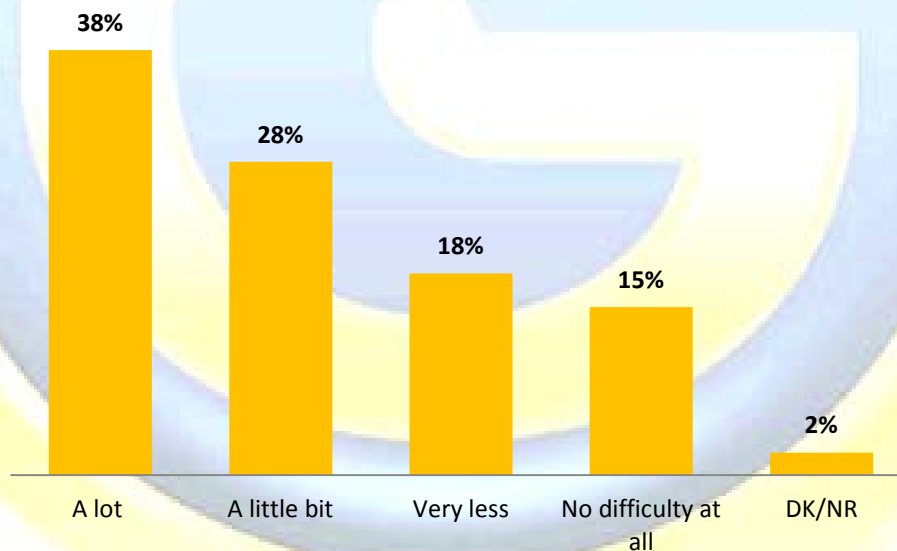
Nearly 2/3rd Pakistanis (66%) report that the traffic situation in their area is bad. GILANI RESEARCH FOUNDATION (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, June 20, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 66% Pakistanis said that the traffic situation in their area is bad and that they have to face a daily ordeal in getting to their offices, homes or other desired locations.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Kindly tell us how bad is the traffic situation in your area, meaning that what extent of difficulty you have to face to get to your office, home or your desired location?” In response to this question, 38% said that they face a lot of difficulty, 28% said that they face a little bit of difficulty, 18% said they face very little difficulty, 15% said that they do not face any difficulty at all while 2% did not respond.

Question: “Kindly tell us how bad is the traffic situation in your area, meaning that what extent of difficulty you have to face to get to your office, home or your desired location?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 11 – April 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
