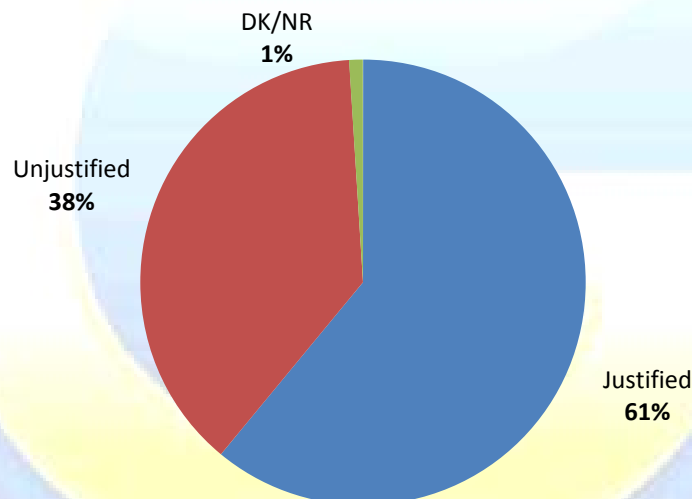

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 61% Pakistanis believe that it is justified to hold protests against the government in front of parliament in the capital.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “To voice demands in front of the government, do you think it is justified or unjustified to hold protests in front of the parliament of the capital?” In response to this question 61% said that it is Justified, 38% said that it is Unjustified and 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1884 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 07, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
