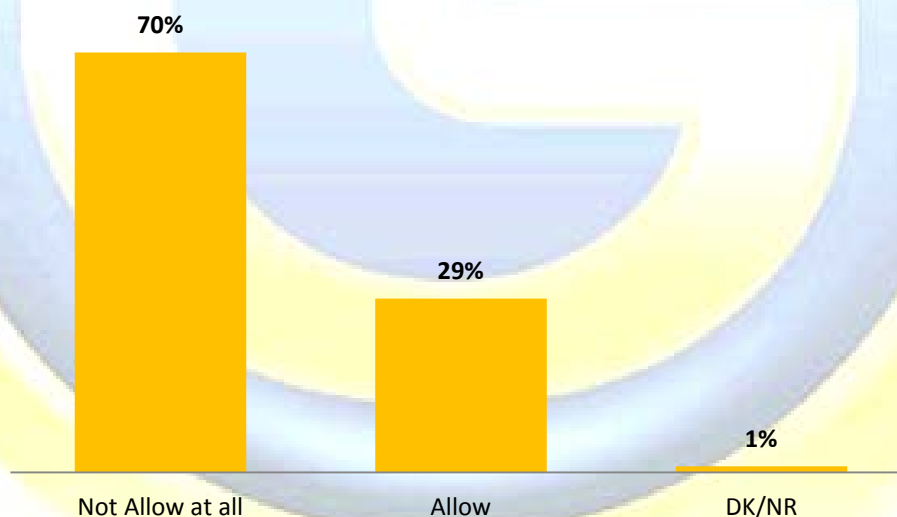
Significant majority of Pakistanis (70 %) would not allow their child to become a musician. GILANI RESEARCH FOUNDATION (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 70% Pakistanis, when asked whether they would permit their child to become a musician, out rightly said that they would not allow it at all.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Suppose that your child chooses arts subjects and wants to go in one of the following professions (Musician); would you allow your child to enter these professions in the future?” In response to this question, 29% said they would allow the child, 70% said they would not allow it at all while 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 11 – April 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
