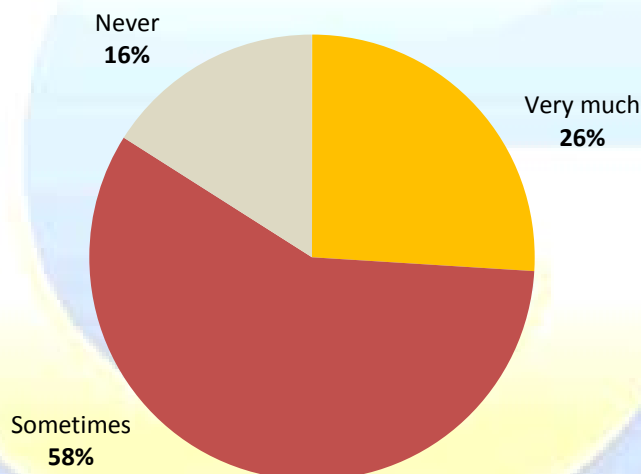

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 58% Pakistanis say that they 'Sometimes' receive phone calls from wrong numbers at their house.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who have a mobile phone/landline phone in their house were asked, "People often complain about receiving phone calls from wrong numbers in their house. Please tell, how frequently do you receive such phone calls in your house?" In response to this question 26% said Very much, 58% said Sometimes and 16% said Never.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1493 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 07, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
