3% said Huawei, 1% said LG, and 1% said Lenovo while 1% Pakistanis said some other brand. A further 1% did not respond.

Note: This is a perception based response and reality, in terms of sales or volume, may not match the results of this poll.

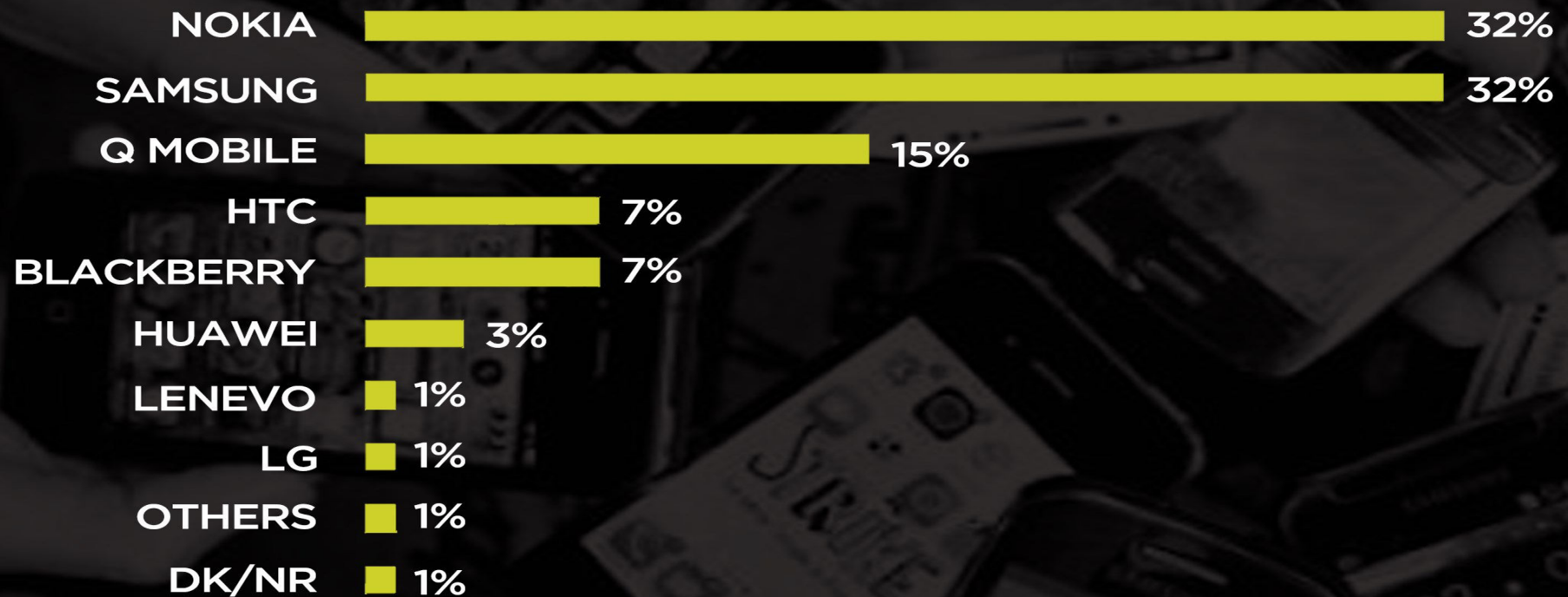

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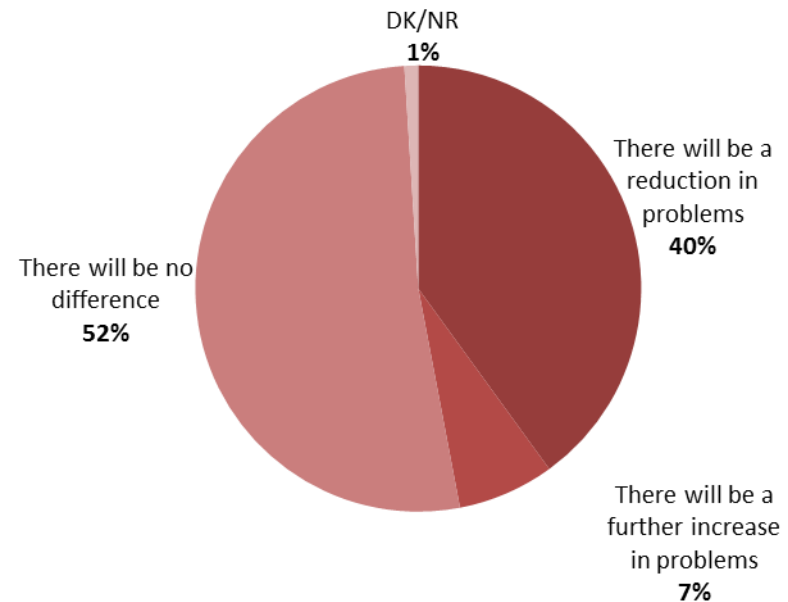

