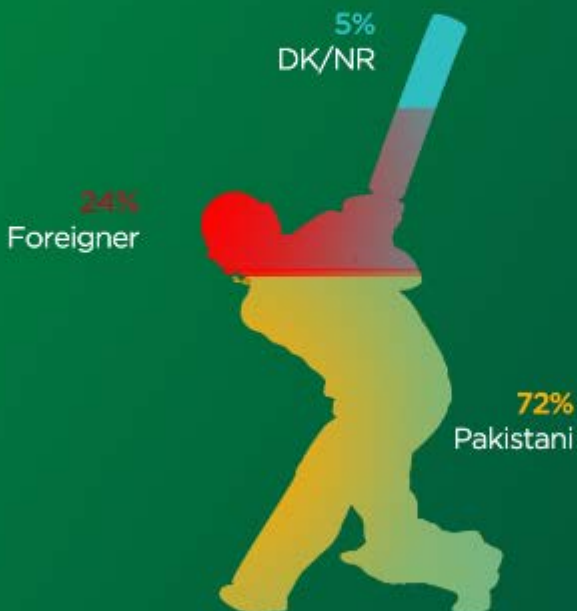

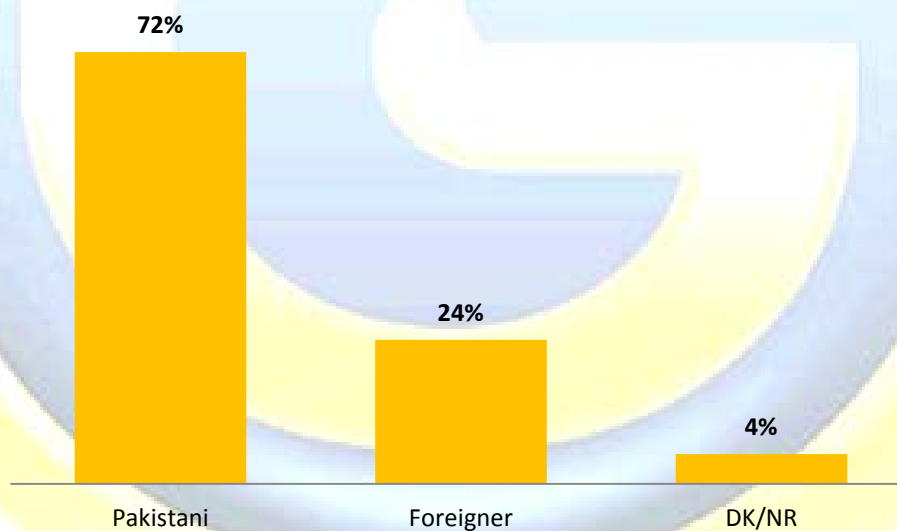

Islamabad, June 21, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 72% Pakistanis said that they want the national cricket team's coach to be a Pakistani and not a foreigner.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Do you think the Pakistan National Cricket Team's coach should be a foreigner or a Pakistani?" In response to this question, 72% said that the coach should be Pakistani, 24% said that he should be a foreigner while 4% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 11 – April 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
