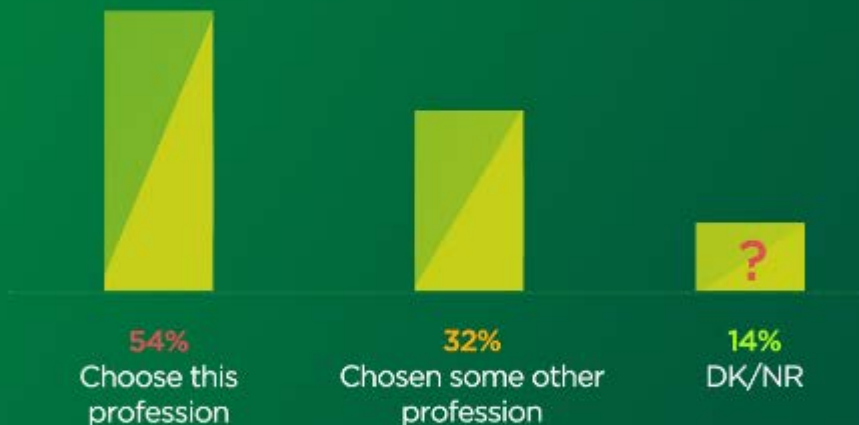

Opinion Poll Social Views on Profession

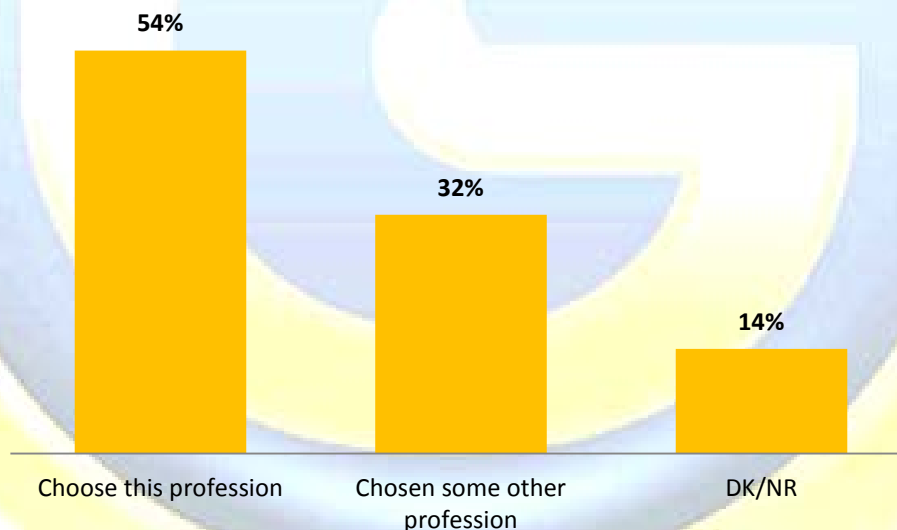

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 54% Pakistanis, when asked which profession they would choose if they had the option to choose any profession that they wanted, stated that they would still choose their existing profession.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Suppose that you had the authority to choose any profession that that you wanted; would you still choose this profession or would you have chosen some other profession?” In response to this question, 54% said they would still choose their existing profession, 32% said they would have chosen another profession while 14% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 11 – April 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