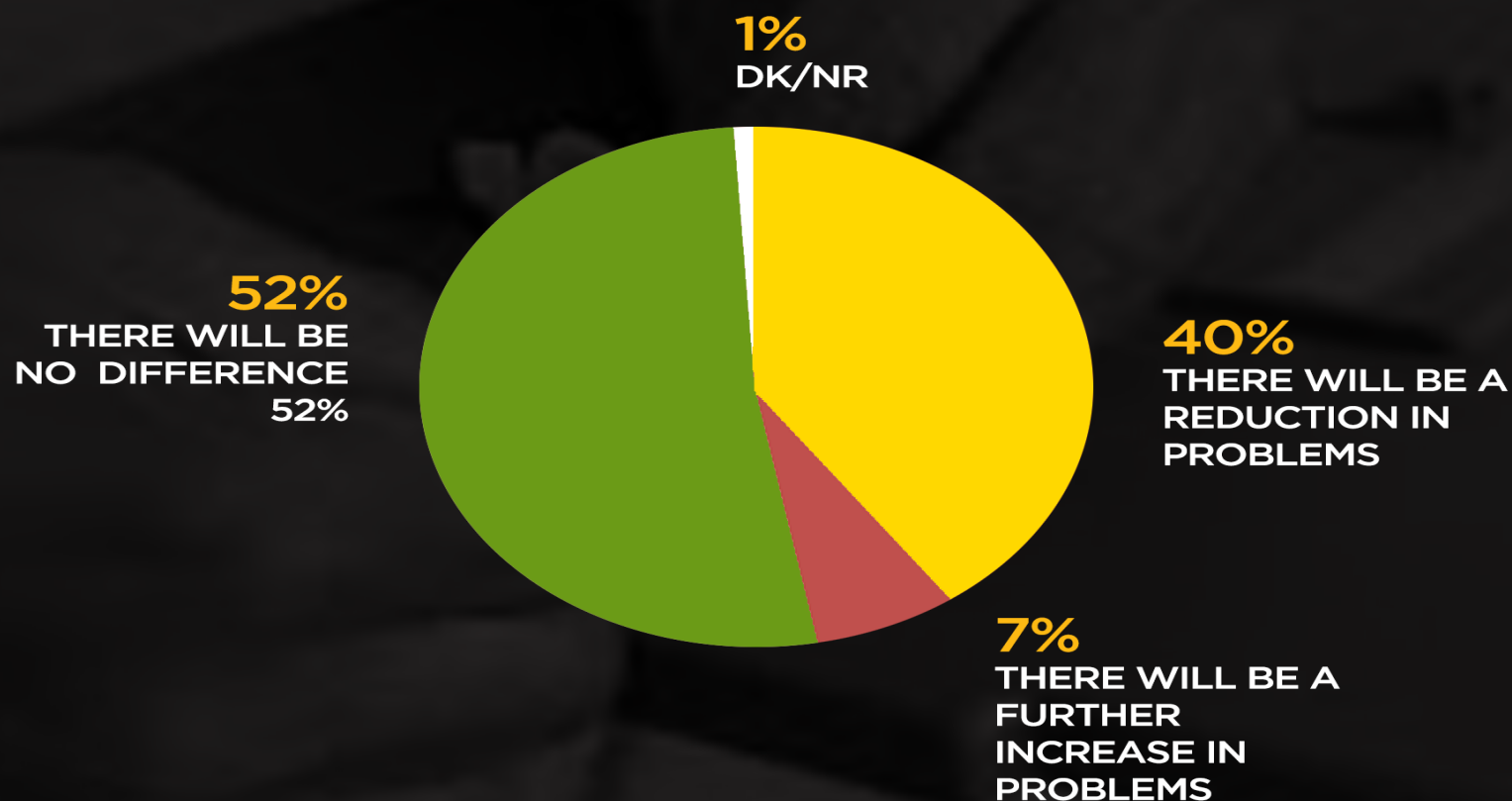
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you think that the local government system will reduce the problems in people's lives, increase the problems in their lives or would there be no difference?” In response to this question, 40% Pakistanis said that there will be a reduction in the problems of people while 7% said that there will be a further increase in people's problems. Meanwhile, 52% Pakistanis said that local governments will not bring about any difference in people's lives.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1783 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 15 – February 22, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.\

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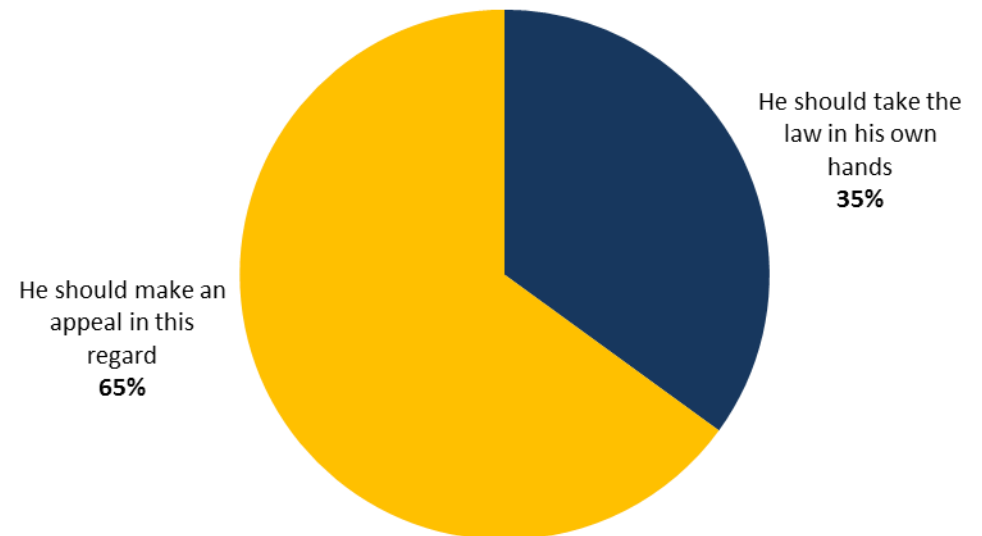

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Suppose some person feels that another person has committed blasphemy; in your opinion what should that person do? Should he take the law in his own hands or should he appeal to the police, Ulema or courts in this regard?” In response to this question, 35% said that he should take the law in his own hands while 65% said that he should make an appeal in this regard.

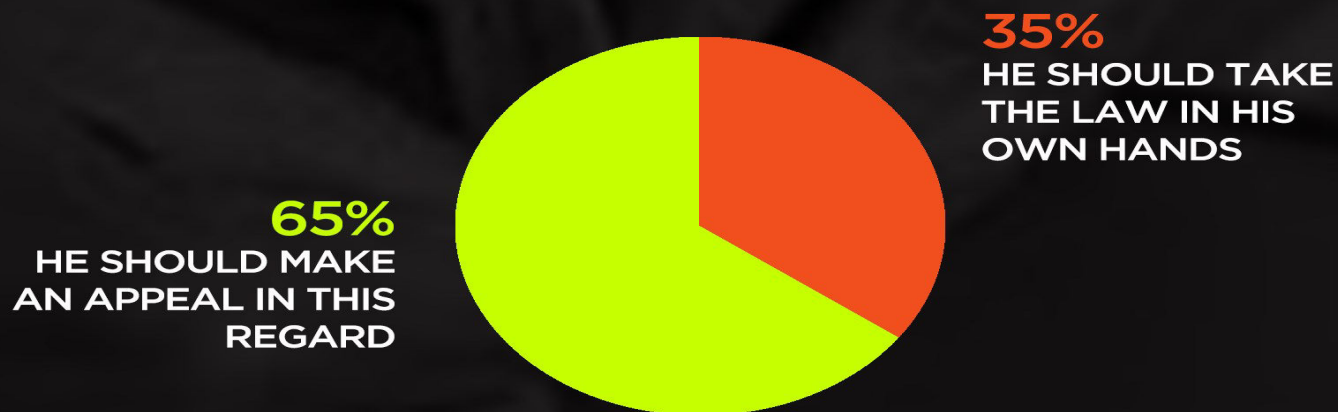

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1835 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 07 – March 14, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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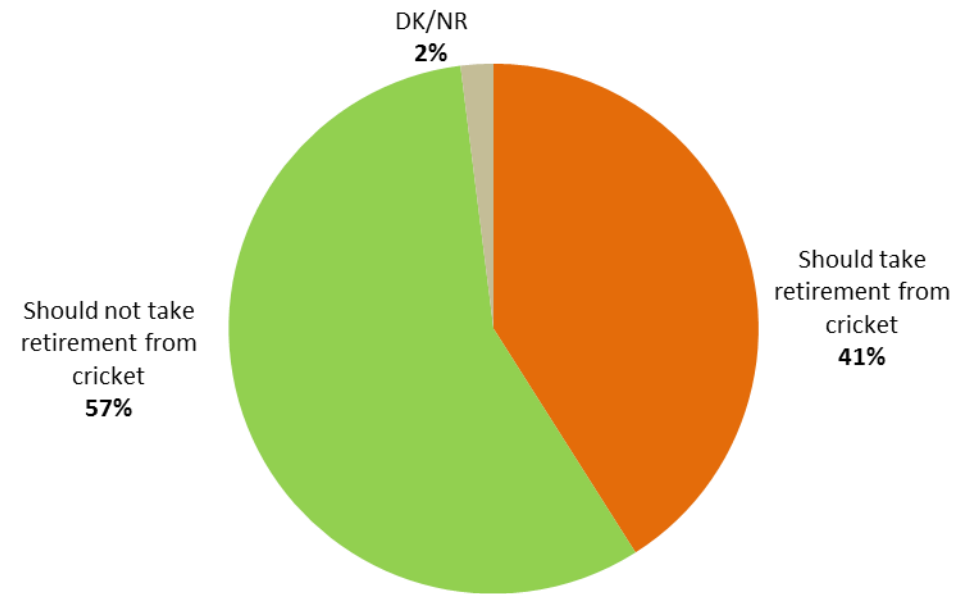
57% Pakistanis believe that Shahid Afridi should not seek retirement from cricket.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 57% Pakistanis believe that Shahid Afridi should not seek retirement from cricket.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people are of the opinion that Shahid Afridi should take retirement from cricket while others are of the opinion that Shahid Afridi should not seek retirement and should instead continue his career in cricket. What is your opinion on this?” In response to this question, 41% said that Shahid Afridi should take retirement while 57% said that he should seek retirement. 2% did not respond.

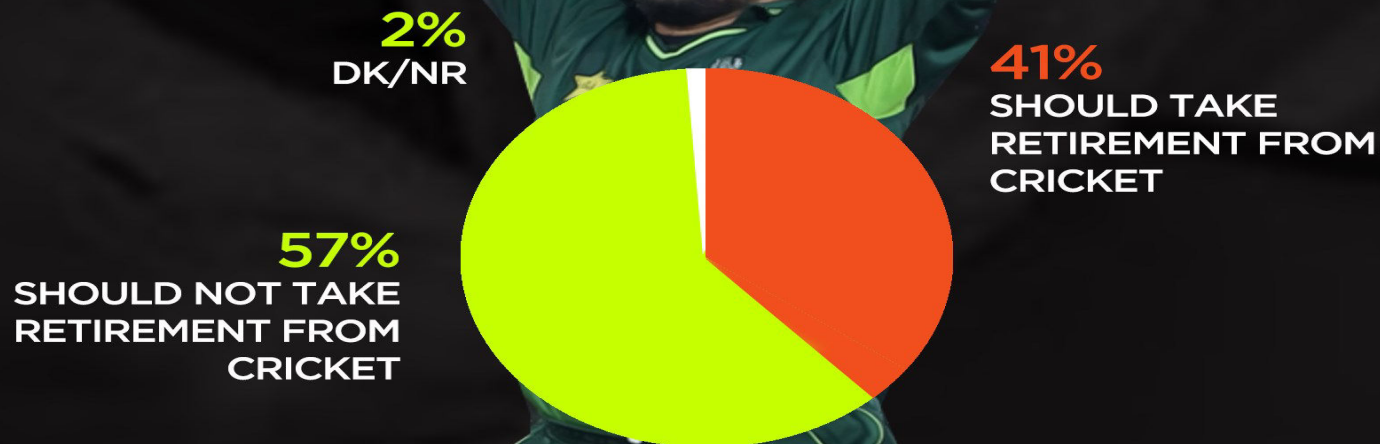
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57% PAKISTANIS BELIEVE THAT SHAHID AFRIDI SHOULD NOT SEEK RETIREMENT FROM CRICKET.
